SUBJECT: BOARD MONITORING SYSTEM—GOAL 1, SECTION B: IMPROVE DROPOUT RATE AND COMPLETION RATE

At the February 11, 2010, meeting, the Board of Education approved on first reading a revised Board Monitoring System in order to efficiently maintain and measure Houston Independent School District's (HISD) goals and core values. The monitoring system was designed to give district administrators clear direction on how to meet the board's expectations in these crucial areas.

Board Policy AE(LOCAL) requires that "[T]he administration shall report to the Board on each goal and core value using the specific method and timing set out."

In reference to the district's **Goal 1: Increase Student Achievement**, the attached report provides information regarding section **B: Improve Dropout and Completion Rates**. The policy states that "the administration shall provide the Board of Education with a report on the progress being made to decrease dropout rates and increase graduation rates. The report shall include data depicting the District's dropout rate and graduation rates as compared to the state averages. In addition, the report shall include analysis of these data by all students and various student groups."

The attached report provides the annual dropout rates, graduation rates, and Completion Rate I for the district and state for all students and student groups. The district's targets have been included for each measure in the graphs.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Purpose

The Houston Independent School District (HISD) exists to strengthen the social and economic foundation of Houston by assuring its youth the highest-quality elementary and secondary education available anywhere. In fulfilling this goal, HISD's Board of Education has designed a program to systematically monitor the district's goals and core values. The Board Monitoring System will report on each goal and core value on a routine basis. The goal currently under review is to improve the dropout and completion rates among students as measured by the Texas Education Agency (Goal 1, Section B).

Findings

Annual Dropout Rate





Figure 1: HISD's Annual Dropout Rate for All Students in Grades 7–8 2005–2006 to 2010–2011

- The annual dropout rate (grades 7 and 8) decreased from 0.5 percent in the 2009–2010 school year to 0.3 percent in 2010–2011 (**Figure 1**). HISD continues to decrease the dropout rate as a district and has achieved the lowest dropout rate that the district has ever had.
- HISD's dropout rate of 0.3 percent exceeded the state's dropout rate of 0.2 percent but continues to close the gap with State outcomes (**Table 1**).

Four-Year Longitudinal Graduation Rates

• HISD graduated the highest percentage of students (78.5 percent) under the state's accountability standards set in 2007 and is increasing annually (**Figure 3**).

Four-Year Longitudinal Completion Status

- The percentage of students in the ninth grade cohort who dropped out of school by the end of four years decreased from 12.6 percent for the class of 2010 to 11.8 percent for the class of 2011 (**Table 2**). This is the lowest rate the district has seen since Texas adopted federal dropout definitions.
- The graduation rate for the class of 2011 was 78.5 percent, which is 4.2 percentage points higher than 2010's graduation rate of 74.3 percent.




Figure 4: Longitudinal Completion Rate I* for All Students in HISD and the State, Class of 2006-2011

- HISD's completion rate of 87.6 is the highest percentage of students completing in the district since adopting the federal standards in 2006. The district continues to work towards the goal of 95 percent by increasing completion rates over the last five years (**Figure 4**).




Figure 5 : Four-Year Completion Rate for All Students and Student Groups in HISD, Class of 2010 and 2011

- The district goal of an annual 3 percentage-point increase for the four-year completion rate for all students and for each student group (All, African American, Hispanic, White,

and Economically Disadvantaged) was not met (**Figure 5**). All student groups increased in completion rate from 2010 to 2011, with the exception of the African American group, which decreased 0.1 percentage points.

Five-Year Graduation Rates

- HISD's five-year graduation rates for all students and each student group are lower than the state's five-year graduation rates for the class of 2010 (**Table 3**).
- The largest graduation gap between HISD (80.6) and the state (88.0) is the All Students group, with a 7.4 percentage-point difference.





* Note: Completion Rate I includes graduates and continuers.
