

Attached is the College-Bound Assessment Report for 2012–2013. This report provides an analysis of Houston Independent School District (HISD) performance for college-bound students on the 2012–2013 administrations of the Preliminary SAT (PSAT), the SAT Reasoning Test (SAT), the ACT Assessment (ACT), Advanced Placement (AP) exams, and International Baccalaureate (IB) exams. Results were analyzed by race/ethnicity and gender, and state and national data are also presented for comparison purposes. Although most of this information has been provided earlier in separate reports, this report presents all data for the 2012–2013 school year in one place.

- A total of 31,128 HISD freshmen, sophomores and juniors participated in the fall 2012 PSAT/NMSQT. The percent of freshmen, sophomores and juniors who participated decreased from 85.5 percent in fall 2011 to 82.8 percent in fall 2012.
- For the class of 2013, the number of HISD graduating seniors with SAT results was 9,130, a decrease of 350 students taking the test from the 9,480 students in 2012. The average composite score decreased from 1255 in 2012 to 1252 in 2013.
- The number of HISD graduating seniors in 2013 with ACT test results was 2,010, a decrease of 113 students taking the test from the 2,123 students in 2012. The average composite score remained unchanged at 20.5 from 2012 to 2013.
- For 2012, the number of HISD high school students who participated in AP exams decreased from 13,403 in 2012 to 12,966 in 2013. HISD students who took AP exams in 2013 took a total of 22,693 exams, a decrease of 534 exams from 2012. The percent scoring three or higher in 2013 was 33%, an increase of 2 percentage points compared to 2012.
- In 2013, 610 students in HISD took 1,405 IB exams compared to 499 students in 2012 who took 1,403 IB exams. 70.0 percent of the students scored four or higher in 2013, an increase of 0.4 percentage points compared to 2012. The mean IB exam grade in HISD across all subjects in 2013 was 4.13 compared to the worldwide score of 4.70.

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# COLLEGE-BOUND ASSESSMENT REPORT 2012–2013

## Executive Summary

The annual College-Bound Assessment Report provides a comprehensive overview of the participation and performance results across multiple assessments taken by HISD high school students. Collectively, these assessments not only are a gauge of college-readiness of our high school students but they also provide guidance for improving instructional practices.

Results by ethnicity and gender are presented for each assessment with the exception of the International Baccalaureate, which does not provide results by ethnicity and gender. The results for Texas and the nation are presented for comparison purposes. Campus-level data are included in **Appendix A**.

The results from the following assessments administered in 2012-2013 are reviewed:

- The Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test (PSAT/NMSQT) is a program cosponsored by the College Board and National Merit Scholarship Corporation (NMSC). It is a standardized test that provides firsthand practice for the SAT<sup>®</sup> assessment that measures reasoning skills in critical reading, mathematics, and writing.
- The SAT<sup>®</sup> is a globally recognized college admission test administered by the College Board. The SAT<sup>®</sup> scores in critical reading, mathematics, and writing, together with high school grade-point averages (GPA), are strong predictors of academic success in college.
- The ACT<sup>®</sup> college readiness assessment is a curriculum- and standards-based educational and career planning tool that assesses students' academic readiness for college. It is administered by the ACT, Inc. and encompasses English, mathematics, reading, science, and an optional writing test. ACT's Course Standards and College Readiness Standards™ successfully align with the Common Core State Standards.
- The Advanced Placement (AP<sup>®</sup>) courses and tests are offered by the College Board in possibly 34 subjects in Arts, English, History and Social Science, Math and Computer Science, Sciences, and World Languages and Cultures. Studies indicate that students who take AP courses and exams are more likely to succeed in college. The AP Program enables students to take college-level courses and exams, and to earn college credit or placement while still in high school.
- The International Baccalaureate<sup>®</sup> (IB) is a non-profit educational foundation founded in Geneva, Switzerland in 1968. It offers the IB Diploma Programme that is recognized by over 2,000 institutions worldwide as a significant predictor of success in college. Students must choose one subject from each of five groups (1 to 5), ensuring breadth of knowledge and understanding in their best language, additional language(s), the social sciences, the experimental sciences and mathematics. Students may choose either an arts subject from group 6, or a second subject from groups 1 to 5. The students take written exams at the end of the course in their chosen subjects.

## Highlights of College-Bound Assessments in 2012-2013

### PSAT

- Approximately 31,100 students in grades 9-11 participated in the PSAT in fall 2012 with participation rates of 81.7 percent (grade 9), 86.1 percent (grade 10), 80.6 percent (grade 11), and 82.8 percent in the combined grades 9-11.
- The PSAT composite scores increased for all student groups assessed in grades 9, 10, and 11, with the exception of Asian students in grade 10.
- The percent of students in grades 10-11 who met the PSAT college readiness benchmarks increased from 21.0 in 2011-2012 to 21.4 percent in 2012-2013.

### SAT

- Approximately 9,100 students in the class of 2013 took the SAT in high school with a participation rate of 89.8 percent.
- The composite SAT score for the class of 2013 decreased by 3 points compared to the class of 2012.
- The percent of the class of 2013 who met the college readiness benchmark for the composite SAT score remained unchanged at 17 compared to the class of 2012.

