Magnet/Vanguard Coordinator Message

Reflecting on the overwhelming parent/guardian attendance at the Superstar Showcase and Middle School Open House, I would like to extend once again our gratitude to all the adults in our students' lives who are heavily involved in supporting our magnet and vanguard programming. Both programs continue to evolve and get stronger with each coming year because of your support. Our students were so proud to share their projects with you and we hope that you will all join us again in the spring to celebrate their second semester. Our 4th and 5th graders were also able to see your investment in their education through attendance at the middle school open house. This in turn prompted them to begin thinking about goals for their academic future.

As we evolve, our magnet team is focusing on giving students additional field experiences related to the enrichment curriculum they receive on campus. A few reminders and announcements:

Magnet Application Deadline — The deadline to apply to magnet programs is **DECEMBER 8th.** If you are a PK family not zoned to Sinclair, or a current PK-4th grade family zoned to Sinclair but moving out of zone, please be sure to apply to Sinclair prior to this deadline and make your rankings accordingly. 5th grade families, please be sure to consider your middle school options at the final school choice fair of the semester this Saturday, December 2nd from 9AM—12PM at Key Middle School, and submit your final middle school applications by the deadline.

GT Testing — We just finished our universal testing for kindergarten and 5th grade students not yet identified as GT. In December and January, we will be moving on to testing for 1st through 4th grade students who submitted an application. Parents will receive a letter the week of December 11th with specific details.
