**SUBJECT: BOARD MONITORING UPDATE: DISCIPLINE**

The Houston Independent School District (HISD) exists to strengthen the social and economic foundation of Houston by assuring its youth the highest-quality elementary and secondary education available anywhere. In fulfilling this goal, the HISD Board of Education has designed the framework for the systematic monitoring of the district's goals.

Following are the specific, actionable measures provided to the Board of Education on an annually recurring basis for ongoing monitoring and trend reporting in the areas of rigorous education in reading and math, consistency, and safety with the intent to provide a holistic view of the district. As data is received into the district, data attributes are populated.

Attached to this update is one Executive Summary containing supporting evidence of district progress for the 2015–2016 school year, specifically for:

- Level III, IV, and V Disciplinary offenses and bullying incidents districtwide and by school

## Board Monitoring System: Discipline

### EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

#### Purpose

The Houston Independent School District (HISD) exists to strengthen the social and economic foundation of Houston by assuring its youth the highest-quality elementary and secondary education available anywhere. In fulfilling this goal, HISD's Board of Education has designed a program to systematically monitor the district's goals and core values. The following results inform the progress of the district as it relates to safety and environment, specifically the number of Level III, Level IV, Level V, and bullying incidents as defined below.

Examples of Level III, Level IV, and Level V incidents as defined locally and published in the Code of Student Conduct are listed below.

- Level III: Repeated disciplinary infractions of Level I and/or Level II offenses, fighting, gambling, chronic cutting class and/or skipping school, possession of a knife, display of disrespect toward school personnel or campus visitors, or cyber bullying.
- Level IV: Felony conduct, assault, use or selling of drugs and/or alcohol, making a “hit list,” or creating a false alarm, report, or terroristic threat.
- Level V: Felony drug charge, aggravated assault, sexual assault, murder, or a discretionary expulsion based upon a student’s disciplinary history and the commission of a Level IV offense.
- Bullying: Any act or speech that subjects persons to indignity, humiliation, intimidation, physical abuse or threat of physical abuse, social or other isolation, shame or disgrace.
  - As required by the United States Department of Education’s Office for Civil Rights, HISD began collecting allegations of bullying by category of incident in the 2015–2016 academic year, where the categories of incident are: sex/gender; race, color,

or national origin; disability status; sexual orientation; and religion. This may have led to greater fidelity in campus administrators recording incidents of bullying, which could explain the dramatic increase in the total count of bullying infractions from 2014–2015 to 2015–2016.

## Findings


- The Board Monitoring Scorecard shows that, from 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, the absolute number of Level III, Level V, and Bullying incidents increased while the absolute number of Level IV offenses remained unchanged.
- Overall, during the 2015–2016 school year, middle schools had the highest number and proportion of Level III offenses and bullying incidents, and high schools had the highest number and proportion of Level IV and Level V offenses (see Table 1 and corresponding Figures 1–4).
- Reports of bullying increased across all academic levels except combined schools. There was an increase of 547 percent (17 incidents to 110 incidents), 406 percent (33 incidents to 167 incidents), and 125 percent (28 incidents to 63 incidents) in elementary, middle, and high schools, respectively.



**FIGURE 1. Percent of Level III Offenses by Academic Level, 2014–2015 and 2015–2016 (based on Table 1)**





**FIGURE 2. Percent of Level IV Offenses by Academic Level, 2014–2015 and 2015–2016 (based on Table 1)**





**Of the 7,206 total Level III, Level IV, and Level V offenses recorded during the 2015–2016 academic year, 3,422 (48 percent) were attributed to middle school students, 2,873 (40 percent) were attributed to high school students, 538 (7 percent) were attributed to elementary school students, and 373 (5 percent) were attributed to students in combined schools.**