### ACT

- Approximately 2,000 students in the class of 2013 took the ACT in high school with a participation rate of 19.8 percent.
- The ACT composite score for the class of 2013 remained unchanged at 20.5 compared to the class of 2012.
- The percent of students in the class of 2013 who met the ACT benchmarks in English, mathematics, reading, and science increased to 26, an increase of 1 percentage point compared to the class of 2012.

### AP

- Approximately 13,000 students in 2013 took an average of 1.75 AP exams each.
- Thirty-three percent of the AP exams taken by HISD students in 2013 earned a score of 3 or higher compared to 31 percent in 2012.

### IB

- Approximately 600 students in Bellaire HS and Lamar HS with a participation rate of 43.3 percent (based on the enrollment in IB-sanctioned programs) in 2013 took an average of 2.3 IB exams each.
- Seventy percent of the IB exams taken in 2013 indicated a score of 4 or higher compared to 69.6 percent in 2012.

## PSAT

### Introduction

#### Purpose

The Preliminary SAT (PSAT) is a national examination administered in October of each year by the College Board. The PSAT has three parts: critical reading, mathematics, and writing skills.

The PSAT serves as preparation for the SAT Reasoning Test. One of the benefits that students receive is a report assessing their performance on the PSAT with suggestions to improve their skills. Another important benefit is that the PSAT serves as a qualifying examination for numerous scholarship programs that are sponsored by corporations, colleges and universities, and other organizations, including the National Merit scholarships. The National Merit Scholarship Program began in 1955. Of the top 50,000 scorers nationwide, approximately 16,000 students qualify yearly as semifinalists for the National Merit Scholarship.

In addition to the National Merit Scholarship finalists, other specific recognition is bestowed to high-scoring Hispanic students through the National Hispanic Scholar Program, and to high scoring African American students through the National Scholarship Service and Fund for Negro Students which provides a National Achievement Scholarship to qualified students.

The College Search Service, which is operated by the Educational Testing Service, represents another important benefit for students who take the PSAT. For the fall 2012 administration, 73.4 percent of freshmen, 74.4 percent of sophomores, and 80.7 percent of juniors taking the PSAT/NMSQT registered to participate in this search service, by which colleges and universities obtain names and addresses of tested students who meet specific parameters set forth by the colleges, such as geographic location, areas of major interest, and test score range. The colleges then directly contact the students with recruitment information and materials. As a result, the PSAT has come to serve as a vehicle for bringing prospective students to the attention of colleges and universities.

In the fall of 2003, HISD implemented the PSAT Initiative. Through the HISD Foundation, funds were secured to enable the district to fund this proactive initiative by offering the PSAT to all tenth-grade students attending HISD schools in the fall of 2003. This initiative is designed to provide schools with information about sophomores' academic strengths and interests and to aid the district in identifying students with the aptitude for Advance Placement (AP) courses. This initiative also assists the district in preparing students for college entrance exams and enables students to realize the possibilities of continuing their academic careers after high school. In the fall of 2010, HISD introduced an initiative to provide free PSAT testing for all freshmen.

The College Board (2006, Report No. 2006-1) reports that the PSAT can be utilized to identify students who may be successful in AP courses. Previously, teacher recommendations, self-nomination, previous courses completed, grades in course work, and scores on achievement tests have been successfully used to identify those students that can complete and excel in AP courses. However, this system does not identify all students who could benefit from taking AP courses. The PSAT provides another method of identifying students that can profit academically from enrollment in AP courses. The College Board suggests that teachers and

counselors may use expectancy tables, based on PSAT subject area scores and with standards specific to 34 different AP examinations, as an additional predictor of the likelihood of success on AP exams. Schools may elect to use the expectancy tables and AP Potential, which is provided to all schools that administer the PSAT.

### Administration and Scoring

The PSAT/NMSQT is a two-hour and ten-minute test. The reading questions are presented in two 25-minute sections. The mathematics questions are also presented in two 25-minute sections for a total of 100 minutes. For the writing section, a total of 30 minutes is allotted for completion. High schools administered the PSAT/NMSQT on their campuses on Wednesday, October 17, 2012. Three scaled scores are generated for each student: a reading score, a mathematics score, and a writing score. Each score ranges from 20 to 80; these numbers are analogous to the scaled scores of 200 to 800 generated by the SAT. Nationally, the average reading, mathematics, and writing scores are nearing the midpoint (50) of the 20 to 80 scale.

## Results

### Districtwide Performance

**Table 1** shows the districtwide participation and performance of HISD students in grades 9-11 who took the PSAT assessments in fall 2011 and 2012.

**Table 1** indicates the following:

- A total of 31,128 students participated in the fall 2012 PSAT/NMSQT compared to 32,106 in 2011, representing a decrease of 978 students. The number of students tested in 2012 decreased by 320 in grade 9, by 248 in grade 10, and by 410 in grade 11.
- The PSAT mean scores of students in grades 9-11 improved in all three sections of the PSAT in 2012 compared to 2011.

