The IB application requires the first semester report card with semester averages, the final 7<sup>th</sup> grade report card, the permanent record card, and the most recent Stanford 10 scores. Applications are available from the 8<sup>th</sup> grade administrators in Office A or can also be printed from the Lamar High School website at <a href="www.lamarhs.com">www.lamarhs.com</a>. Click on the "Academics" tab followed by clicking on the "Advanced Academics" tab.

Students whose address is not zoned to Lamar High School must apply with a magnet application or accompany the IB application with an application for transfer form available at <a href="https://www.houstonisd.org">www.houstonisd.org</a>. All students accepted into Lamar's magnet program are automatically accepted into the IB program.

Students will be notified by mail for both the magnet and IB programs during the last week of March.
