Data Integrity

 In no case should paraprofessional personnel be responsible for determining students coding information for attendance, program placement or special services.

Consequences for inaccurate records:

- Lowering of HISD's accountability record
- Lowering of a school's accountability rating
- Loss of funds to HISD which could impact jobs, salaries, and programs for students
- Students may be retained inappropriately
- Reprimands from the state

Responsibilities

PEIMS Coordinator

- Coordinate all activities relating to PEIMS, including collaborating with other campus personnel
- Keep principal informed
- Receive PEIMS related information and disseminate to appropriate staff
- Verify all campus data and submit corrections to Student Information Representative (SIR)/clerk
- Complete training offered by Federal & State Compliance
- Provide training and support to appropriate campus personnel
- Compile, maintain, and file all physical data in appropriate folders, computerized reports, records, and other documents required

SIR/Data Clerk

- Enter data as directed by campus administrators
- Correct errors from the OnDataSuite (ODS) site
- Keep principal and PEIMS Coordinator informed
- Deliver reports to campus PEIMS coordinator
- Complete training offered by Federal & State Compliance
- Assist in dissemination of PEIMS related information
- Compile and maintain all physical and computerized reports, records, and other documents as directed by the principal or PEIMS Coordinator
- Attendance clerks, data entry clerks and SIR's play an essential role in HISD's efforts to ensure that all data is timely, accurate and properly documented.
- In no case should paraprofessional personnel be responsible for determining students coding information for attendance, program placement or special services.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA)

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) (20 U.S.C. § 1232g; 34 CFR Part 99) is a Federal law that protects the privacy of student education records. The law applies to all schools that receive funds under an applicable program of the U.S. Department of Education.

Generally, schools must have written permission from the parent or eligible student in order to release any information from a student's education record. However, FERPA allows schools to disclose those records, without consent, to the following parties or under the following conditions (34 CFR § 99.31):

- School officials with legitimate educational interest;
- Other schools to which a student is transferring;
- Specified officials for audit or evaluation purposes;
- Appropriate parties in connection with financial aid to a student;
- Organizations conducting certain studies for or on behalf of the school;

- Accrediting organizations;
- To comply with a judicial order or lawfully issued subpoena;
- Appropriate officials in cases of health and safety emergencies; and
- State and local authorities, within a juvenile justice system, pursuant to specific State law.

Texas Student Data Systems (TSDS)

The Texas Student Data System (TSDS) is a statewide system for collecting and reporting education data for publicly funded schools in the State of Texas. Replacing and expanding on the existing legacy system, TSDS offers an easier way to collect and manage data – saving schools time and money, while empowering educators with more valuable data to provide students a brighter future.

TWEDS Texas Web-Enabled Data Standards – includes all data elements, code tables, business rules, and data validations needed to load local school district education data to TSDS for PEIMS reporting.

Close of School-Start Window & Snapshot Date

The School Start Window begins on the first instructional day and ends the last Friday in September (September 24, 2021).

A student must <u>enroll and attend</u> school <u>during</u> the school start window or be reported as a leaver and possible dropout.

Exception – Seniors who have completed course requirements but who have not graduated due to missing portions of the state exit-level assessment, MAY enroll during the School Start Window with ADA Code (0) if the student received a service through HISD. The date of enrollment should reflect the date the student received the service from a professional school staff member.

Snapshot Date

PEIMS Fall Submission: Represents the state of the LEA as of the PEIMS Fall snapshot date, which is the last Friday in October (October 28, 2021), whether or not this is a day of instruction. LEAs shall report all students served and staff employed on that date.


Exception: Leaver data are reported based on leaver status as of the last Friday in September. ESCs and LEAs shall report current school year budget data.




District PEIMS Process Chart

Campus PEIMS Process and Responsibilities

Campus PEIMS data entry responsibilities

1. Enter data and corrections into HISD Connect within required timelines.


2. OnDataSuite ODS:
Correct errors on TSDS Rules, run ODS reports to review campus data.

3. Understanding File Errors:

- Fatal Errors Indicates a critical error in the data, will not go to PEIMS until fatal errors are corrected.
- **Special Warnings** Indicates a discrepancy in the data that must be scrutinized carefully. In unusual situations, the data is correct (such as a 5-year-old in first grade).
- Warnings Indicates a possible error or inconsistency. A Warning error must be reviewed for data accuracy.

All fatal errors that are identified must be corrected by FSC Timeline, special warning and warning edits must be reviewed for data accuracy.



T-STEM and **ECHS** Data

T-STEM Indicator Code (E1559)

Texas Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (T-STEM) Academies are open-enrollment secondary schools focusing on improving instruction and academic performance in science and mathematics-related subjects and increasing the number of students who study and enter STEM careers.

The T-STEM data will be collected in Submissions 1, 3, and 4.

- Submission 1 Students enrolled in T-STEM on the last Friday in October (Fall Snapshot date) are reported.
- Submission 3 Students enrolled in T-STEM at any point in time during the school year.
- Submission 4 Students enrolled in T-STEM over the summer are reported.

ECHS Indicator Code (E1560)

Indicates whether a student is enrolled in an Early College High School (ECHS) as defined in TAC 102.1091.

Early College High Schools (ECHS) are open-enrollment high schools that allow students least likely to attend college an opportunity receive both a high school diploma and either an associate degree or at least 60 credit hours toward a baccalaureate degree.

The data collection for E1560 will be collected in Submissions 1, 3, and 4.

- Submission 1 Students enrolled in ECHS on the last Friday in October (Fall Snapshot date) are reported.
- Submission 3 Students enrolled in ECHS at any point in time during the school year are reported.

P-Tech and New Tech Data


- For Foster Care Indicator Code 2, the Pre-kindergarten student is enrolling in school for the purpose of participating as an eligible student in a Pre-kindergarten program and eligibility documentation must be provided. At least annually, the Texas DFPS and Child Protective Services will mail verification letters of PK eligibility to the parents and caregivers of eligible children who in turn must provide this verification documentation to the school at enrollment.
- The "foster care" status of students is highly confidential. Foster care status and related information should be handled with the utmost sensitivity and in accordance with all FERPA guidelines. All foster care related documents should be stored under lock and key with other privacy protected records. Providing training for registrars, counselors, and school staff on confidentiality and sensitivity when enrolling students in foster care is highly recommended.

- (A) means individuals who lack a fixed, regular, and adequate nighttime residence [within the meaning of section 11302(a)(1)]; and
- (B) includes
 - (i) children and youths who are sharing the housing of other persons due to loss of housing, economic hardship, or a similar reason; are living in motels, hotels, trailer parks, or camping grounds due to the lack of alternative adequate accommodations; are living in emergency or transitional shelters
 - (ii) children and youths who have a primary nighttime residence that is a public or private place not designed for or ordinarily used as a regular sleeping accommodation for human beings [within the meaning of section 11302(a)(2)(C)]:
 - (iii) children and youths who are living in cars, parks, public spaces, abandoned buildings, substandard housing, bus or train stations, or similar settings; and
 - (iv) migratory children (as such term is defined in section 6399 of title 20) who qualify as homeless for the purposes of this subtitle because the children are living in circumstances described in clauses (i) through (iii).