### Race/Ethnicity and Gender

A demographic comparison of the PSAT participation and mean scores of HISD students in grades 9, 10, 11, and combined grades 9-11 is presented for 2011 and 2012. The PSAT mean scores for the African American, Asian American, Hispanic, White students are shown in **Tables 2a**, and the gender data is shown in **Table 2b**.

**Table 2a** indicates the following:

- Asian students outscored other ethnic groups in grade 9 in all three sections of the PSAT in 2012.
- In grade 10, White students outscored other ethnic groups in reading and writing while Asian students earned the highest score in mathematics in 2012.
- In grade 11, Asian students outscored other ethnic groups in reading and mathematics, and White students outscored other ethnic groups in writing in 2012.
- African American students improved their performance in 2012 compared to 2011 in all sections in grades 9-11 with the exception of mathematics in grade 11 where the mean score was unchanged.
- Hispanic students improved their performance in 2012 compared to 2011 in all subjects in grades 9-11 with the exception of mathematics in grade 10 where the mean score was unchanged.

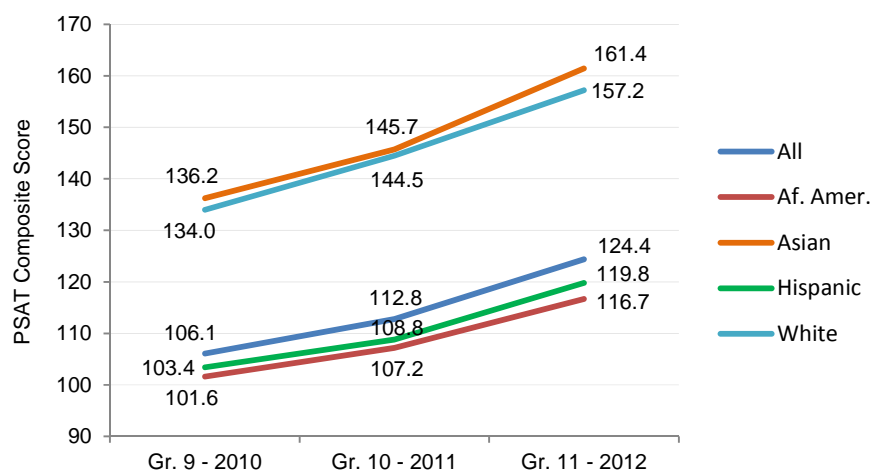
**Table 2b** indicates the following:

- Both female and male students showed improvements in their PSAT scores in 2012 compared to 2011 in grades 9-11 in all sections with the exception of the mathematics scores of male students in grade 11 where the mean score remained unchanged.
- Female students outscored male students in reading and writing in 2012 while their mathematics scores lagged in grades 9-11.

### Longitudinal Progression by Ethnicity

**Figure 1** shows the longitudinal progression of the PSAT composite scores (reading, mathematics, and writing combined) from grade 9 in 2010 to grade 10 in 2011 and to grade 11 in 2012 for all students and for the various ethnic groups in HISD.

**Figure 1. Longitudinal Progression of PSAT Composite Scores in HISD by Ethnicity: Grade 9 in 2010 to Grade 11 in 2012**



**Figure 1** indicates the following:

- The African American and Hispanic students started in grade 9 with PSAT composite scores that were more than 30 points below those for the Asian and White students in 2010.
- The average rates of growth in the PSAT composite scores from grade 9 to grade 11 by ethnicity are
  - 15.1 points for African American students
  - 25.2 points for Asian students
  - 16.4 points for Hispanic students
  - 23.2 points for White students
- As a consequence of the lower growth rates in the PSAT composite scores of the African American and Hispanic students compared to White students, the White-African American gap of 32.4 points in grade 9 (2010) increased to 40.5 points in grade 11 (2012), and the White-Hispanic gap increased from 30.6 in grade 9 (2010) to 37.4 points in grade 11 (2012).
- The Asian and White students in Grade 9 (2010) outscored the African American and Hispanic students in Grade 11 (2012) by 14.2 to 19.5 points.
- Notably, the mean PSAT composite scores of the Asian students (144.7) and White students (144.5) in grade 10 (2011) exceeded the College Readiness benchmark score of 142 as well as the national mean of 142.8 in grade 11 (2012).
- The mean composite scores of Asian students in grade 11 (2012) exceeded the College Readiness benchmark of 142 by 19.4 points, and by 15.2 points for White students..
- The mean composite scores of the African American students in grade 11 (2012) fell short of the College Readiness benchmark of 142 by 25.3 points; the mean composite score of the Hispanic students was 20.2 points below the College Readiness benchmark.

### Gap Analysis

The PSAT mean scores for the reading, mathematics, and writing sections in 2011 and 2012 were also examined to determine the achievement gap between Hispanic and African American student groups and their White counterparts. The districtwide differences in mean scores were calculated for grades 9, 10, 11, and the combined grades 9-11. These results are presented in **Table 3**.

**Table 3** indicates the following:

- In 2012, the largest achievement gap in grade 9 was between White and Hispanic students in reading at 9.6 points.

