COURSE OVERVIEW *

The AP Spanish Language and Culture course is a rigorous course taught **exclusively in Spanish** that requires students to improve their proficiency across the three modes of communication (interpersonal, interpretive, and presentational). The course focuses on the integration of authentic resources including online print, audio, and audiovisual resources, as well as traditional print resources that include literature, essays, and magazine and newspaper articles with the goal of providing a rich, diverse learning experience.

The AP Spanish course provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to earn college credit and/or advanced placement as most importantly to achieve advanced fluency in Spanish, which will result in great advantages not only academically, but professionally in the increasingly competitive job market.

By taking an AP course, students also demonstrate to college admission officers their abilities to perform successfully on rigorous college courses.

The AP Spanish course concludes with a college-level assessment (on May 11, 2021, 8 AM Local). Most four-year colleges and universities in the United States and universities in 60 countries recognize AP in the admission process and grant students credit placement or both based on successful AP Exam scores (visit www.collegeboard.org/apcreditpolicy to view AP credit and placement policies at more than 1,000 colleges and universities).

Scoring a 3 or higher on an AP Spanish Exam means more than just the successful completion of a course; it is a gateway to success in college.

IMPORTANT: The AP Spanish course <u>is not intended to focus on teaching grammar concepts</u>. Students enrolled in the AP Spanish course are expected to show mastery of concepts covered in levels 1, 2 and 3.

Grading Plan

Classwork / Homework / Class participation 60 % Quizzes / Tests / Projects 40 %

- The teacher will submit grades every week on the student's gradebook in <u>HISD Connect by PowerSchool</u>. This information is available 24/7. Students and parents are encouraged to monitor grades at least once a week and notify the teacher of any errors if found.
- Students will ask questions about their assignments DURING school hours (preferably during the class period) to make sure the teacher can assist them before an assignment's deadline.
- Questions asked during non-school hours will likely be answered on the next school day.
- Students MUST report any problem in completing an assignment <u>before the deadline</u>; otherwise the assignment will be considered late.
- Students will contact the teacher at <u>LLEON1@houstonisd.org</u>.

Late Work Policy and Make-Up Policy

- A student is expected to complete any assignment/assessment by the due date.
- Late assignments/assessment are graded based on a scale of 70 points unless due to an excused absence.
- A missed assignment or assessment must be completed within three school days; otherwise, the grade will be zero.
- A student who have been unable to complete assignments/assessments due to <u>an excused absence</u> (i.e.: illness or other special circumstances as determined by DeBakey HSHP policy) should complete them within three school days counted <u>from the day the student has returned to school.</u> After three school days, the grade will be zero.
- If absent, a student is responsible to find out what work needs to be completed <u>by checking the Spanish class page on the HUB.</u>

Cheating Policy

Copying work from another student; giving your work to another student to copy, or presenting someone
else's work as your own constitutes cheating and it will have consequences according to the <u>DeBakey</u>
<u>HSHP Student Code of Conduct</u>.

Re-Take Policy

- If a student receives a failing grade on a <u>test</u>, he/she may request a re-take. This applies to tests only; it does not to quizzes or projects.
- Re-takes are NOT allowed on common assessments or final exams.
- The re-take grade will be the average of the two scores, the original and the re-take, unless the average is higher than a 70. If the average is higher than a 70, the grade defaults to a 70. The highest grade a student can receive on the retake test is a 70%.
- The re-take must be completed within 5 school days after receiving the first graded test.
- Re-take opportunities must be scheduled <u>outside of regular class time</u>.
