#### Questions and Concerns

- Concern: Black jeans on Fridays?
  - Response: During dress down days, students are allowed to wear whatever as long as it is school appropriate (no ripped jeans), black jeans fit under this category. Fridays- students are able to wear BLUE jeans. However, the SDMC committee may consider voting to change Friday's dress code to BLUE and BLACK jeans.
- Concern: Students not in designated areas in the morning and parents picking up students in the teachers parking lot.
  - Response: Knittle will follow up with AM duty posts with Mr. Pineda. Due to coverage and being short staffed duty spots are difficult to fill in the mornings
- Concern: Drug use on campus
  - Response: Vaping has become a huge issue across campus, and it is being handled as situations are being presented to Knittle and admin. Regarding other drugs, if you are under the assumption that a student is under the influence, notify admin immediately. Admin will take student to nurse where certain tests will be conducted.
- Concern: Unsupervised students around T-buildings, between classes, during lunches and after school.

- Response: Knittle will remind teachers to be at doors during passing periods. Duty posts during
  other times are sparce due to clerks and other staff, taking students to and from auditorium or
  covering classes.
- o Concern: Students, staff and coteachers not wearing masks properly
  - Response: Knittle will reiterate to faculty and students. If you would like, please provide a list of specific individuals and he will address them specifically
- Concern: Student tardies
  - Response: This is school wide issue. Announcements will continue to be made. Excessive tardies to school should be referred to G. Gonzales. Excessive tardies to class should be referred to AP. Everyone needs to be at their doors and on duty. Keep in mind staffing shortages pull paraprofessionals from duty spots as they have to be in auditorium or classrooms to cover
- O Concern: Notification of gun/knife on campus
  - Response: Communication of these incidents is not allowed to be release until Knittle has gone through a long list of HISD employees. (I.e. his boss, his bosses' boss, media relations, and legal department in HISD). Once approved he then can communicate to parents, students, and staff of the situation. If there is an immediate situation, for example and active shooter on campus. Knittle will immediately notify the school to go into lock down.