- In 2012, the largest achievement gap in grade 10 was between White and Hispanic students in reading at 12.3 points.
- In 2012, the largest achievement gap in grade 11 was between White and African American in writing at 13.6 points.
- From 2011 to 2012, the PSAT achievement gaps decreased in all grades for both comparison groups in reading and mathematics.
- From 2011 to 2012, the PSAT achievement gaps increased in all grades for both comparison groups in writing except for the gap between African American and White students that showed a slight decrease.
- Large gaps in the PSAT scores in both comparison groups, ranging from 8.2 to 13.6 points, persist in spite of the progress shown particularly in reading and mathematics across all grades.

### HISD, Texas, and Nation

A comparison of the PSAT mean scores in reading, mathematics and writing in HISD, Texas, and the nation in grades 9, 10, and 11 is shown in **Table 4a**.

**Table 4a** indicates the following:

- The PSAT mean scores in HISD showed larger increases from 2011 to 2012 in reading and writing in grades 9, 10, and 11 compared to the state and the nation except for writing in grade 10 where the increases in HISD and the state were identical, and in grade 9 where the increase in the writing score in the nation exceeded that of the district.
- The increases in the PSAT mean scores from 2011 to 2012 in mathematics in HISD were at or above those in the state and below those in the nation in all grades.

**Table 4b** shows the gaps between HISD and the state, and between HISD and the nation in 2011 and 2012.

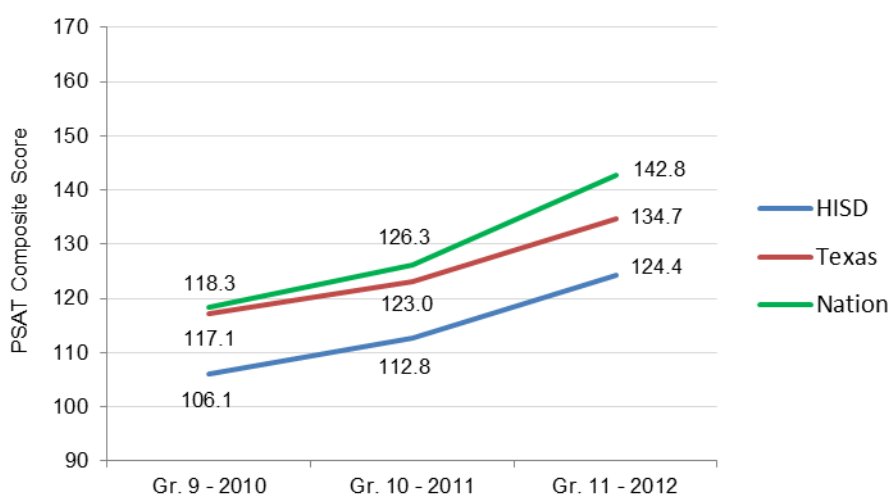
**Table 4b** indicates the following:

- The HISD-Texas gaps decreased in all grades and subjects with the exception of mathematics in grade 10 where the gap remained unchanged from 2011 to 2012.
- The HISD-Nation gaps decreased in all grades and subjects with the exception of mathematics in grade 9 where the gap increased from 2011 to 2012.

### Longitudinal Progression: HISD, Texas, and Nation

**Figure 2** shows the longitudinal progression of the PSAT composite scores (reading, mathematics, and writing combined) from grade 9 in 2010 to grade 11 in 2012 for all students in HISD, Texas, and the Nation.

**Figure 2** indicates the following:

- The progression of the PSAT composite scores from grade 9 in 2010 to grade 11 in 2012 was 18.3 points in HISD compared to 17.6 points in the state, and 24.5 points in the nation.
- The HISD-Texas gap in the PSAT composite scores decreased from 11 points in grade 9 (2010) to 10.3 points in grade 11 (2012).
- The HISD-Nation gap in the PSAT composite scores increased from 12.2 points in grade 9 (2010) to 18.4 points in grade 11 (2012).

### PSAT College Readiness Benchmarks

The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is the score on each section that a student should meet or exceed to be considered on track to be college ready. Separate benchmarks are provided for grades 10 and 11.

The College Readiness Benchmark has been added to PSAT/NMSQT reporting to help educators have a better understanding of how many and also which students are on track to have the skills necessary for success in college. Equipped with this information, educators can support students who need extra help while there is still time for improvement.

The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is part of a series of indicators that help educators gauge college readiness at different points in a student's career. It was developed based on the SAT College Readiness Index, which was computed as part of an SAT validity study. The PSAT/NMSQT College Readiness Benchmark is also aligned to a ReadStep indicator that was available beginning in spring 2011. The PSAT benchmarks are provided for each section and for the composite scores in reading, mathematics, and writing.

Prior to 2012, the benchmark for grade 10 was the score associated with a 65 percent likelihood of meeting the benchmark in grade 11; the benchmark for grade 11 was the score associated with a 65 percent likelihood of meeting the SAT benchmark.

Starting in 2012, the methodology for calculating the PSAT/NMSQT benchmarks changed so that it parallels the calculation for SAT college readiness benchmarks. For both grades, the PSAT/NMSQT benchmarks are the scores associated with a 65-percent likelihood of achieving a first year college grade point average (FYGPA) of 2.67 or higher.

The PSAT benchmark in grade 10 has been reduced from 145 in 2010 and 2011 to 133 in 2012; likewise, the PSAT benchmark in grade 11 has been reduced from 152 in 2010 and 2011 to 142 in 2012.

