A Course Overview and Syllabus with Performance Guidelines and Rules

English II Magnet is designed to prepare students to show achievement in English, which should be reflected in daily tasks, STAAR and other higher-level assessments. The course is based upon the merit of critical reading, independent analysis, and the student should develop more matured writing through interpreting, explaining, reflecting and elaborating about elements of a literary work. In English II Magnet, the student will integrate the language arts skills of speaking, listening, writing, and reading to synthesize themes found in a literary work. Through an integrated approach to the study of composition, literature, and the English language usage, the student will gain a better understanding of themselves and their relationship with others.

Close Reading

- *Identify and analyze archetypes (setting, character, hero, etc.) in several works and connect them.
- *Annotate texts to facilitate close reading and writing.
- *Explain how literary elements (diction, imagery, detail, syntax, figurative language, point of view) create tone and affect meaning in a literary work.
- *Interpret different types of irony in the reading.
- *Identify and explain tone shifts.
- *Identify, explain, and connect symbols and allusions.

Grammar

- *General 9th Grade grammar review.
- *Analyze syntax in all its forms—types of sentences, complexity of sentences, advanced syntactical strategies, phrases, and clauses.
- *Through a careful study of the complexity of sentences, understand the art of a sentence styling and apply the learned sentence styling principles in the student's own writing.
- *Recognize and analyze the effects of passive and active voice.

Composition

*In class, write timed and untimed essays explaining how literary elements create tone and meaning.

- *Compose personal expository essays using evidence and facts.
- **Produce a project on one of the novels with a substantial writing component.
- **Revise essays for content, style, and structure improvement.
- **Edit final products for surface errors before submission.
- **Competition essays for college scholarships
