## Board President Paula Harris to Present Books on the Last Day of School

June 2, 2011 - Second graders at a dozen HISD elementary schools will receive a gift on the last day of school; a gift of learning. Thanks to the generosity of the South Central Region Chapter of Jack and Jill of America, Inc. and HISD Board President Paula Harris, 900 students will go home with a brand new book.

Mrs. Harris and officers of Jack and Jill of America will personally hand out books to second graders at MacGregor Elementary School (4801 LaBranch, 77004) on Friday, June 3, at 10:00 a.m.

Board President Harris is a champion of literacy issues in the district. She was one of the founders of the successful Real Men Read program, which recruits professional men to read to students in HISD schools and share their love of reading.

Mrs. Harris said, "As we begin summer vacation, there is no more important foundation for the next school year, than for our students to read. Research shows that students tend to lose some of the knowledge they've gained during the summer break, unless they are avid readers."

HISD students are encouraged to take part in the Millionaire Club Reading Program over the summer. The program, which is a partnership between HISD and the Houston Public Library, encourages every student to read five books over the summer.
