TEA ACCOUNTABILITY RATINGS 2007–2008 SCHOOL YEAR October 2008

Introduction

The Texas Education Agency (TEA) Accountability System is a method of evaluating school districts and schools with regard to their performance on certain student indicators, and of assigning an accountability rating based on that evaluation. The TEA Accountability System is based on an improvement model in which districts and campuses must meet either an absolute standard or an improvement standard for each accountability measure. The four possible standard classifications for districts and individual schools are Exemplary, Recognized, Academically Acceptable, or Academically Unacceptable.

The student performance indicators used to determine if absolute standards are met consist of current year spring Texas Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (TAKS), including TAKS-Accommodated, passing rates and dropout or completion rates from the previous year. These indicators provide 35 possible performance variables that are employed to assess each campus and the district as a whole. The performance of all students and of the student groups of African American, Hispanic, White, and Economically Disadvantaged are employed in the process of assigning accountability ratings. These ratings are based on the lowest performance of any of the 35 possible measures. For schools and districts that exhibit Academically Acceptable and Academically Unacceptable performance on any of the yearly standards, it is possible to achieve the next higher level of accountability by meeting the required improvement component of the system. The TEA Accountability System Research Brief, available from the Houston Independent School District Department of Research and Accountability, describes the accountability model for the 2007–2008 school year.

From 1993 to 2002, the state’s accountability system rated schools based on the results from the Texas Assessment of Academic Skills (TAAS) and the annual dropout rate for grades 7–12. In 2004 with the change in the state criterion-referenced test to the TAKS, the TEA accountability system was significantly redesigned. The 2008 TEA Accountability System represents the fifth year of this revised system. **Table 1** presents the key facets of the TEA Accountability System for 2008. For comparison of the previous model to the redesigned model in 2004, see the TEA Accountability Ratings 2003–04 School Year Final Report (HISD, 2004).

Modifications made from the 2007 accountability system to 2008 include the Academically Acceptable passing rates for reading/English language arts increasing from 65% to 70%; the passing rate for math increased from 45% to 50%; and the passing rate for science increased from 40% to 45%. **The Commissioner of Education has ruled that the School Leaver Provision will be extended in 2008 and applied to the 2008 accountability ratings, such that the leaver indicators (Dropout and Completion rate), either alone or in combination, cannot be the sole cause for a lowered campus or district rating.** Campuses that avoid being rated Academically Unacceptable due to SLP will be subject to technical assistance team intervention requirements.

Findings

The results from the TEA 2008 Accountability Rating System analysis of the Houston Independent School District's (HISD) indicators are presented. Comparison tables provide a summary of the TEA ratings for HISD schools for 15 years, 1993 through 2002, 2004 through 2008; the 2008 TEA ratings of HISD schools by academic level; and a summary of the 2008 TEA ratings by regions. Also provided is a table of schools that were rated Academically Unacceptable and the reasons for that rating.

This report supersedes the **TEA Accountability Ratings 2007–2008 Report produced in August 2008**. This revision reflects the results of appeals submitted to the state regarding the ratings of several schools. Specifically, appeals were submitted to TEA for the four schools listed in **Table 2**. The appeal submitted for C. Martinez Elementary School was granted by TEA.

Tables detailing school-level results are provided. These tables are organized by region and provide both the 2007 and the 2008 TEA ratings together with the indicators and the relevant student groups, which determined each school's 2008 TEA rating. A listing of schools not rated for the 2007–2008 school year is included in this report.

District-Level Rating

TEA rated HISD as Academically Acceptable for 2008. The district is rated Academically Acceptable because of the performance of all students and African American, Hispanic, and Economically Disadvantaged students on the TAKS science test, and African American and Economically Disadvantaged students on the TAKS math test. **Tables 2** and **3** show the count of district schools by rating categories. As the accountability system was significantly redesigned in 2004, the ratings are shown separately for the two systems.

