HISD "MILLIONAIRE CLUB" SUMMER READING PROGRAM

All Horn students who read at least 5 books over the summer break are eligible to become



members of the "Millionaire Club", which is the HISD summer reading program. Summer reading must not take place before June 1, 2012. The log-in forms were put in red folders last Tuesday. Students simply need to write all titles of books read over the summer on the log-in form, have a parent sign the form, and return it to Ms. Batke by September 7, 2012 to become Millionaire Club members.

If a student loses the log-in form over the summer, he/she may write the titles on a sheet of blank notebook paper and have a parent sign.

The HISD "Millionaire Club" is not associated with any other summer reading program (HPL, Bellaire Library, etc.). Ms. Batke <u>must</u> have a "Millionaire Club" form or paper that has all titles read for each student who has read the 5+ books.

There will be incentive prizes given out in the fall to current Millionaire Club members. Millionaire Club members will be able to check-out 3 books from the Horn Library instead of the regular two books.

ACANTHOSIS NIGRICANS

This year Texas School Nurses are screening grades 1, 3, 5, 7, 9th grades for Acanthosis Nigricans. Acanthosis nigricans is a skin marker associated with insulin problems and is considered a risk factor for Type 2 Diabetes and other chronic diseases. Because of the increasingly alarming rates of children developing Type 2 Diabetes, acanthosis nigricans assessments are important and can help identify children with high insulin levels who may be at-risk for developing the disease. Children who are positively identified with the AN marker undergo additional assessments of body mass index (BMI), BMI percentile, and blood pressure.

If I see this marker, I will be sending a referral sheet home with your child with the additional information (height, weight, Body Mass Index and two blood pressure readings). You are then asked to share this information with your child's doctor for follow-up. For further information contact me or check out the state website, https://rfes.utpa.edu/


biking, and scootering on Avenue B. Please respect the Traffic Policies and keep our students safe. Thank you!