**Table 5a** shows the PSAT/NMSQT college readiness benchmarks for grades 10 and 11 for each section.

**Table 5b** indicates the following:

- The percent of students who met the College Readiness Benchmark in grade 10 based on the 2012 standards increased from 19.9 in 2010 to 20.5 in 2012.
- The percent of students who met the College Readiness Benchmark in grade 11 based on the 2012 standards decreased slightly from 22.6 in 2010 to 22.5 in 2012.
- The percent of students in the combined grades 10 and 11 who met the College Readiness Benchmark based on the 2012 standards increased slightly from 21.1 in 2010 to 21.4 in 2012.

# SAT

## Introduction

### Purpose

The SAT is a college-entrance exam developed by the College Board. The SAT provides a standard by which the skills of students applying for colleges and universities can be compared nationally. Standardized tests are designed to allow college admissions officers to judge all students by a common measuring stick. Standardized test scores compensate for the uncertainty surrounding high school grades, school-to-school differences, grade inflation, and teaching quality, for example. In addition, admissions officers use these scores as a way to predict academic performance in the first year of college. Educational organizations recognize scores on the SAT as useful indicators of college readiness and valid predictors of college success.

### Description

The SAT is designed to measure developed verbal and mathematical reasoning abilities related to successful performance in college. The SAT was redesigned for 2005, and the first administration of the new test was given on March 12, 2005. Changes included the addition of third-year college-preparatory mathematics, more critical reading selections, and a writing section. The SAT is a three-hour and twenty-minute exam. There are nine sections: three in critical reading, three in mathematics, and three in writing, including a twenty-five minute essay.

### Administration

The test is administered seven times per year nationwide. Most students take the SAT at national administrations during their junior and senior years in high school. Colleges use SAT scores to make admission decisions, recruit students, place students in appropriate courses, and predict student performance at the college-level; however, they are intended to supplement student records. Starting with the Spring of 2011, HISD funds a school-day administration of the SAT for all juniors. The class of 2012 was the first graduating class to have the school-day testing opportunity as juniors.

### Scoring

In order to get an SAT raw score, a fraction of the multiple-choice questions answered incorrectly is subtracted from the number answered correctly. If that resulting score is a fraction, it is rounded to the nearest whole number --  $\frac{1}{2}$  or more is rounded up; less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  is rounded down. The raw score is then changed into a scaled score by a statistical process called equating. Equating adjusts for slight differences in difficulty between test editions and ensures that a score on one edition of a test reflects the same ability as a score on another edition and that the score does not depend on how well others did on the same edition. Scores for the critical reading, mathematics, and writing sections range from 200 to 800. A combined score is calculated by adding the section scores together. A 2400 is the highest possible combined score. The critical reading and mathematics sections of the new SAT correspond to the verbal and mathematics sections of the previous version of the SAT.



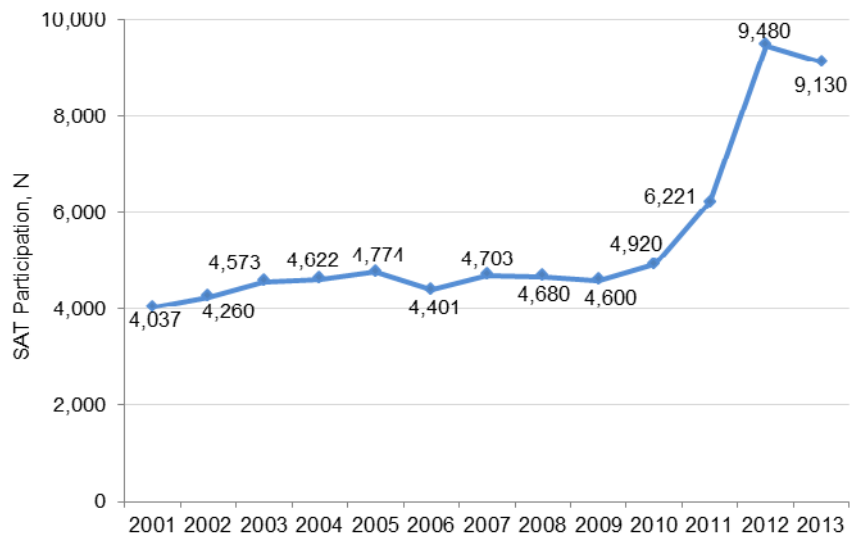
## Participants

The number of graduating seniors in 2013 with SAT results was 9,130, a decrease of 350 compared to the 9,480 students tested in 2012. In 2013, 89.8 percent of seniors were tested compared to 92.3 percent in 2012.

## Districtwide Performance

**Figure 3a** shows districtwide participation, **Figure 3b** shows the SAT composite results, and **Figure 3c** shows the reading, mathematics, and writing scores for the classes of 2001 through 2013.

