# Endorsements and Pathways

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## Endorsement:

- Endorsements consist of a related series of courses that are grouped together by interest or skill set. They provide students with in-depth knowledge of a subject area.
- **Multi-disciplinary**

## Pathway:

- A CTE pathway is a sequence of two or more CTE courses within a student's area of career interest.
- Pathways are designed to connect high school classes to college, industry certifications, and/or a career
- **Business Marketing and Finance**

# Multi-Disciplinary Endorsement

**Endorsements** is where students will select one or more endorsements to complete while in high school related to their course sequence. Students will select from the following endorsements:



**Multi-Disciplinary** (a sequence of advance courses to prepare student to enter the workforce, four credits in each foundation subject area, four credit in AP, IB or dual credit selected from English, math, science, social studies, economics, LOTE, or fine arts)
