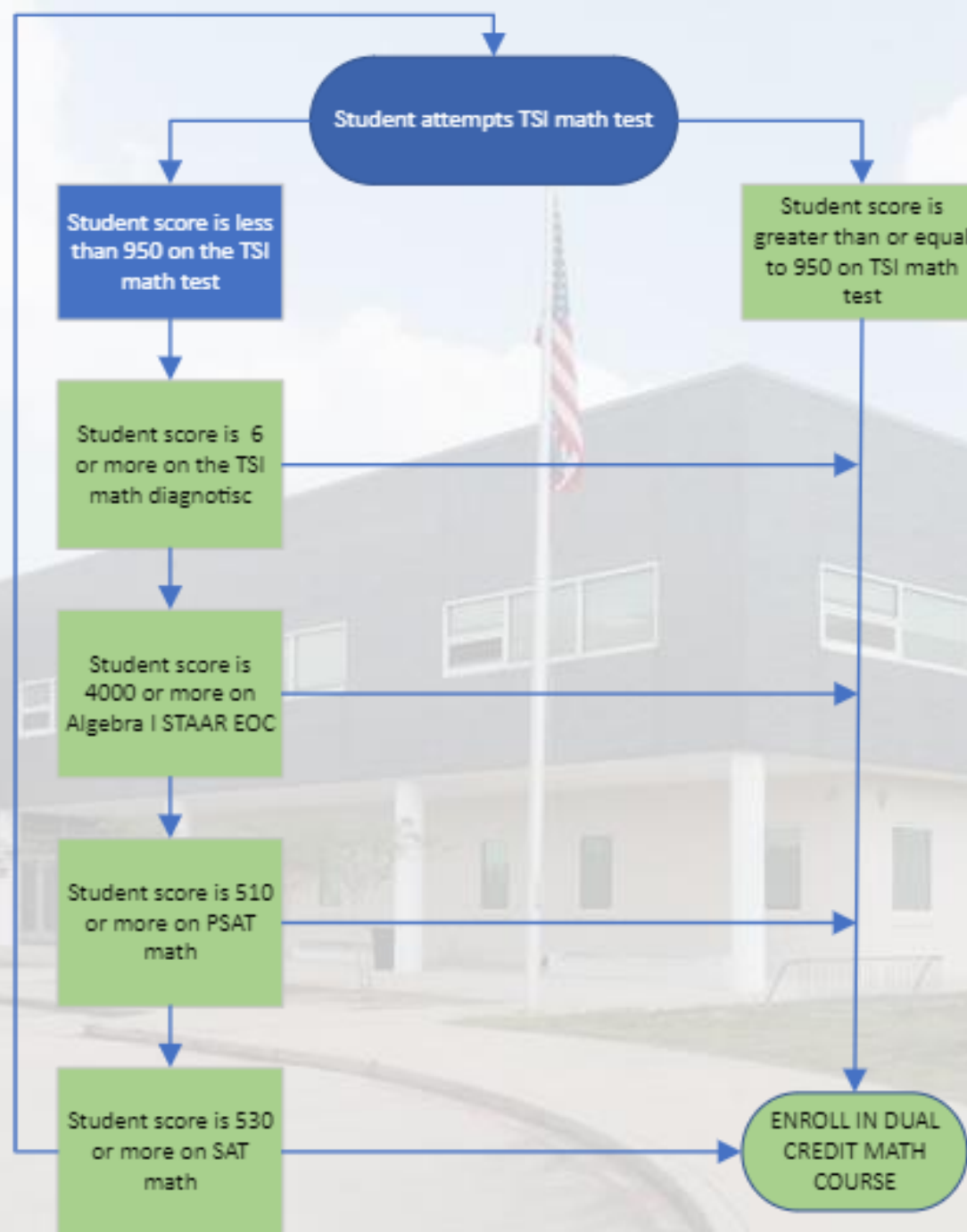


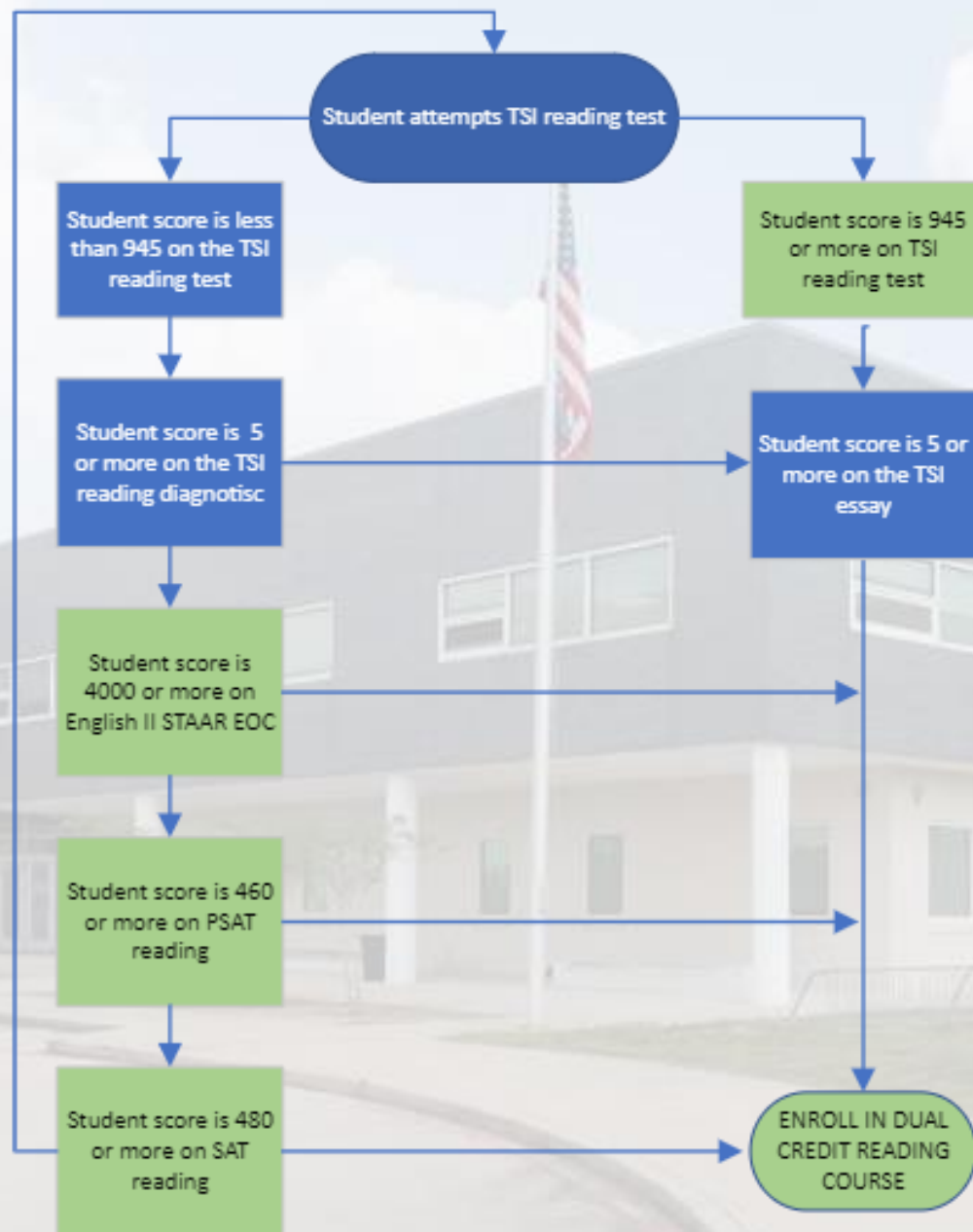

How is this year is different?

1. There is a new STAAR EOC test. Scores will not be reported in time for students to use English II and Algebra I to qualify for classes.
2. HCC will have to wait for TEA to determine new cutoffs if any.
3. 9th & 10th grade students will have no other way to qualify for dual credit classes except for for fall 2023 courses.



How may changes affect students?

- Without TSI completion, 10th grade students will be ineligible to enroll in ENGL 1301/1302 and HIST 1301/1302
 - These courses are mandatory to receive the Associate's Degree.
 - These courses must be taken in order.
- Students enrolled in Geometry and Algebra II will not be able to enroll in MATH 1314 OR MATH 1316.
 - Math is a requirement for the Associate's Degree
- Students can only take five college courses per semester. (15 hours)
 - If they do not qualify by the 11th grade it becomes difficult to reach the required 60 hours to earn the Associates Degree.

What should you do to prepare for the TSI?




- Look up your TSI report on Accuplacer.
