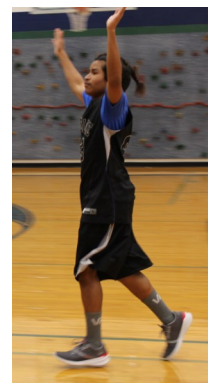

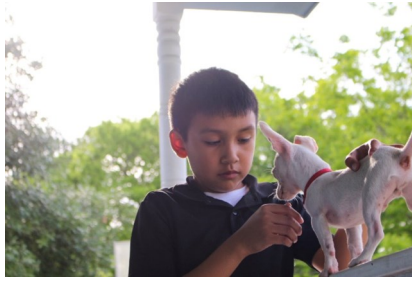


Westside Photography on Display at Museum of Fine Arts

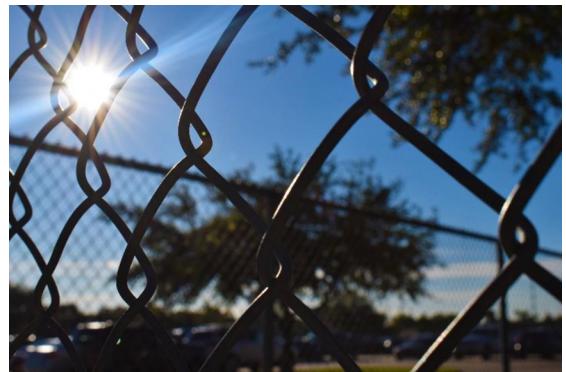

- College Algebra – Score of 4000 on Algebra STAAR
- Students can take the TSIA to qualify. (Directions in packet. They will have to go to HCC to take this assessment. You must register in advance – see Dean Matlock in East 2.)

2. Apply to HCC and receive an HCC ID#

3. Complete all paperwork and submit to Dean Matlock in East 2 by 5/15/20.


