## AP Testing Starts This Week

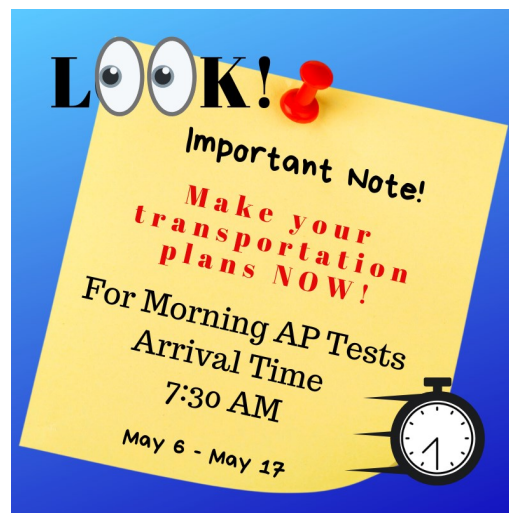
AP Testing begins on Monday, May 6th, and runs for two weeks through May 17th.

### Important Notes for Testers:

- Arrive at 7:30 AM in the Gym for morning tests (please note this is earlier than the usual school start time and students need to make their own arrangements for transportation)
- On STAAR Days, students taking an afternoon test should arrive in the Gym at 11:30 AM
- On non-STAAR Days, students taking an afternoon exam should bring a lunch from home and will be dismissed

from class in time for a quick lunch break before the AP exam begins.

