Campus Safety and Wellness Reminders

Hello Bulldog Families,

I am thankful to our Shadowbriar Community and our Families for helping us to keep our students and staff safe. The safety and wellness of our students and staff is our #1 priority. To support us in our campus safety and wellness efforts, I have included some updates and reminders below.

Morning Arrival:

- All students should arrive by 7:30 am. Late students should remain virtual and classwork will be completed online to avoid disruptions to the learning environment.
- All late arriving student's and parents will need to wait outside the front door, where social distancing can occur. A member of the staff will be available to take your temperature and provide students with PPE.

Lunch:

- ALL students are provided a free lunch from the district.
- If your child would like a different lunch it must be packed in their lunch box and provided as they enter for school. No drop-offs are allowed. You will not be able to drop off lunch beginning on Monday, November 2nd.

Afternoon Dismissal:

- If your child is released as a walker parents must wait by the stop sign away from the school dismissal doors.
- If you need to pick your child up early for an appointment, he/she should remain virtual for the day from home. Please do not pick up your child early as it disrupts learning for your child as well as the learning environment for other students. Campus visitation is limited, and parents will be assisted at the main office entry/foyer if there are emergency pick-up concerns.

Math-

Unit 4: Students will use variety of strategies to develop fluency and automaticity with multiplication and division facts. Students will determine a quotient using the relationship between multiplication and division and will use divisibility rules to determine whether a number is even or odd.

Unit 5: Students will use a variety of strategies, including number lines, to round and estimate solutions to and represent and solve one- and two-step addition and subtraction word problems, including problems that involve data.

English Language Art-

Unit 3: Students will analyze and explore genre characteristics in Drama. Students will apply their learning of characteristics in Drama and craft to their compositions.

Unit 4: Students will analyze and explore genre characteristics in poetry. Students will apply their learning of genre characteristics and craft to their writing.

Science-

Unit 5: Students will explore different forms of energy and will use the content to engage in Project-Based Learning.

Social Studies-

Unit 2: Students practice the study of history by locating, examining, and interpreting visual, print, and oral historical records.



Fifth Grade News

What are we learning?

ELA: We will be studying units focused on comparing and contrasting, story elements, point of view, and figurative language relating to our literature standards. We will also be focusing on planning, drafting, editing, and revising Personal Narrative writing pieces.

Math: We will be focusing on our division unit. Students will be learning partial quotients, the area model for division, the standard algorithm, and division with remainders.

Social studies: We will be launching our "Turn of the Century" unit. Students will be learning about the cattle drive, inventors, the Spanish-American war, and immigration.




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
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Red Ribbon Week

- **Friday-** "Team Up Against Drugs" Wear your favorite team's jersey.


