If you are selected to be a part of the Summer Teen Volunteer Program, you will be asked to complete an online background check as well as pass a general health screen. During the interview, the applicant will learn about the policies, procedures, day-to-day duties of a hospital volunteer and what is expected of the applicant if accepted into the program.
