Dues for the 2018-2019 school year are \$50. This money will cover your membership fee and the registration fee for the Regional Leadership Conference. Dues must be turned in no later than September 28, 2018.

Expectations:

Students and Parents should expect:

- That the student will attend monthly BPA meetings.
- That the student will work a minimum of 15 hours per semester for fundraising.
- That the student will prepare for competitions a minimum of 15 hours prior to the Regional contest and 15 hours prior to the State contest.
- That the student will compete at regionals on January 19, 2019 at Kempner High School, 14777 Voss Rd, Sugar Land, TX 77498
- Student will participate in a Community Service Project
- FOR DISTINGUISHED MEMBER STATUS (SENIORS ONLY): Scholarship Opportunities and Graduation Cord (meet above requirements, plus)
 - Attend 90% of the meetings
 - Compete in the BPA Regional Convention and Competition
 - Be a member for two years or more

Policies:

- If member misses more than 2 meetings, then he or she will be dropped from the BPA roll for the current year and will not be eligible to join until the next school year.
- If a member misses a meeting, then one hour will be added to either contest preparation or fundraising.
- If a member does not fulfill his or her obligation for contest preparation, fundraising or meeting attendance then he or she will be dropped from the roll.
