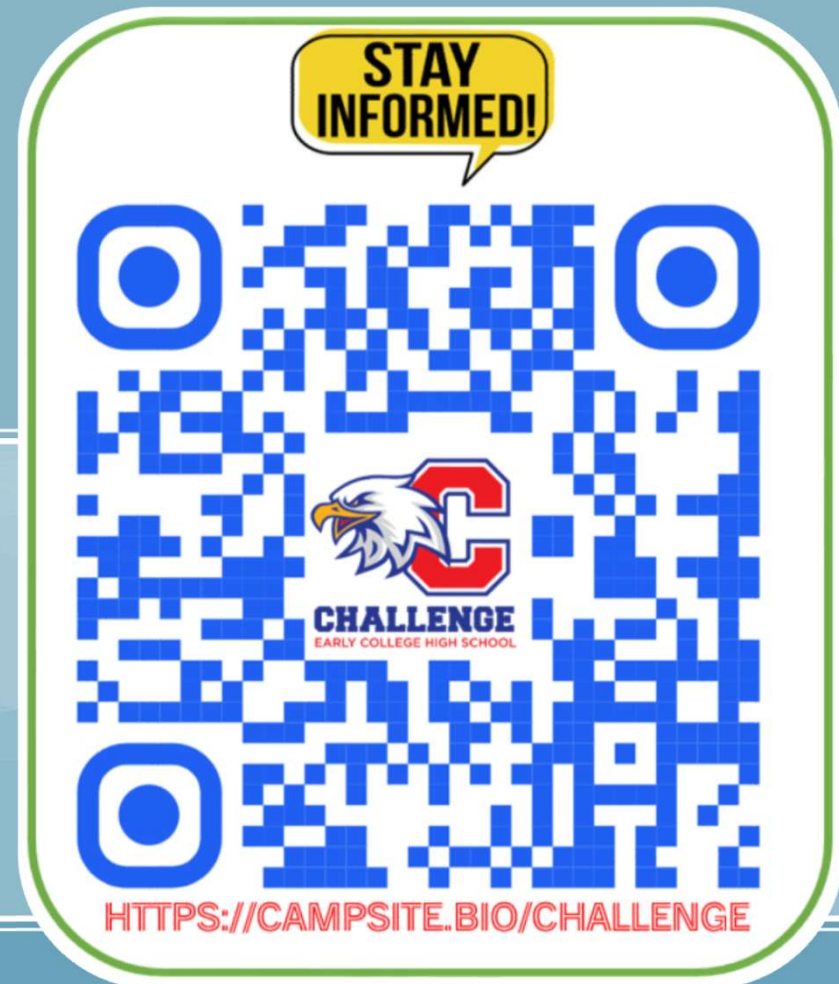

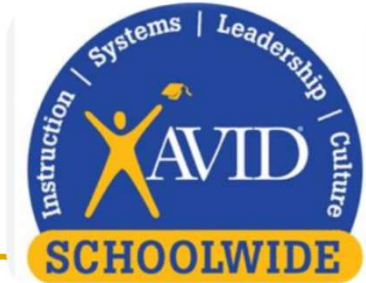

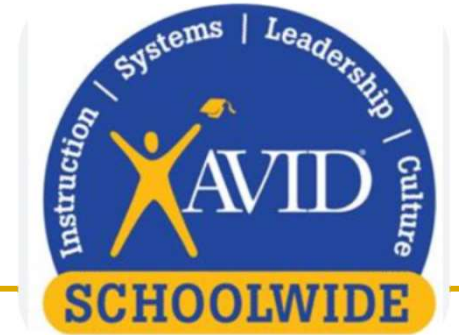
Key Components of UT OnRamps:

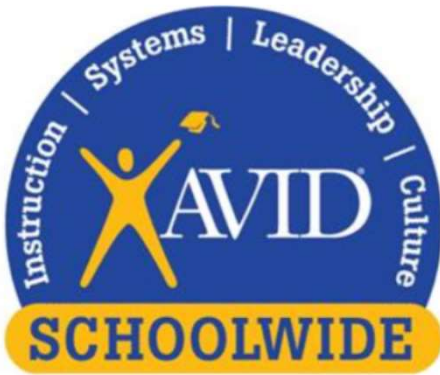


AVID is an acronym that stands for 'Advancement Via Individual Determination.'

- **AVID Elective:**
 - "In the AVID program, students enroll in an AVID elective class where they receive academic support, study skills, and college preparation guidance. This class is a pivotal part of the AVID experience."
 - Tutoring: "AVID provides students with access to collaborative in group study sessions."
 - College and Career Exploration: "AVID encourages students to explore various college and career options. It helps them set long-term goals and provides guidance on college admissions, financial aid, and scholarships."
 - Organization and Study Skills: "Through AVID, students learn essential organizational and study skills that are crucial for academic success. This includes note-taking, time management, and test preparation."

