But above all, a man with faith in his "kids", many of them "give-ups" by sterner, less bending teachers.












#### **Honorees**



Eugenia Wade and Charles Dial were selected by the National Honor Society to receive the Best Citizens Award. They were selected by a faculty committee and were judged on scholarship, leadership, honor, service, and citizenship.

Carl Turner was recipient of both the Scholastic and Most Valuable Player Looney Awards. Carl is the second student in the history of Milby to receive both honors. The purpose of these awards is to give the players an incentive to strive for academic perfection as well as athletic perfection.

















Allied Youth's money-making projects included the A.Y. Carnival, the Sadie Hawkins dance, the sale of plastic book covers, and dances after the football games.






## Twas the Night




# If you Tike the Buffs . . . Hell!

The annual state convention and the spring banquet highlight the year for Milby's F.T.A.






This is the first year of organized club activity for Milby's Audio-Visual Club. As stated in its constitution, the club is dedicated to service in all audio-visual fields.





Masque and Gavel is a national high school organization which recognizes and promotes significant student achievement in all areas of speech. 
#### Club Inspires Pance Appreciation







## Mustangs Trample Buffs 14-0


Favored Milby fell before a torrid passing game and aggressive defense, 14-0, to Austin, Saturday night, September 26.



The South Houston Trojans scored two touchdowns in the second half, one on the last play of the game, to defeat Milby 14-0




A. Grimalda turns corner for big yardage in S. Houston contest.






G. Parker and center of Buff defensive line get set for action.









A. Grimaldo splashes around left end for ten yard gain.






Buff senior gridders witness coin toss for last time.

In the Beaumont Tournament Milby took third place by defeating West Orange 46-41. The Bisons






