NURSE'S NOTES

Dear Parents of 6th Grade Students,

This is to inform you that state mandated spinal screening (scoliosis) will be done on all 6th graders during the student's P.E. or Drill/Dance Team class. The teachers involved will be given a screening schedule in advance. The screening will start this month. Scoliosis is a problem of the spine as the result of growth. As the pre-puberty growth spurt occurs, the spine may become curved. The curve can cause a tilt in the shoulders and/or the hips, which interferes with the space for the lungs and heart and

can impede their function. Scoliosis appears gradually and is not obvious to an untrained person or parent until the deformity becomes severe. As you can see, scoliosis screening is important for the well-being of your child. The bare back examining of the child easily accomplishes scoliosis screening. If necessary, after the initial examine a second examine will be done and if indicated a referral will be made.