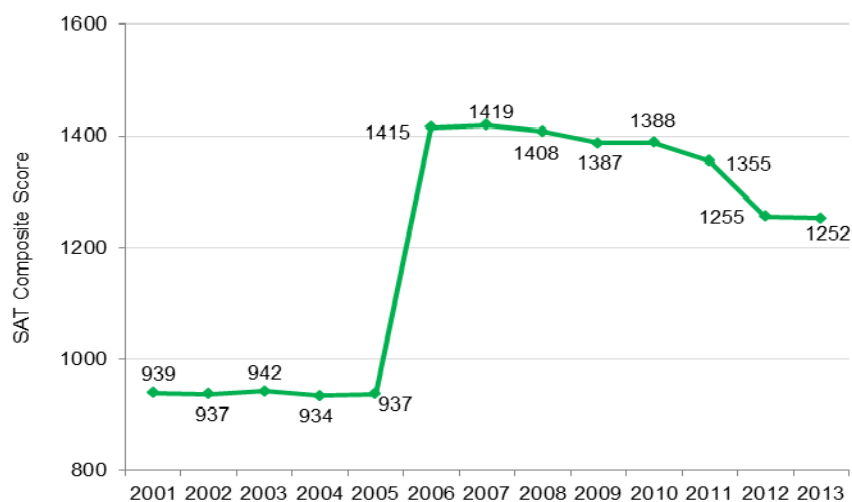
**Figure 3a. SAT Participation in HISD: Class of 2001 to 2013**



**Figure 3a** indicates the following:

- The number of HISD graduating seniors in 2013 with SAT results was 9,130, a decrease of 350 (3.7%) from 2012. However, the participation in 2013 represents an increase of 5,093 (126.2%) compared to 2001.

**Figure 3b. SAT Composite Scores\* in HISD: Class of 2001 to 2013**

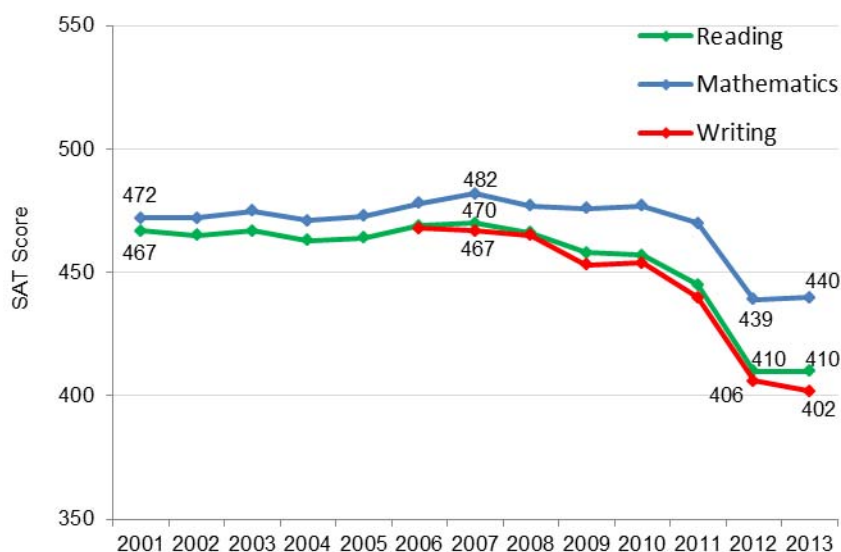


\*Composite scores from 2001-2005 include reading and mathematics; scores from 2006-2013 include reading, mathematics, and the writing subtest.

**Figure 3b** indicates the following:

- The average SAT composite score decreased by 3 points, from 1255 in 2012 to 1252 in 2013.
- The composite score decreased from 1415 in 2006 to 1252 in 2013. This decrease coincided with the increase in the participation from 4,401 to 9,130 (107.5%).

**Figure 3c** indicates the following:

- The reading score remained unchanged, the mathematics score increased by 1 point, and the writing score declined by 4 points from 2012 to 2013.
- The reading score declined by 60 points, the mathematics score declined by 42 points, and the writing score declined by 65 points from 2007 to 2013. These large decreases in the SAT scores coincide with the 94.1 percent increase in participation from 2007 to 2013.

### Race/Ethnicity and Gender

A demographic comparison of SAT participation for the HISD classes of 2012 and 2013 are presented in **Table 6a**. The results are reported for the following subgroups: American Indian, Asian American, African American, Hispanic, White, and other are examined. The College Board provides data for “Puerto Rican,” “Mexican or Mexican American,” and “Other Hispanic, Latino, or Latin American” student groups, and these data are combined for district results for the Hispanic student group. In addition, data for students who did not indicate their race/ethnicity are provided.

**Table 6a** indicates the following:

- The number of students in all ethnic groups in the class of 2013 who took the SAT decreased compared to the class of 2012 with the exception of the American Indian group. The decreases were
  - Asian American students decreased by 32 (7.0%)
  - African American students decreased by 191 (7.2%)
  - Hispanic students decreased by 108 (2.1%)
  - White students decreased by 24 (2.7%)
- Both the number of female and male students tested on the SAT decreased from 2012 to 2013, with the number of female students tested decreasing by 40 (0.8%) and the number of males tested decreasing by 310 (6.7%).

