




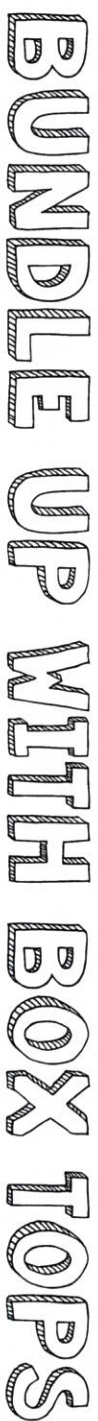

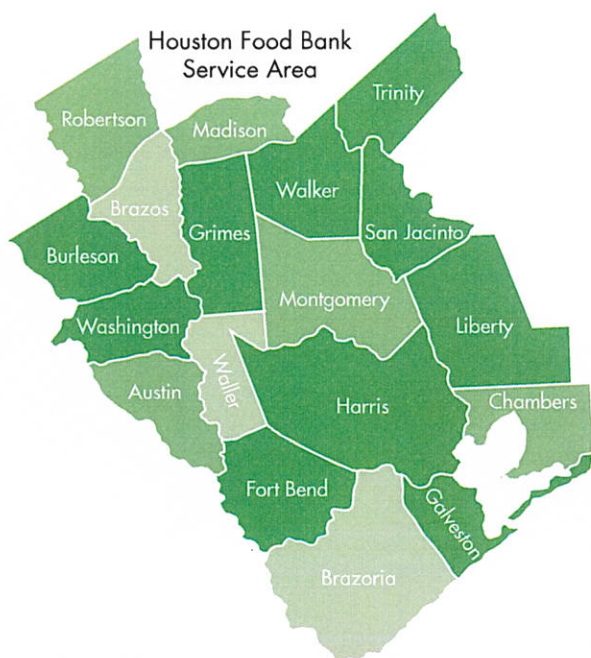


The **School Market Program** helps alleviate child hunger in our community by **providing food** to children and their families. School-based markets are **located on the grounds of a school** to provide an easily **accessible source** of food assistance.

School Markets are set up **like a small grocery store** at a consistent location **within a school's campus**, with **set distribution schedules**. School Markets also **may operate** through a **mobile market** that brings food to a high school and middle school campus on a truck with a **large refrigerated trailer**.

Who can participate?

Any Independent School District in our 18-county service area.



How does it work?

Food Bank delivers the food, and you facilitate the distribution. School Market volunteers (high school and middle school students, PTO, admin staff) will have an orientation/training at their school provided by a representative of the Houston Food Bank.
