SUBJECT: 2021 ENGLISH LEARNER VALEDICTORIANS & SALUTATORIANS

Each spring the Houston Independent School District (HISD) honors the valedictorians and salutatorians at each of its high schools. The valedictorian is a student who has earned the highest grade point average in his or her graduating class, and the salutatorian has the second highest grade point average. As part of its efforts to analyze the effectiveness of the district's programs for English Learners (ELs), the Research and Accountability Department identifies how many of these honorees had previously been in a bilingual or English as a Second Language (ESL) program (or are currently classified as an EL). The attached report summarizes findings concerning the EL history of the valedictorians and salutatorians from the class of 2021.

Key findings include:

- High schools in had a total of 51 valedictorians and 46 salutatorians in the senior class of 2021.
- Of these, 40.2 percent had been EL at some point during their enrollment in HISD. In comparison, the overall percentage of senior students in the district who had been EL at some point was 44.1 percent.
- Both of these values are in line with data from previous years, which show that since 2007 the percentage of valedictorians/salutatorians who have ever been EL is nearly the same as the overall percentage of seniors who have ever been EL (42.2% versus 42.4%).
- Twenty-nine of the valedictorians/salutatorians had started in a bilingual program, and seven had started in an ESL program. Furthermore, three had started out as EL but with a parental waiver.
- A total of six valedictorians/salutatorians had been classified as an immigrant student at some point.


FAST FACTS ENGLISH LEARNER VALEDICTORIANS & SALUTATORIANS CLASS OF 2021

Background Data Class of 2021

This brief report analyzes data concerning valedictorians and salutatorians from the class of 2021, and their English Learner (EL) status.

- High schools in the Houston Independent School District had a total of 51 valedictorians and 46 salutatorians in the senior class of 2021.
- Of these, 40.2% had been EL at some point during their enrollment at HISD (history covering the last 16 school years).
- In comparison, the overall percentage of senior students in the district who had been EL at some point was 44.1%.
- Both of these values are in line with data from previous years (see **Figure 1** below). Since 2007, the percentage of valedictorians/salutatorians who have ever been EL is nearly the same as the overall percentage of seniors who have ever been EL (42.2% versus 42.4%).

Valedictorians: Original EL Program

- **Table 1** (next page) shows summary data for valedictorians from the graduating classes of 2001 through 2021.
- In 2021, 37% of valedictorians (19 students) began enrollment as ELs (history covering 16 school years).
- Fourteen of these students began enrollment in a bilingual program, and three started in an ESL program (two had started as waived).
- None of the valedictorians had been coded as immigrant in the previous 16 years (Public Education Information Management System records).

English Learner Valedictorians & Salutatorians Class of 2021

Comparable data for salutatorians is shown in **Table 2**.

• In 2021, 43% of salutatorians (20 students) began enrollment as ELs.

• Fifteen of these students began enrollment in a bilingual program, four started in an ESL program, and one started out as waived. Six salutatorians had been immigrant students at some point.
