
October 14-16: "All-Flex" Days

Cross Country News




Updates to HISD's Curbside Meal Pick-Ups

This week the food is available from 10 AM-1 PM. Starting next week, the pick up time is from 2-5 PM.

Neighborhood Supersites

HISD is launching two Neighborhood Supersites as part of a weekly community food distribution initiative. Beginning Wednesday, Oct. 14, Nutrition Services will launch Supersites at Barnett Sports Complex and Jones Cowart Stadium. Both will serve as mass community food distribution sites open every Wednesday from 2 to 6 p.m. and offering family food boxes and student meals.





SENIOR DUES

- Senior Dues are **MANDATORY** for all seniors or fourth-year students.
- Every senior is expected to make a one-time payment of **\$70** by Friday, 12/18/20.
- If a student misses that fall deadline, a \$30 late fee will be added. The new one-time payment of **\$100** will be due by the start of Spring Break: Friday, 3/12/21.
- Students do not have the option to select and pay for only individual items from the list below. The total dollar amount is non-negotiable.

What is paid for by Senior Dues?

- 1. Cap and Gown
- 2. Diploma & Diploma Cover
- 3. Awards for Senior Honors Night (medals, cords, and other graduation regalia)
- 4. Graduation Ceremony

Administrative Expenses (COVID-19 preparations, unexpected increases, etc.)

Students who do not pay dues will not receive their cap/gown or a diploma, and they will not be able to attend any graduation ceremonies.






HISD **Free** Pre-Packed Meals for Students
