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

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

A prediction is a quess you make about what is going to happen in a selection or story.

Before READING

- Look at the cover and read the title.
- Think about the characteristics of the genre and the text structure.
- Look at the text features and illustrations.
- Then predict what the text will be about.

During READING

- Stop and think about what you read. Think about the genre characteristics,
- the text features, and the text structure. What do you think will happen next?
- -After READING
- Confirm or adjust your prediction.
- Ask: Was I right?
