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School Parent and Family Engagement Policy Kashmere High School 2020-2021

If students are to be successful, their parents and guardians must be actively involved in their education. Kashmere High School has developed this policy to describe:

PARENTAL INVOLVEMENT

Kashmere High School provides many opportunities to support parental involvement in the planning, review, and improvement of Title I programs. These opportunities include an Annual Fall Title I Meeting in September (9/12/2019) to which all parents are invited to attend to understand Kashmere High School's participation in Title I activities, requirements as outlined by Title I regulations, and the rights of the parents.

Additional meetings are scheduled throughout the school year, including but not limited to:

- Monthly Parent Teacher Organization (PTO) meetings
- Monthly School Based Decision-Making Committee (SDMC) meetings on the first Tuesday of the month
- Annual Fall & Spring Title I Meeting & State of the School Address
- Parent Universities

The purpose of these meetings is to provide information regarding implementation of programs at Kashmere High School, solicit and respond to parent suggestions, allow parents an opportunity to share experiences with one another,

and to participate in decisions concerning the Title I services offered. These meetings are offered at various times of the day to accommodate schedules of parents. Meetings are advertised on the school marquee, school website, social media and by phone call-outs.

The School-Parent Compact was developed jointly with parents of Title I students and explains how parents, school staff, and students will all share responsibility for each student's academic success. If requested by parents, additional meetings can be scheduled to formulate suggestions and to participate, as appropriate, in decisions related to the education of their children. If the school-wide program plan is not satisfactory to the parents of participating children, the school will submit parents' comments to the Department of External Funding and revise the plan as advised by the HISD Title I, Part A Parental Involvement Program Administrator and other district designees as advised.

PARENT TRAINING AND INVOLVEMENT

To ensure effective involvement of parents and to support a partnership among the school, parents, and the community to improve student academic achievement, the campus will build the school's and parent's capacity to influence their student's education by:

- Assisting parents in understanding STAAR testing and graduation requirements as set by the state of Texas;

- Providing materials and training to help parents work with their children, including literacy training and use of technology;
- Educating teachers, pupil services personnel, principals, and other staff, with the assistance of parents, in the value and utility of the contributions of parents, and best practices for meaningful, two-way communication in order to work with parents as equal partners;
- Coordinating and integrating parental involvement programs and activities with other programs;