- There were seven schools that recorded greater than 200 total offenses during the 2015–2016 academic year: Crispus Attucks Middle School had 280 incidents (cumulative enrollment of 577), James Madison High School had 266 incidents (enrollment of 2,033), Forest Brook Middle School had 252 incidents (enrollment of 1,012), Ross Sterling High School had 237 incidents (enrollment of 1,268), Evan Worthing High School had 221 incidents (enrollment of 839), Sam Houston Math, Science, and Technology Center had 216 incidents (enrollment of 2,863), and César Chávez High School had 212 incidents (enrollment of 3,321; Appendix I).
- Out of 173 elementary schools in HISD only two recorded a number of total offenses exceeding 50 in 2015–2016; those schools were Felix Cook, Jr., Elementary School (cumulative enrollment of 783), which had 56 incidents, and Mabel Wesley Elementary School, which had 56 incidents (enrollment of 447; Appendix I).
- While seven schools saw the total number of offenses increase by greater than 75 incidents from 2013–2014 to the 2014–2015 academic year (see the Board Monitoring System report for 2014–2015), only three schools saw the total number of offenses increase by that much from 2014–2015 to the 2015–2016 academic year: Crispus Attucks Middle School (from 119 to 280 incidents, with cumulative enrollment of 577); Stephen F. Austin High School (from 41 to 143 incidents, with enrollment of 1,996); and James Madison High School (from 70 to 264 incidents, with enrollment of 2,033; Appendix I).
- Six schools saw the total number of offenses decrease by greater than 75 incidents from 2014–2015 to the 2015–2016 academic year: Forest Brook Middle School (from 386 to 252 incidents, with cumulative enrollment of 1,012); Hilliard Elementary School (from 140 to 26 incidents, with enrollment of 792); Audrey H. Lawson (formerly Richard Dowling) Middle School (from 244 to 155 incidents, with enrollment of 1,197); Kashmere High School (from 104 to 21 incidents, with enrollment of 669); Walter Fondren Middle School (from 145 to 69, with enrollment of 987; Appendix I).

**Cumulative enrollment within HISD for the 2015–2016 academic year was 231,539 students. Broken down by academic level, there were 121,141 (53 percent) students in elementary schools, 36,375 (16 percent) students in middle schools, 50,946 (22 percent) students in high schools, and 21,077 (9 percent) students in combined schools. The total offenses as a percent of cumulative enrollment for each academic level was 0.4 percent, 9.4 percent, 5.6 percent, and 1.8 percent, respectively.**

- The four schools with the largest increase in total offenses as a percent of cumulative enrollment from 2014–2015 to 2015–2016 were: Crispus Attucks Middle School (from 20.2 to 51.8, with cumulative enrollment of 577); James Madison High School (from 3.4 to 13.0, with enrollment of 2,033); John McReynolds Middle School (from 8.4 to 19.4 percent, with enrollment of 641); and Thomas Alva Edison Middle School (from 9.5 to 20.0, with enrollment of 758; Appendix II).

- The four schools with the largest decrease in total offenses as a percent of cumulative enrollment from 2014–2015 to 2015–2016 were: High School Ahead Academy (from 32.2 to 18.3 percent, with cumulative enrollment of 251); Hilliard Elementary School (from 15.9 to 3.3 percent, with enrollment of 792); Kashmere High School (from 15.4 to 3.1 percent, with enrollment of 669); and Lamar Fleming Middle School (from 23.0 to 14.9 percent, with enrollment of 533; Appendix II).


**The 538 offenses committed by elementary school students during the 2015–2016 academic year were carried out by 461 unique individuals, the 3,422 offenses committed by middle school students were carried out by 2,442 unique individuals, the 2,873 offenses committed by high school students were carried out by 2,153 unique individuals, and the 373 offenses committed by students enrolled at combined schools were carried out by 286 unique individuals. There was a total of 5,342 unique students, then, who committed at least one Level III, Level IV, or Level V offense during the 2015–2016 academic year, with an average of about 1.3 incidents per student.**

- From 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, the number of students committing at least one **Level III** offense **decreased** most at Hilliard Elementary School (from 111 to 22, with cumulative enrollment of 792), Forest Brook Middle School (from 224 to 152, with enrollment of 1,012), and Louie Welch Middle School (from 76 to 8, with enrollment of 964) **and increased** most at James Madison High School (from 48 to 132, with enrollment of 2,033), Crispus Attucks Middle School (from 73 to 141, with enrollment of 577), and North Forest High School (from 16 to 74, with enrollment of 1,143; Appendix III).
- From 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, the number of students committing at least one **Level IV** offense **decreased** most at Sam Houston Math, Science, and Technology Center (from 124 to 83, with cumulative enrollment of 2,863), Bellaire High School (from 48 to 19, with enrollment of 3,699), and Westbury High School (from 49 to 27, with enrollment of 2,330) **and increased** most at James Madison Middle School (from 12 to 58, with enrollment of 2,033), Stephen F. Austin High School (from 17 to 44, with enrollment of 1,996), and Francis Scott Key Middle School (from 11 to 25, with enrollment of 807; Appendix III).
- From 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, the number of students committing at least one **Level V** offense **decreased** most at Margaret Long Wisdom (formerly Lee) High School (from 5 to 0, with cumulative enrollment of 2,005), Westbury High School (from 5 to 0, with enrollment of 2,330), and Jack Yates High School (from 6 to 2, with enrollment of 1,047) **and increased** most at Crispus Attucks Middle School (from 0 to 2, with enrollment of 577), Audrey H. Lawson (formerly Richard Dowling) Middle School (from 1 to 3, with enrollment of 1,197), Westside High School (from 0 to 2, with enrollment of 3,110), and Phillis Wheatley High School (from 1 to 3, with enrollment of 856; Appendix III).
- From 2014–2015 to 2015–2016, the number of students committing at least one **Bullying** offense **decreased** most at Jane Long Academy (from 31 to 5, with cumulative enrollment of 1,158) and Westbury High School (from 8 to 0, with enrollment of 2,330) **and increased** most at James Reynolds Elementary School (from 0 to 24, with enrollment of 588), Richard Fonville Middle School (from 0 to 23, with enrollment of 992), and Francis Scott Key Middle School (from 0 to 23, with enrollment of 807; Appendix III).

