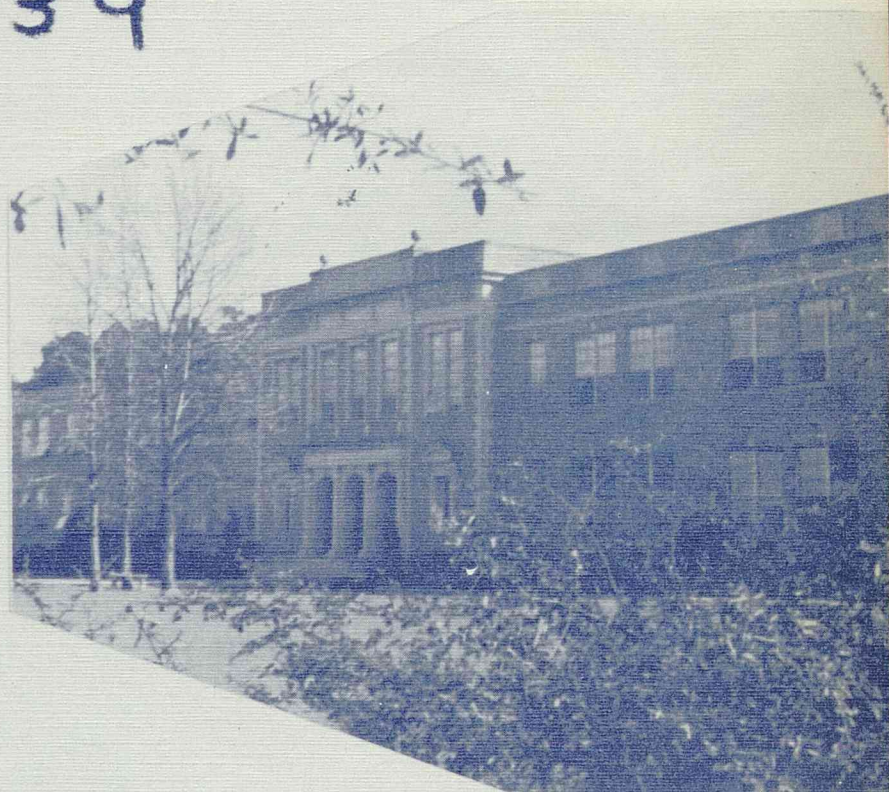
Foreword
