The Beginning, also known as the Exposition, introduces the setting (time and place), characters and plot.

The <u>Beginning</u> also includes a statement of the problem. This is also known as the <u>Conflict</u>. The <u>problem</u> is usually the <u>challenge</u> the main character has to face. The <u>conflict</u> may be <u>internal</u>, if the character is struggling with making a decision, or <u>external</u> if struggling against another character, society, or nature.

The <u>Middle</u>, also known as the <u>Rising Action</u>, includes the events that lead up to the climax. These are events that usually complicate the problem or make it worse. These events build excitement and interest.

The <u>Turning Point</u>, also know as the <u>Climax</u>, is the peak of action in the story. It's where the opposing forces of the conflict meet head-on, or an important decision is made or action is taken.

The events that take place after the climax are called the Falling Action.
