TOURS & TESTING

ADMISSIONS

Applications are accepted each fall in accordance with the district Magnet application dates.

Students **not identified as Gifted and Talented** by HISD must submit:

- An official Carnegie Vanguard High School application
- The previous year's final report card
- Stanford/lowa scores from the previous year (if applicable)
- Proof of Residency or a Statement of Residence (due at the time an accepted student submits an entrance agreement)
- One teacher recommendation (form supplied in application)
- Applicants new to the district will be required to submit a copy of the student's birth certificate

Students who **are already identified as** *Gifted and Talented* by HISD must submit:

- An official Carnegie Vanguard High School application
- A G/T Student Status Report from their current school verifying the student is currently identified as G/T
- A copy of the matrix sheet
- Proof of residency or a Statement of Residence (due at the time an accepted student submits an entrance agreement)

TESTING

Testing will be required for students not currently identified by HISD as Gifted and Talented. The Iowa and CogAT exams are used for Gifted and Talented identification. Students currently identified as Gifted and Talented by HISD do not have to submit test scores.

CAMPUS TOURS

Campus Tours are conducted once a year, during Magnet Week, from 1-2 p.m. daily. Tours are not conducted at any other time unless otherwise notified.

FISH CAMP

Students who accept Carnegie's invitation to attend the school are also encouraged to attend Fish Camp. Incoming freshmen spend two nights at camp with other new students, current students, and faculty. This bonding experience, which includes outdoor trust exercises, hiking, and a dance, is a valued Carnegie tradition.












