Course objectives

Listed below you will find the five objectives of the class which are based on the National Standards for Foreign Language Learning. Mainly the students are introduced, oriented and provided with tools that will make the learning of the target language an interesting experience.

- 1. To communicate effectively in more than one language to function in a variety of situations and for multiple purposes.
- 2. To interact with cultural competence and understanding.
- 3. To connect with other disciplines and acquire information in diverse perspectives to use the language to function in academic and career-related situations.
- 4. To develop insight into the nature of language and culture to interact with cultural competence.
- 5. To communicate and interact with cultural competence to participate in multilingual communities at home and around the world.

Class Description

This course ends the 3-year requirement at DeBakey HSHP. As the year progresses the students will strengthen the knowledge of Spanish as a foreign language acquired in levels 1 and 2 or 2 HADV and increase it; therefore, they will be prepared to take Level 4 which is expected. The students will have developed the target language skills of listening, speaking, reading, and writing and sub skills of phonetics, pronunciation and intonation and will be able to communicate and interact in a Spanish language setting. Evidently, students are always expected to speak in the target language. At this point of their Spanish language learning journey, students are confident enough to understand that mistakes are part of the process and it is in their best interest to understand that making mistakes is the key to grow and improve.

Classroom Expectations

- RESPECT: Yourself, others, our meetings, and the meeting times in all aspects. Be on time and ready to learn and contribute

Classroom Policies

- Although the first cycle will be about reviewing topics from Spanish II needed for topics in Spanish III, remember that you have already learned them and are responsible for it.
- Classwork not turned in on the due date will be graded over 70 points if turned in the next day (not the next A or B day) and up to day 3 after the due date. Each late day will deduct 10 points. That is: Next day over 70, day 2 over 60, day 3 over 50, day 4 or later 0. Remember, turning in a late homework does not guarantee a 70, 60 or 50. It means that your late submission will be graded over 70, 60 or 50 and that you grade can be lower.
- Cheating on any assignment will earn a grade of 0 and a conduct cut. No exceptions.
- Use your HISD email for everything school related.
- Thank you for asking for help if you are having difficulty. This shows maturity and willingness to work hard. Individualized instruction may be very beneficial for you.
- It is ideal that in this stage of your education, you advocate for yourself. If you have questions, doubts, and concerns, I am more than happy to discuss them and help you.

Speaking Spanish

Participation and speaking are vital to learning a language. The class is taught in Spanish and the language is spoken at a normal pace. Students are expected to understand what is said in class and get involved using the target language. Plan on speaking the target language when interacting in class. Make mistakes if necessary, don't be afraid. I am here to help.

AP test-like oral recorded exercises will be part of the cycle test and as practice and preparation for the AP class next year.

Listenina

AP-like listening exercises will be practiced often and one included in each cycle test. and as practice and preparation for the AP class next year.

Writing

You'll complete at least a writing assignment in Spanish every cycle on a topic of my choice. Guidelines are discussed ahead of time. The number of words and topic difficulty increase each time.

Reading

You will read different pieces individually throughout the year but as a group we will read a book together and reading comprehension quizzes will be given after each capítulo. Also, reading comprehension will be included in each cycle test.

Grading Plan

The students are guizzed after each grammar and vocabulary topic is covered and a test is given after each *lección* (1 and 2) is finished. Classwork, guizzes, projects, and tests are announced in advanced so that students have enough time to prepare them. Such assignments will be posted and in the HUB calendar at least one class before and a Remind will be sent prior to when the assignment is due. There usually are oral projects that are carefully graded. Extra-credit will be at the teacher's discretion.

Please, make sure you take advantage of all the opportunities given throughout the cycle as well as meeting due dates and refrain from e-mailing me about doing something to bring up your grade especially at the end of the cycle.

Evaluation will be conducted by using different methods and techniques that will reveal students' strengths and weaknesses. Some of them will include quizzes and tests, written essays, oral presentations, projects, final exams, etc. The percentages are as follows:

Make-up Policy

Per DeBakey policy, students are allowed three school days (not A or B days) to make up any missed work during their excused or un-excused absence. The responsibility for arranging make-up tests and work rests with the students and must be scheduled and completed within three days of the students' return to school; after that period, the students lose the opportunity to make-up any missed assignments.

Re-take Policy

Tests (which grade is 69 or lower) are the only assignment that can be re-taken. The original grade and the new grade's average cannot be higher than 70. In this class, students have up to five school days to re-take a test if there is ample time to do so within the cycle. Otherwise, it will be 3 days. It is the student responsibility to schedule the re-take the day they are informed of their score.

Cheating Policy

Academic honesty is an integral component of a student's education. All graded academic exercises, including but not limited to classwork, quizzes, tests, written assignments, and projects, are expected to be conducted individually and completed as the student's original work unless otherwise instructed. Copying from another student constitutes cheating and it will have consequences according to the DeBakey HSHP Student Code of Conduct.

The consequences of not adhering to this policy are a zero as the final grade for the assignment, a "P" in conduct for that marking period, and administrative referral.
