As of possible interest and for such use as you may desire, I take pleasure in quoting below an excerpt from my speech to the Second Meeting of the Foreign Ministers or their Representatives of the American Republics at Habana on July 26, 1940:

"By helping each other, by carrying out with vigor, determination and loyalty whatever decisions are reached, the American nations can build a system of economic defense that will enable each of them to safeguard itself from the dangers of economic subordination from abroad and of economic distress at home."

The fiesta has been a national institution since 1515, when Juan de Solis, the first white man to set foot on the soil of what is now Argentina, navigated the Rio de la Plata.


These fiestas, which often last three or four days, do not retard the commercial interests of the country. Wheat and meat are its main exports and a large portion of this goes to war-ridden Europe.








Chile, one of the South American nations, has often been called the shoestring republic from its peculiar shape. It is thirty times as long as it is wide.

The powerful Davis Panthers rolled the Buffs further into the sod by a convincing 31-0. Captain Mike Jones returned to the Buff line-up.


The Buffs showed some signs of life against San Jacinto by scoring on a pass from Bob Waterman to Bershal Anderson. However the Bruins won 13-6.

The Buffs closed one of the Harrisburg school's most fruitless seasons as Reagan won by 19-0 in a slow game.









HUMOR