**Table 6b** shows the SAT mean scores in HISD by ethnicity and gender for the class of 2012 and 2013.

**Table 6b** indicate the following changes from 2012 to 2013:

- African American students increased performance by 1 point in critical reading and 2 points in mathematics.
- Hispanic students increased performance by 2 points in both critical reading and mathematics.
- Large decreases in performance were reported for Asian students with mathematics down by 18 points and writing by 13 points.
- White students showed decreases of 8 points in critical reading and 12 points in writing.

### Gap Analysis

The gaps in the SAT scores of the African American and Hispanic students are presented in **Table 7**.

**Table 7** indicate the following changes from 2012 to 2013

- The gaps decreased for all three subtests of the SAT between White students and both their African American and Hispanic counterparts.
- The gaps for both comparison groups decreased by 8 to 10 points in reading and writing, and 5 points in mathematics.
- The gaps in the composite scores decreased by 22 to 25 for both comparison groups.
- In spite of the decrease in all gaps, large gaps ranging from 128 to 147 points persist in reading, mathematics, and writing, and gaps of 411 to 434 points persist in the composite scores for both comparison groups in 2013.

### HISD, Texas and Nation

**Table 8a** shows the comparison of the SAT scores of HISD students to those of their counterparts in Texas and in the nation for the class of 2012 and 2013.

**Table 8a** indicates the following:

- Mean SAT scores of students in HISD, Texas and the nation, for the graduating classes of 2012 and 2013 showed modest changes across the years.

- The mean critical reading SAT score of 410 for HISD did not change between 2012 and 2013 while the state average increased by 1 point, and the nation remained unchanged.
- The mean mathematics score increased by 1 point in HISD while the scores in the state remained unchanged, and the scores in the nation decreased by 2 points.
- The mean writing score decreased by 4 points in HISD, remained unchanged in the state, and decreased by 1 point in the nation.

**Table 8b** shows the gaps between HISD and Texas, and between HISD and the nation for the class of 2012 and 2013.

**Table 8b** indicates the following for the class of 2012 and 2013.

- The gaps between HISD and the state increased in reading, writing, and the composite by 1 to 4 points, and decreased by 1 point in mathematics.
- The gaps between HISD and the nation remained unchanged in reading, and the composite, decreased in mathematics by 3 points, and increased in writing by 3 points.
- Large gaps between HISD and the state, and between HISD and the nation persist.

### SAT College Readiness Benchmarks

The College Board established college readiness benchmarks based on a study of SAT performance, using a sample of approximately 68,000 students across 110 four-year institutions. The college readiness benchmark was calculated as the SAT score associated with a 65 percent probability of earning a first-year GPA of 2.67 (B-) or higher. The SAT benchmark determined in this study was 1550 for the composite.

Individual benchmark scores were also calculated for the critical reading, mathematics, and writing sections to provide indicators of student proficiency in each of these subjects, resulting in a benchmark score of 500 on each section. While the SAT composite benchmark is used to provide information on general college readiness, the individual section benchmarks provide feedback on student performance on the critical reading, mathematics, and writing sections.

**Table 9a** summarizes the college readiness benchmarks used for the SAT exams.

**Table 9b** indicates the following:

- The percent of HISD students that met the SAT College Readiness Benchmarks for the composite score decreased from 28 percent in 2010 to 17 percent in 2013, largely due to the dramatic increase in the number of students taking the SAT exam.
- The percent of HISD students meeting the College Readiness Benchmarks for critical reading and writing trail the performance in mathematics by a significant margin.
- In 2013, the gap between mathematics and critical reading was 8 percentage points, an increase of 1 percentage point compared to 2012.
- In 2013, the gap between mathematics and writing was 11 percentage points, an increase of 1 percentage point compared to 2012.

# ACT

## Introduction

### Purpose

The founders of the ACT established the American College Testing Program in 1959. The program, which evolved from the Iowa Tests of Educational Development at the University of Iowa, was used to help students make better decisions regarding their postsecondary education and to provide more information to colleges. Colleges use the data to help them plan their curricula and place students in the appropriate courses of study. In late 1996, they changed their name from the American College Testing Program to ACT. The ACT is a national college-admission exam. It assesses both the general educational level of high school students and their readiness for college-level work.

### Description

The ACT consists of four tests: English, mathematics, reading, and science reasoning. The tests are curriculum-based and universally accepted by U.S. colleges and universities. The test takes two hours and 55 minutes. There are 75 questions on the English test, 60 questions on the mathematics, 40 questions on the reading, and 40 questions on the science test.

### Administration

The ACT is administered five times per year nationally in October, December, February, April, and June. In selected states, the ACT is also offered in late September. Most students take the ACT during the winter or spring of their junior year, saving the fall of their senior year for retesting, if necessary.

### Scoring

The ACT assessment takes raw scores and converts them to scale scores that have the same meaning for all forms of the tests. The scale scores range from 1 to 36 for each of the four tests and for the composite. The composite is the average of the four test scores, rounded to the nearest whole number.

