### **Final Exams:**

- 2 hour exam...most of you are not accustomed to studying for an exam that covers the whole semester.
- Preparation is different than studying for a unit test!
- \$1,000,000 question for your teacher:

What is the <u>best way to study</u> for my final exam?

### **Composite Grading**

- Semester 1 Grade = 65
- Semester 2 Grade = 75
- Add both semester grades together, divide by two and average = 69.5 or higher
- Or...the total points for both semesters must equal 139 or higher to earn credit for the entire course

# Don't put off what you want most to do what you want right now!

- Trust, reliability, and opportunities
- Athletic eligibility
- Revoke student transfer
- Mandatory lunch tutorial
- Off campus lunch, prom, HOCO, etc...
- Student leadership; scholarships
- Driving? No VOE! (verification of enrollment)
- New procedures for appealing course credit released during the last week of school
- Appeals are limited to one semester only

### **Summer School**

- Monday Thursday; June 5<sup>th</sup> July 3; 8:00-3:00PM
- Uniform Required
- Up to 4 courses for credit recovery (2 credits)
- Original credit courses must be taken elsewhere
