Use the following list of terms to help you complete the Bluebonnet summer homework sheets if needed.

Author: the writer of a book, play, story, or other written work.

Author's Purpose: an author's reason for writing a text. (Think PIE)

Expository: type of non-fiction text that provides information about a topic.

First Person: story is told from the narrator's perspective of a character inside the story.

Genre: type of story.

Main Idea: what the story is mostly about.

Narrative: type of text that tells a story, typically with problematic events and it tries to find the resolutions to solve the problem.

Summary: retelling of the main events of a story in a shorter version.

Third Person: story is told from the narrator's perspective of someone outside the story.
