

Gifted and Talented Virtual EXPO 2020

ELIGIBILITY

Open to all gifted and talented scholars for the 2019-2020 school year. Participation is voluntary.

FIRST STEP

To be eligible to participate, scholars must <u>register</u> and agree to HISD Media Release by **Wednesday**, **April 29**, **2020**.

VIRTUAL EXPO DETAILS

- Who?
 - All gifted and talented scholars who:
 - registered and received confirmation of participation, and
 - agreed to the HISD Media Release.
- What?
 - o Virtual GT Expo to showcase your gifted scholar's independent investigations.
 - registered and received confirmation of participation, and
 - agreed to the HISD Media Release.
 - Video must be scholar created and feature the scholar.
 - Video is to be five minutes or less and include the following:
 - scholar's explanation selected topic,
 - details of research or activity development,
 - description of real-world application,
 - plans or recommendations for next steps or future investigations.

When?

- o Registration closes April 30, 2020
- Virtual submissions are due:
 - May 11, 2020 Elementary Scholars
 - May 18, 2020 Secondary Scholars
- Virtual gallery walks for community May 18 June 1, 2020
- Winners announced May 26, 2020

Why?

- While scholars are learning remotely is a great time to engage them with independent investigations.
- Independent Investigations allows scholars to extend and deepen enduring learning through research and presentation skills.

Where?

- All scholars' work will be submitted and maintained for public viewing in Renzulli Learning.
- All community and district stakeholders will have access to the HISD+Renzulli Learning Virtual Gallery.

How?

- Registered scholars will receive participation confirmation and link for virtual submissions.
- Scholars may have individual ideas for investigations or projects.
- Scholars may:
 - present on topics of personal interest,
 - self-select topics from the <u>Renzulli Project Wizard</u>, or
 - request an assigned topic from a teacher.
- The Renzulli Learning Beta Project Wizard is designed to support project-based learning with a simple, scaffolded, step-by-step process.

• Resources?

- Reference to resources of choice that support video submission ideas are available and allowable.
- Some suggestions include Texas Performance Standards <u>Projects</u>, Royal Fireworks Press-A <u>Library</u>, and <u>Renzulli</u> Learning.

TIPS TO MAKE A SENSATIONAL VIDEO!

- Stay on topic! Video should support the solution, topic or question.
- Have a clear goal.
- Get permission before using someone else's graphics, content, or picture and remember to give credit when you use someone else's content.
- Stay within the time limit of 5 minutes or less.
- Information is clearly focused and highly engaging in an organized manner.
- Information is delivered in a logical pattern to support the conclusion.
- Keep the camera steady. Frame your shots well.
- Media is used to clarify and illustrate main points.
- Limit background noise. Make sure the video sound is of good quality and easy to hear.
- Review your typing to avoid spelling and grammatical errors.
- Ask someone to review your video with you.