- In 2002, at the end of the previous TEA Accountability System that was based on TAAS passing rates and dropout rates, HISD had 63 Exemplary schools and 106 Recognized schools.
- When the original TEA Accountability System was first implemented in 1993, HISD had no schools receiving Exemplary status, only four schools rated as Recognized, and 55 rated as Low-Performing. For the first year of the new TEA Accountability System, HISD had 9 Exemplary schools, 69 Recognized schools, and 14 Academically Unacceptable schools. These results indicated that HISD had a much more academically sound baseline under this new system than it did under the original TEA Accountability System.
- From 2007 to 2008, the state raised the acceptable standards on the accountability system. The number of Exemplary schools increased from 15 to 38, and the number of Recognized schools increased from 69 to 119, while the number of Academically Unacceptable schools remained the same at 13.
- Ninety-six HISD campuses were rated as Academically Acceptable schools in 2008 under the TEA Standard Accountability System.
- There were 10 alternative schools that were rated in 2008 under the Alternative Education Accountability (AEA) system; eight of which were rated as AEA Academically Acceptable and two were rated as AEA Academically Unacceptable.

- Approximately 98% of the elementary schools were rated Academically Acceptable or better. The percentage of elementary schools that were rated Exemplary or Recognized under the 2008 TEA Accountability System was 73%.
- For HISD middle schools, 94% received an Academically Acceptable rating or better. Thirteen HISD middle schools, or 27%, were rated as Exemplary or Recognized in 2008.
- For HISD high schools, 82% received an Academically Acceptable rating or better. Five HISD high schools were rated as Exemplary, and four were rated as Recognized in 2008.

HISD Regions

- The number of schools rated in each region varied greatly. The range was from 16 schools from the Alternative\Charter Office to 64 from the West Region (see **Table 5**).
- All six regions had at least two schools attain an Exemplary rating. The West and Central regions had the highest numbers with 11 and 10 schools receiving an Exemplary rating, respectively.
- The Central and East Regions had no schools rated as Academically Unacceptable while the South and West Regions had the most schools performing at the Academically Unacceptable level of the standard accountability, with four each.

Exemplary Schools

- As a result of the application of the TEA Standard Accountability System, 38 schools, including 28 elementary schools, five middle schools, and five high schools were rated Exemplary for the 2007–2008 school year (see **Table 6**).
- Horn Elementary School, Energized for Excellence Middle School, and East Early

College High School have received the Exemplary rating for two consecutive years. Four elementary schools and one high school have been rated as Exemplary for three consecutive years: Bush, Condit, Cornelius, Kolter, and Carnegie Vanguard. Lyons, River Oaks, and T.H. Rogers Elementary Schools have been rated Exemplary for four consecutive years, and West University Elementary School and DeBakey High School for Health Professions have received the Exemplary rating for five consecutive years.

Academically Unacceptable Schools

- As a result of the application of the TEA Standard Accountability System, 13 schools were rated as Academically Unacceptable for 2008 (see **Table 7**).
- Based on a duplicated count, nine schools were rated Academically Unacceptable because of student group performance on the math TAKS, eight received the same rating due to student group performance on the reading and on the science TAKS, two were rated Academically Unacceptable due to student group performance on the writing TAKS, and one received the same rating due to student group performance on the social studies TAKS.
- Four schools received the Academically Unacceptable rating due to student performance on one TAKS subject, four schools received the same rating due to performance on two TAKS subjects, four schools received the same rating due to student performance on three TAKS subtests, and one additional school received an Academically Unacceptable rating due to TAKS scores on four subjects tested.
- No schools were rated as Academically Unacceptable in 2008 for completion or dropout indicators due to the extension of the School Leaver Provision described on page two.

- There were an additional two alternative schools, New Aspirations and Leader’s Academy, rated as Academically Unacceptable under the Alternative Education Accountability System.
- One school, Pleasant Hill Elementary School, was rated as Academically Unacceptable for two consecutive years, E.O. Smith Elementary School was rated Academically Unacceptable for three consecutive years, and Sam Houston High School was rated Academically Unacceptable for the sixth consecutive year.
