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# Important Information & FAQs

**Website and Resources:** Visit our website (<https://www.houstonisd.org/Page/59378>) for tournament info, results, and resources.

**Registration with UIL:** UIL Coordinators must register annually with the UIL by [using this link](#).

**Beginning of Year Orientation Meetings:** Schools must send at least one representative to a Beginning of Year meeting. Multiple times are offered early in the school year to fit various schedules.

**SpeechWire:** SpeechWire is the online platform for tournament registration and management. Create an account if your school doesn't have one. Reach out to the UIL Specialist for assistance, and find helpful resources on the HISD UIL website.

**Compensation for Coordinators:** Compensation for serving as a UIL Coordinator is determined at the school level and should align with [district guidelines](#). Please consult your principal for details. CPR/First Aid certification may be required.

**First Aid-CPR-AED Guidelines:** Familiarize yourself with Chapter 33 of the Texas Education Code, section 33.086 and HISD's CPR/AED guidelines. Each primary UIL Coordinator must be certified in first aid and CPR, with employees designated for training by their principal.

**Bus Usage:** Buses must be ordered at least 10 business days in advance. Schools that purchased a UIL package with transportation must follow the protocols as outlined below:

- All bus trips must be under 10 hours in length.
- Manage bus trips within the allocated limits specified by the school's UIL package. Each school receives a designated number of bus trips corresponding to the number of tournaments included in their package.

**Required Forms:** To adhere to HISD protocols, the following forms are necessary:

- **UIL Professional Acknowledgement Form:** Annual completion for each UIL Coordinator.
- **Student Eligibility Form:** Required for each tournament; must be submitted before students compete. Students must be listed, and the form signed by a school administrator such as a principal or assistant principal. Schools are responsible for following Texas Education Agency eligibility guidelines.
- **Extracurricular Code of Conduct Form:** Mandatory for all student UIL participants. Schools retain completed forms.

**Parent Engagement and Participation:** Parents are pivotal to the success of UIL participants.

- **Guidelines for Parent/Guardian Attendance at Events:** Students may attend events with parents/guardians. Schools must comply with district policies for on-campus adult presence. All attendees, including parents/guardians, must follow HISD protocols. Verification of parental eligibility is the school's responsibility.
- **Parent-Run Programs:** Parent-led programs require on-site school employee presence during UIL tournaments. This requirement helps maintain the safety and oversight necessary for student involvement. Moreover, certain resources intended for Coordinators are exclusively accessible to those with an HISD email account. Therefore, collaboration between parent organizers and school staff is pivotal.

**Sweepstakes:** Results are posted after each meet, including Sweepstakes. Physical awards are not given for this category. This recognition primarily serves as a measure of performance.

**The Judge Pool:** Our judging pool is diverse, with experienced educators, professionals, college students, alumni, parents, and high school volunteers. This mix ensures comprehensive evaluations, minimizing biases. Their expertise upholds event integrity and creates positive experiences for all participants.

**Modern Oratory (MO) /Oral Reading (OR) Feasibility Test:** Last year (2023-2024), we conducted MO and OR in-person as a pilot program. While the pilot was successful, it did place a significant strain on resources. This pilot program will continue, with the understanding that if in-person execution becomes overly demanding, we reserve the right to revert to a virtual format.

**Event Calendar:** We aim to minimize conflicts with other departmental activities. Dates are fixed but may change due to extreme weather, with rescheduling attempts made if possible.

**Note:** Meets 1-4 are invitationals, offering open registration where schools choose which students to send, often using these meets to determine participants for the district meets. Meets 5-6 are district meets, also featuring open registration. Schools should keep in mind that district meets count toward the total number of meets in their UIL package.

**Featuring MS Debate:** UIL Academics offers a MS debate program, which will host 3 tournaments this year. These tournaments will coincide with some UIL meets, as indicated above. Please note that the debate program is not part of the UIL A+ package, and schools interested in participating must sign-up separately. Since debate is an all-day event, students involved in debate will not be able to compete in UIL A+ events on the same day.

Six meets are categorized into two types: Type A and Type B. Type A meets include about half of the contests, while Type B meets cover the other half. Consequently, most contests are offered three times each school year.

**Contest & Meet Guidelines**

1. All coordinators must attend the beginning of the year Informational Meeting.
2. Virtual informational meeting for coordinators, coaches, and parents on the day registration opens for all invitational meets. Informational will review contest rules and resources.
3. Meet registration is open for 2 weeks (14 calendar days) on [www.speechwire.com](http://www.speechwire.com)
  - Registration cannot be extended beyond the deadline. *See the Quick Reference for dates.*
  - There is NOT a waitlist during registration. *See Contests, Entries, & Divisions for more information.*
  - Due to holidays/recess periods, Meet 2, Meet 3, and Meet 5 have altered registration timelines.
4. Contestants are not allowed to compete a grade level down.
5. Contestants are allowed to compete up one-grade level excluding 5<sup>th</sup>-grade contestants.
  - 5<sup>th</sup> graders cannot compete in the Middle School (6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, or 8<sup>th</sup> grade) Divisions.
6. **Substitutions, add-ons, or changes are not allowed on the day of the meet.**
7. District meets are open invitationals. Schools decide qualification procedures on their own.
8. Contestants can only compete in one event per round.
  - **NO CROSS ENTRIES!!**
  - **Contestants can only compete in one contest per round at the district meet.**
9. Contestants must have their own supplies/materials to successfully compete at the meet.
10. UIL does not provide any supplies or have access to a printer, dictionary, atlas, calculator, etc.
11. UIL Meet doors open at 7:30 AM.
12. Contestants must check in with their Campus Coordinator 30 minutes before their contest start time.
13. Contestants should make their way to their contest room 15 minutes before the start time.
14. Contests will start on time.
  - No contestant is allowed to enter a contest room after the start time. No exceptions.
15. Contestants only are allowed inside the contest room, excluding speaking events.
16. Speaking Events (*Impromptu, Oral Reading, Modern Oratory, Storytelling*).
  - Adult-only audience.
  - 2 adults per contestant.
17. UIL does not provide snacks or lunch for contestants.
  - Concessions being sold are not guaranteed.
18. Complimentary lunch is available for up to two coordinators per school.
  - Coordinators' names must be submitted exclusively through SpeechWire, our official event management platform. To ensure a smooth process, it is crucial that coordinators' names are submitted through SpeechWire. Failure to do so will result in food not being ordered for them.
19. Coordinators, coaches, parents, or contestants are not allowed inside the Tab Room unless invited.
20. No awards ceremony or posting of results on the day of the meet.
