Theme: Computers and Software

Math Lab:

In the Math Lab, students will learn about the connection between math and coding and how to program a computer using the website https://www.codebymath.com/

Science Lab:

This month in the Science Lab we will be finishing up or unit on light and circuits and we will begin learning about weather and seasons for the younger students while the big kids are learning about weather, climate, and the water cycle. We will be making some short trips outside to record weather conditions, so be sure to dress for the weather, especially on science lab days. Big kids will also be building a model of the water cycle to explore how water moves between the atmosphere and the surface of earth.

Computer Lab:

This month in the Computer Lab, students will be learning about computer and software engineering, and how coding empowers computers to perform the fantastic feats they do. Pre-K through second grade will learn about computer coding using Blockly to help establish the basics of coding. Third through fifth grade students will investigate coding by using Scratch for constructionist purposes involving problem solving. We will also be looking how coding affects our everyday lives and how coding is a 21st century skill which students should embrace for the rest of their lives. All students will be participating in Hour of Code activities, allowing them to share experiences as other students will around the world.

1st Grade

3rd Grade

Third graders will be starting informational text and number pairs and relationships. We are looking forward to a restful winter break!

4th Grade

In December, fourth grade is focused on division in math and comprehending informational text in reading. We are still writing expository compositions and working on revising and editing.

5th Grade

Progress reports, 5th grade shirt forms, and blazer order forms were sent home. Please return them ASAP. The DLA Assessment Window is Dec. 9-13.

In Reading, we will be reviewing all of the genres covered so far this year- informative text, argumentative texts, poetry, drama, and fiction. We will be focusing on test-taking strategies and annotating texts as we read.

In Math, students will be working on the TEKS 5.3A, 5.3J, 5.3L, 5.4E, and 5.4F. These standards cover estimating real-world problems, dividing and multiplying fractions, describing the meaning of parentheses and brackets in numerical expressions, and simplifying numerical expressions.

In Science, students will be studying electricity, conductors and circuits. They will continue with hands-on activities during science lab.
