Sandy Hook Promise

HISD is partnering with the nonprofit Sandy Hook Promise to launch an anonymous tip line, Say Something, for students and families in 2019. This program will train students, educators, administrators, and parents/caretakers HOW TO:

- Recognize the signs and signals of at-risk behaviors, especially within social media, of individuals who may be at-risk of hurting themselves or others
- Report at-risk behaviors to a trusted adult, call 911 or anonymously through the Say Something Crisis center phone, app, or website

THE TIP LINE WILL PROVIDE:

- Multilingual operators who provide 24/7 monitoring of all tip submissions
- 24/7 crisis center trained (500 + hours) in suicide intervention and crisis management
- 24/7 crisis center to triage for all calls, app, and web submissions for HISD to identify immediate life safety issues
- Routing of all tips to HISD identified school officials, crisis team, school police and/or local law enforcement

Sandy Hook Promise is a national non-profit committed to creating safe schools and communities through their four evidenced-based Know the Signs intervention programs. To date, SHP has delivered its programs to 7,000 + schools and trained 3.5 million youth and adults in every state. SHP programs have helped stop multiple school shootings, suicides, and gun threats; reduced bullying and cyberbullying; intervened upon cutting, drug use, racial conflicts, and other violent and victimization acts.
