PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OPPORTUNITIES

As part of the Effective Teacher Pipeline, you are expected to participate in professional development opportunities above and beyond those of HISD teachers, or even Apollo 20 HISD teachers. The purpose is to better equip you with the skills you'll need to meaningfully contribute to the turn-around efforts for your entire campus, not just your classroom. Options available to you through ETP have been carefully selected for alignment with this end goal.

Each event or course listed in the following pages has assigned credits. ETP members must earn 12 credits by June 1, 2012 to be eligible for the 2011-2012 stipend. We will track your credits and recommend you do the same to ensure you meet the June 1 deadline. Networking hours will take place throughout the school year and is another opportunity to earn credits. Please refer to the FAQ if you have questions regarding the credits. In addition to the following suggested courses, we plan to bring in consultants for large group workshops. Credits will be assigned to the workshops as they are planned.

BOOK GROUPS

Book groups can choose to meet face-to-face or utilize an online discussion board and will be led by an ETP member. The book group leader is responsible for organizing a schedule for the group to adhere to. (e.g. The book group is going to last from Nov. 1 through Dec. 31 and will use an online discussion board to facilitate discussion. The group will meet in person by Dec. 31 to wrap up the book and debrief.) The purpose of a schedule is to create a clear understanding of group expectations ahead of time. If the selection is approved, Sara will order the books and ship them out to participants.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT FAQS

WHAT ARE CREDITS?

Credits are way for you to plan your professional development opportunities throughout the year. Your goal is to earn 12 credits by June 1, 2012.

WHAT ARE CEUS?

Continuing education units. CEUs track participation in non-credit continuing education. We will not be tracking CEUs.

I'M CURRENTLY ENROLLED IN COURSES AT A COLLEGE. DO THOSE CLASSES COUNT TOWARDS THE CREDITS?

The grant funding ETP stipulates that participants must engage in professional development to bolster their skills as a leader on his or her campus beyond what would be offered at the campus level. Therefore, we cannot grant credit for courses taken that do not align with the goals of the grant. All courses or workshops you engage for ETP must be approved prior to the course to verify that credit will be received.

What if I don't see any courses I'm interested in or a course I want to take is not offered?

Our goal is to offer a variety of courses throughout the year with your interests and preferences in mind. Courses can be offered in a number of ways including face-to-face, professionally lead webinars, podcasts, book groups, etc. If no classes appeal to you, we encourage you to share this with us and suggest topics and events that you think would be beneficial. Not all courses will be appropriate and are subject to approval.