### Looking at the trend of Level III, Level IV, and Level V offenses over the past six years:

- Of the last six academic years, the year with the lowest total count of all offenses was 2011–2012, with 6,228 offenses. While the academic year following 2011–2012 academic year saw an increase in the total number of Level III, Level IV, and Level V offenses combined, the number had been relatively stable until the most recent academic year, which saw a slight increase (Figure 5).
- Of all offenses recorded in a given year, the vast majority have been Level III offenses, which account for about four out of five of all disciplinary actions (Figure 5). Only one in five offenses in a given year can be attributed to the commission of Level IV or Level V infractions.

### Administrative Responses:

#### Schools Offices

- Provided School Support Officers and campus principals discipline data by school, types of incidents, and race/ethnicity to allow for dissection and analysis of trends and to brainstorm solutions to reduce suspensions.
- The practices of leadership and staff at campuses with low suspension rates or at campuses that have reduced their suspension rates are noted and these practices are

shared at principal meetings and trainings to help them reduce bullying and suspensions.

- The Schools Offices will continue to work with campus leadership and teachers to provide viable alternatives to suspension.
  - More professional development is needed to understand the various social and emotional needs of HISD pupils and students to support positive alternatives to suspension.
  - Principals and other campus leadership have engaged in online bullying training and the Schools Offices will continue to support the implementation of related disciplinary training throughout the school year.

### **Student Support Services**

- Trained approximately 5,000 teachers at 68 campuses in Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS).
- Created 24 Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) Coordinators to build the capacity of campus personnel to address student behavior through a tiered approach.
- Coordinated with over 130 community-based partners to provide wrap around services to campuses, which will include academic, behavioral, fine arts, health and medical, substance abuse, and alternatives to suspension.
- Partnered with the City of Houston and the My Brothers' Keeper (MBK) initiative to focus district, city, county, and non-profit resources in areas of HISD associated with high rates of juvenile crime.
- Coordinated cost-sharing programs between 25 campuses to fund campus-based mental health professionals (i.e., psychologists).
- Coordinated cost-sharing programs between the 45 campuses and community partners, such as Communities in Schools (Affiliated with the Texas Education Agency) and Community Youth Services (Affiliated with Harris County) to fund campus-based social workers.
- Partnered with the Baker Policy Institute at Rice to conduct a three-year survey research study at all HISD campuses to identify the health and behavioral needs of the district.
- Partnered with the University of Texas Health Science Center at Houston to implement a trauma-informed universal screener at 25 campuses.
- Developed and implemented an online suicide prevention model required for all HISD employees.
- Coordinated Mental Health First Aid training at 35 HISD campuses.
- Implemented an Early Warning System developed by the district's Information Technology (IT) department to serve as a universal screener of variables associated with school non-completion/dropout.
- Implemented a discipline analyzer developed by the district's IT department to support campus-based decision making.
- Continues to support, among campus leadership and classroom personnel, both the strengthening of behavioral interventions and de-escalation strategies and a greater understanding of how best to use the student code of conduct.
- Increasing training and support for 284 campus crisis teams, which includes a suicide prevention liaison, a campus mental health designee, and a Crisis Prevention Intervention (CPI) team.
- Increasing training and support for 284 campus-identified behavior coordinators.
- Increasing training and support for 284 campus Intervention Assistance Teams (IAT) that will facilitate all campus activities associated with the Multi-tiered Systems of Supports (MTSS).

## **Special Education**

- The Special Education department developed Tools for Managing Problem Behaviors—a resource for addressing problem behaviors, including substance abuse and suicidal thoughts, via behavioral and mental health interventions and alternatives to suspension—and has provided training and support for all schools to implement these tools.
- The Special Education department developed a report on the principal's dashboard that provides real-time discipline data for all students, and particularly students with disabilities to ensure that they are not disproportionately disciplined relative to their non-disabled peers.
