Application Process

Application

- If you already have an account, you must use this account, even if you created the
 account for a sibling. Creating a new account for a student that is already in the system
 will lock that student as a duplicate. Only the office of school choice will be able to
 unlock you!
- When you enter your child's HISD ID# on the online application, much of the demographic
 information will be automatically filled in for you. If this information is incorrect, you need
 to contact your child's current school to have it corrected. If your child is not currently in an
 HISD school, you will need to contact the last HISD School he or she attended to request
 a correction.
- For new accounts, you will need an email and password. Make sure the email you choose to use is one that you check frequently, this is how the schools you apply to will contact you.

Application Process

For students not currently identified as Gifted and Talented by HISD

Students currently in HISD and for the entire 2018-2019 school year

- Complete and submit application
- DO NOT submit any other Documentation
- **DO NOT** sign up for testing **DO NOT** request a teacher recommendation

Students not currently in HISD nor for the 2018-2019 school year

- Complete and submit application
- *Must submit the following by *January 8, 2020*
 - Copy of final 2018-2019 report card
 - Online teacher recommendation

Must request G/T testing by December 7, 2019

- NO OTHER DOCUMENTATION IS REQUIRED

Ranking Matters


This year, the application system has both Magnet and Program Choice transfers in one convenient system.

Parents may apply to up to five (5) Magnet programs out of a possible 10 Choice transfers.

Choice transfers vary by school and include but are not limited to: Career and Technology, IB, Dual Language, and Language of Instruction

* Lanier will not accept IB transfers for the 2020-2021 school year







Ranking Matters

This year parents will be asked to rank applications in priority order, from first choice to last choice. Parents will be able to adjust the order of their choices through December 6, 2019. After December 6, choices will be locked into place. January 30, 2020, when we notify parents of the outcome of their applications, the highest ranked program to which a child is accepted will be critical. All applications ranked below that choice will be dropped automatically. Any programs to which students are wait listed, that rank above the highest accepted choice, remain active.

Ranking Matters

The example below is of a student's outcome. The parents applied to Four schools, and listed their priorities in the order below (top to bottom). The highest ranked choice at which the student was offered a seat was Baylor. Therefore, the outcome for Sharpstown International is no longer relevant. The student did not meet the qualifications for consideration at Hamilton and remains on the wait list for Pin Oak. If, subsequently, the student is offered a place at Pin Oak, the Baylor offer will be dropped. (However, before that happens, parents will have the option to withdraw their student from the Pin Oak wait list and thereby lock in their place at Baylor.) Parents will still need to provide proof of residence after being notified of an offer or the offer will be withdrawn.

Dates to Remember

- The application window opened September 27, 2019
- Magnet Tours are every Thursday from October 3rd through December 5th (except Halloween and Thanksgiving break)
 - Middle School tours begin at 1:00 PM sharp (November 21st and December 5th, 9 & 1)
- In order to be considered for Lanier's lottery you must apply by December 6, 2019
- You must finalize your rankings by December 6, 2019
- You must request GT testing by December 7, 2019
- All required documentation must be uploaded by January 8, 2020
- Parent notification will be by midnight, Thursday, January 30, 2020






Diversity



Guidance Support Groups


- Replace traditional homerooms
