 - c. Safety – weekly door audit, picture of fence (quote needed) build fence along sidewalk in front on both sides with push gates to allow sidewalk access. Discussed multiple options other than the fence. If fence is put up, keep the same style fence in the front of the building. Buzzer fence at main front entrance 7/8 voted. 1/8 voted for the fence as in the picture.
 - d. Budget – still unknowns for next year – since we’re B campus we’ll likely have the same budget as this year, based on enrollment and special pops. The district will predict our projected enrollment this year. Not sure if this will work, Principals have put in input, but clarifications are needed. Will know by March 18th budget will be available to review in OneSource.
 - i. Curriculum – curriculum, NonNES schools do not have a set curriculum. We have autonomy with curriculum. Whatever curriculum we move forward with, Hogg is responsible for paying for it. Math recommended curriculum or NES curriculum. ELAR recommended amplify or NES curriculum. Science recommended NES curriculum. SS recommended NES curriculum. Hogg is able to continue using IB based curriculum which we use multiple curriculums. It’s not mandated that we follow that model.
