Professional Learning Institutes

The year-long professional learning and development (PLD) journey for OnRamps Instructors begins with our Summer Professional Learning Institutes (PLI). Instructors collaborate with OnRamps course staff, university faculty, and fellow educators across the state to further their understanding of the OnRamps course curriculum and pedagogy and to deliver an active learning experience that engages, encourages, and challenges their students.



STRUCTURE

The 2023 Summer PLI experience will be held virtually in order to provide the maximum amount of flexibility for Instructors and districts. Instructors will participate in both synchronous sessions and asynchronous modules to collaborate and connect with their peers across the state during the PLI experience.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Who qualifies as a New Instructor?

A: Any teacher implementing a course for the first time, even if they have taught a different OnRamps course before, is considered a New Instructor for that course. If an Instructor previously taught the course but it was not during the prior academic year, they are also considered a New Instructor.

Q: Who qualifies as a Returning Instructor?

A: A teacher implementing the same OnRamps course in the new academic year for the second or more consecutive years. Additionally, teachers who participated in the 2022 Summer PLI but who did not implement for the full year may be eligible to participate as a Returning Instructor.

Q: When can Instructors register for the synchronous portion of their Summer PLI experience?

A: Registration for synchronous sessions will open on Monday, April 3, 2023.

Q: How do Instructors access their PLI content?

A: New Instructors will be enrolled in a Summer PLI course in the Canvas Learning Management System. They will have access to their self-directed modules, drop-in hours, and the synchronous Summer PLI schedule.

Returning Instructors will access their self-directed summer PLI assignments via Instructor Headquarters (HQ) in Canvas.

Q: When will Instructors receive CPE certificates?

A: CPE certificates will be issued at the end of August.

Q: How does OnRamps handle Instructor absences during Summer PLI?

A: Policies regarding Instructor absences can be found in the District Cooperative Agreement and Partner Handbook.

Q: Where can I learn more information about the Summer PLIs?

A: Further information, including PLI registration details, will be available in District HQ under the "Courses and Instructor Experiences" tile. Teachers who have applied and have been approved to be OnRamps Instructors will begin to receive information via email in the spring.