- Leave phones at home or in car

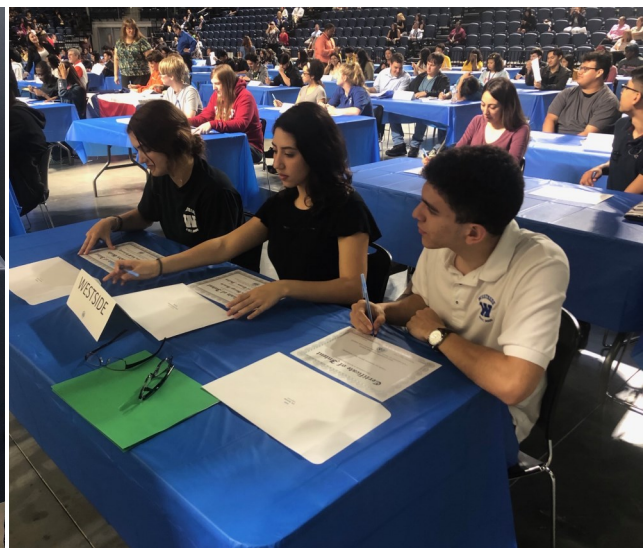

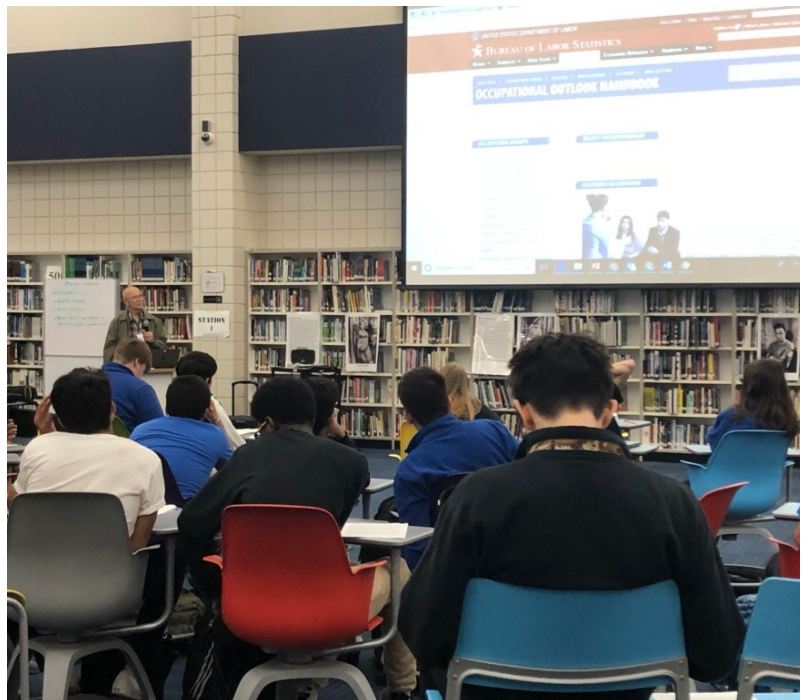


## Guidance Class Guest Speaker

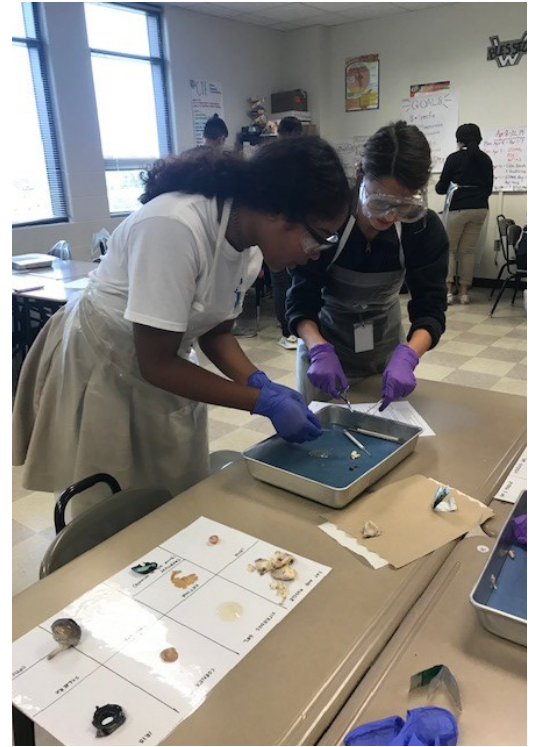

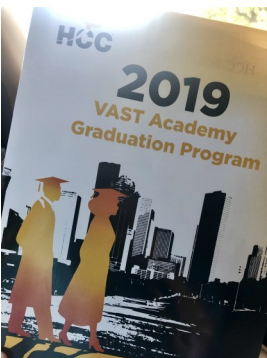
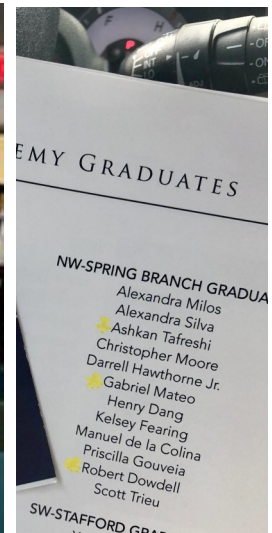


## Former Students Graduate from HCC Vast Academy

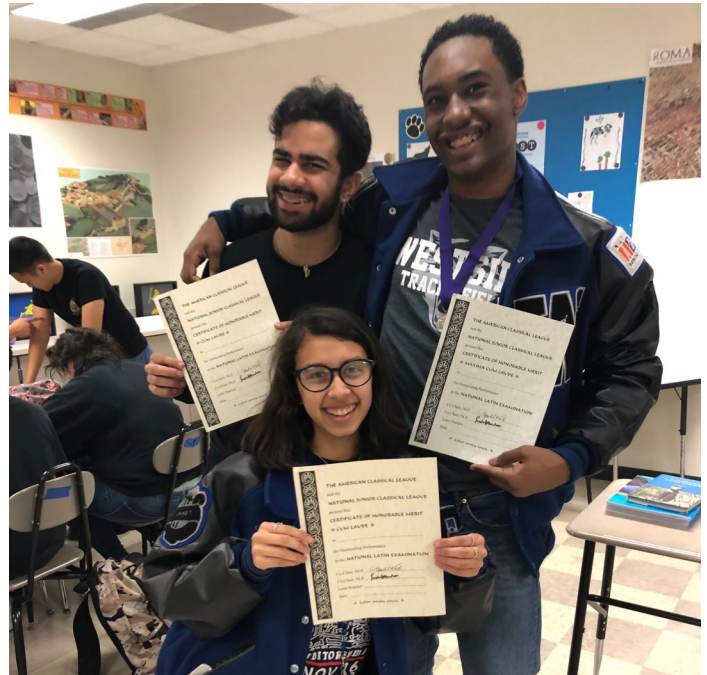

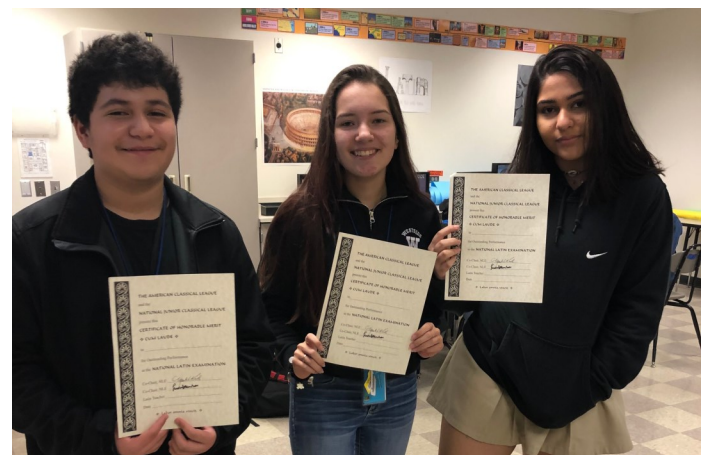

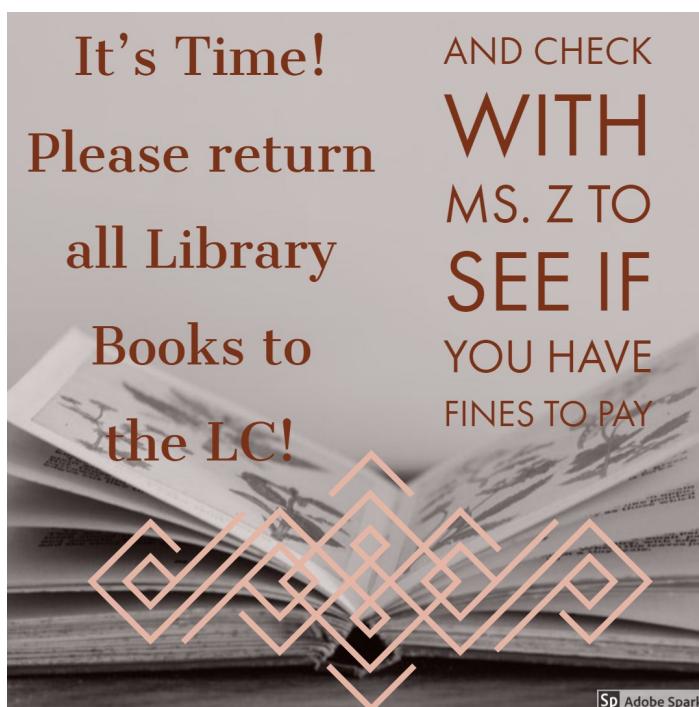