Attendance Matters

- 90% rule: in order to receive credit or a final grade for a class, a student is required to attend class 90 percent of the days class is offered regardless of whether the student's absences are excused (see FEA) or un.excused. Atty, Gen. Op. JC-0398 (2001)

The only acceptable excuses for tardies and absences are (require documentation):

- Personal illness – requires doctor notes
- Illness or death in the family
- Weather conditions making travel dangerous – determined by HISD weather days
- Participation in school activities with permission of the principal.

Course Credit

Excessive Absences The Texas Education Code (25.092) sets a minimum attendance requirement of 90 percent (**no more than 3 absences**) of class meetings for the award of course credit. Houston ISD requires a minimum attendance of 90% of class meetings. In addition to a 90% requirement for course credit.

Students who have lost credit due to course attendance from 75% to 90% **(4 absences per semester per each class)** of class meetings may appeal for restoration of credit directly to the attendance committee. Upon successful completion of a plan approved by the committee, and reviewed by the principal, credit may be restored. This plan must provide for the student to meet the instructional requirements of the class.

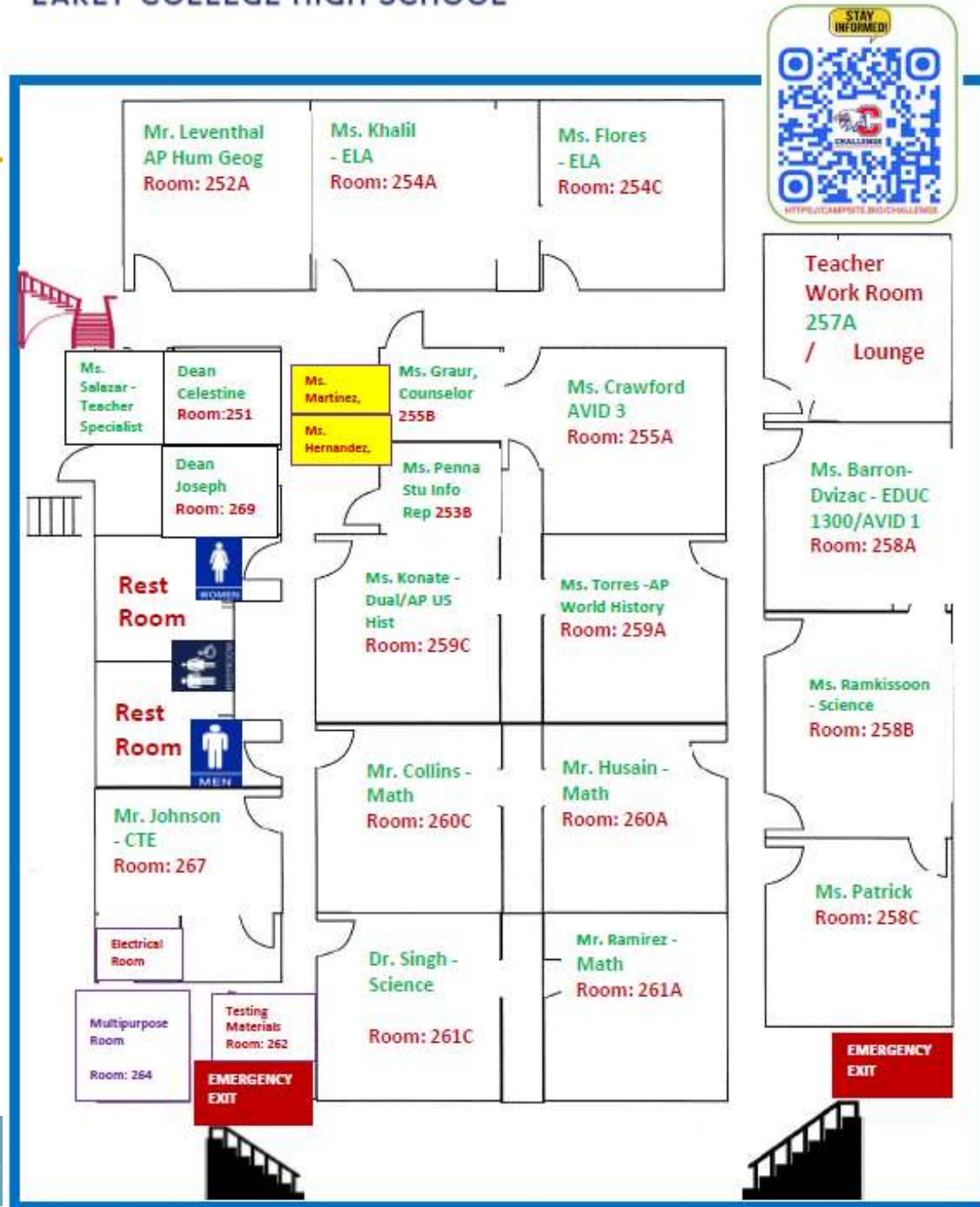
