They faced very tough competition from several other middle schools, but in the end, only one dance team could win the coveted State Champion hoodies. Lanier was the underdog and delivered awesome performance after awesome performance to bring home the State Champion title.

Dance Company was the winner in the Prop and Kick categories, first runner up in the Jazz category, and second runner up in the Pom category. Company also won awards for Outstanding Choreography for their Jazz, Prop and Kick routines and an award for Outstanding Technique for their Prop routine. Crew was the winner in the Hip Hop category and won an award for Outstanding Choreography in the Hip Hop category.
