- 1. You can access your child's STAAR test results in the Student Portal on the Texas Assessment website.
- 2. If you do not have your access code, click on "How do I look up my access code?".
- 3. Enter your child's PEIMS ID (their Social Security number), Date of Birth, and Legal First Name.
- 4. If your child is in the system, the access code will automatically populate. Click "Go to Login".
- 5. Re-enter your child's Date of Birth and Legal First Name.
- 6. Click "Sign On".
- 7. If you have questions, please contact your student's Dean.

Westside's Enviornmental program won a grant from the National Wildlife Federation this fall to restore part of our wetland on Wolf Prairie. 


# Boys Basketball:

# WESTSIDE HIGH SCHOOL 23/24 Cell Phone Policy

From 7:45 AM to 3:25 PM, students are required to stow away their cell phones, earbuds and headphones.

- Students may use their devices during the lunch period only.
- This rule applies throughout the entire school premises.

#### 1st Offense

A warning will be issued to the student, emphasizing the importance of adhering to the policy.

#### 2nd Offense

The student must surrender the device to the teacher.

- The device will then be submitted to the House Secretary and will be returned at the end of the day.
- For incidents in the hallways, students will be directed to take their devices to the House Secretary for safekeeping until the end of the day.

Note: Refusal to surrender the device will result in further disciplinary actions.

#### 3rd Offense

Parents are required to meet with the dean to discuss repeated violations, and to pick up phone.

The meeting allows for a collaborative effort between parents and school staff to address any underlying issues.

- In cases of repeated violations beyond the second incident, the device may be barred from the campus for the remainder of the school year or until the dean deems it appropriate. This measure is taken to ensure a sustained focus on academic engagement.
- We believe that by implementing these measures, we can create an environment that minimizes distractions, promotes active participation in class, and fosters a more focused learning atmosphere.
- This policy is non-negotiable.

#### TSIA2

The Texas Success Initiative Assessment 2.0, better known as the TSIA2, is a series of placement tests for students who plan to enroll in Texas public colleges & universities. These tests help Texas schools determine whether a current high school senior is ready for college-level courses in reading, writing, and math upon their college enrollment.

Students are **not** required to take the TSI if they have met college readiness standards through the SAT or successfully completed a high school college preparatory course. Students are recommended to contact the college they will be attending to see if they need to take the TSI. SAT Score Exemptions are as follows: Evidence-based Reading & Writing: 480 and Math: 530

In the case that a student does not pass one or all parts (reading, writing and math) of the TSI, they will be required to enroll in developmental education classes during their freshman year of college and <u>must pass</u> the course before being able to move onto their additional required college-level courses, such as College Algebra and English Composition. These developmental courses are "Credit/No Credit" only, meaning they do not count towards a student's college GPA, and they are also <u>not</u> covered by financial aid.

To determine if your student will need to take the TSI, have them log into their <u>College Board</u> account to view their SAT scores. If a student is unable to login and/or needs to reset their account, contact College Board Customer Service at 866-756-7346. It is highly recommended that students use their personal email addresses for their account as they will lose access to their HISD email following graduation.

# College Center Announcements for Seniors

#### Financial aid:

FAFSA - While <u>FAFSA</u> traditionally becomes available every October, due to major changes to the application and website, the 2024-2025 FAFSA application will not be made available <u>until December 2023</u>. An official release date has not been confirmed but colleges across the U.S. are aware of this change. However, the College Center is recommending students to still submit by the original priority deadline of January 15<sup>th</sup>, to be safe. A major change to keep out for is that what was previously known as the "Student Aid Report" will now be shown as "FAFSA Submission Summary."

TASFA – The biggest update to share about <u>TASFA</u> this year is that it will now available online! Each student and one parent/guardian will create an account and complete the application online and will have the ability to send their completed online TASFA applications to up 10 schools.

#### **Scholarships:**

HISD has provides students with a list of "Hot Scholarships" that are available to them throughout their senior year. The Hot Scholarship list for October-December is accessible through each student Schoolinks account and be found the by following these steps: Digital Resources > Schoolinks > Finances > Scholarship Matching

#### **Testing:**

SAT for <u>Seniors</u> - There are still several opportunities for seniors to take the SAT and/or ACT this school year! While many schools remain test optional, meaning SAT test scores are not required to be sent as part of the admissions process, a school may still ask for a student's test scores to determine that they are "college ready." To meet this criterion, a student must have scored the following: Evidence-based Reading & Writing: 480 and Math: 530


SAT for <u>Juniors</u> - A major change to the SAT is that starting in March 2024, **all** SAT exams given will be **digital**. Click <u>here</u> to find upcoming test dates for the 2023-2024 academic year. Juniors will take the School Day SAT in March 2024, and are recommended not to test before then as they will not have covered some material yet.

ACT - Click here to find upcoming test dates for the 2023-2024 academic year.