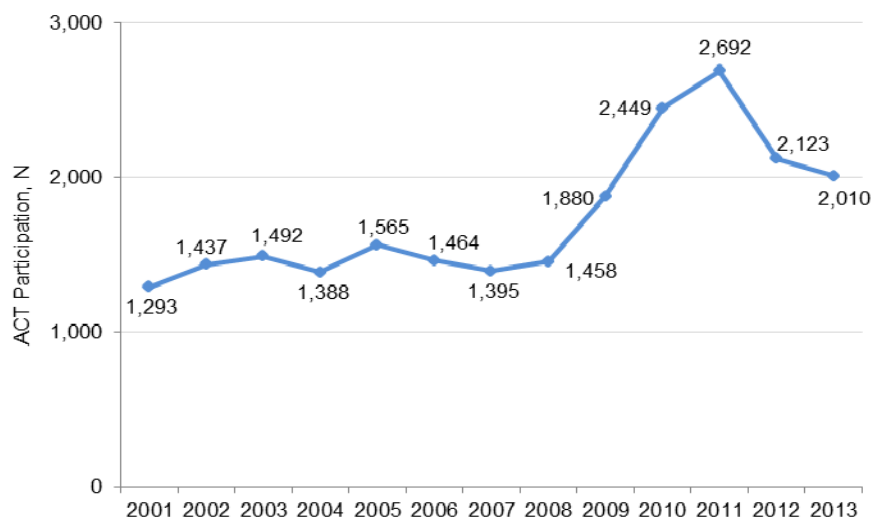
### Participants

The number of Houston Independent School District (HISD) graduating seniors in 2013 with ACT test results was 2,010, a decrease of 113 students from the 2,123 students tested in 2012. The participation rate of HISD students on the ACT is significantly lower than the participation rate of students on the SAT.

## Results

### Districtwide Performance

Districtwide ACT participation is shown in **Figure 4a**, the ACT composite scores are shown in **Figure 4b**, and the ACT subtest scores in English, mathematics, reading, and science are shown in **Figure 4c**.

**Figure 4a** indicates the following:

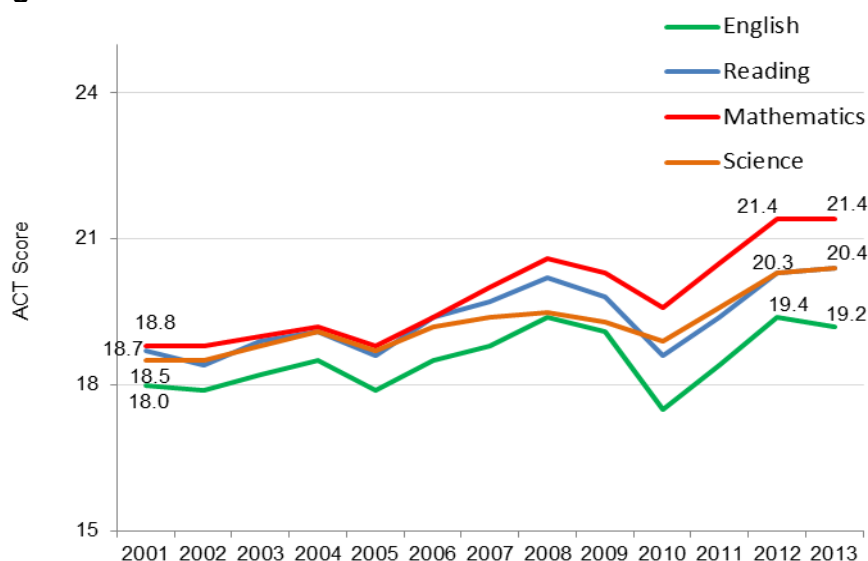
- The participation in the ACT exam decreased from 2,123 in 2012 to 2,010 in 2013. However, the participation in 2013 increased by 55 percent compared to 2001.
- The participation in the ACT exam in 2013 (2,010) represents only 22 percent of the participation in the SAT exam (9,130) as shown in **Figure 3a**. Consequently, caution should be exercised in drawing conclusions from the ACT scores.

**Figure 4b** indicates the following:

- The ACT composite score remained unchanged at 20.5 from 2012 to 2013 but showed an increase of 1.9 points compared to 2001.

**Figure 4c** indicates the following:

- The ACT scores in reading and science increased by 0.1 points, remained unchanged in mathematics, and decreased in English by 0.2 points from 2012 to 2013.
- The ACT subtests show increases in the scores ranging from 1.2 points in English to 2.6 points in mathematics in 2013 compared to 2001.
- The ACT scores for HISD students are highest in mathematics, and lowest in English. The gap between these two subtest scores widened from 0.8 points in 2001 to 2.2 points in 2013.

### Race/Ethnicity and Gender

**Table 10** shows the ACT mean scores in HISD by ethnicity and gender for the class of 2012 and 2013.

**Table 10** indicates the following changes in the ACT scores from 2012 to 2013:

- The mean scores for all students increased in reading and science, remained unchanged in mathematics, and declined in English.
- The mean scores of the Asian American students increased in English, mathematics, and science, but declined in reading.
- The mean scores of the African American students remained unchanged in reading and mathematics but declined in English and science.
- The mean scores of the Hispanic students increased in reading and mathematics, remained unchanged in science, but declined in English.
- The mean scores of the White students increased in science, but declined in English, reading, and mathematics.
- The mean scores of male students increased in all subjects; female students showed an increase in reading, no change in mathematics, and a decline in English and science.
- The composite scores increased for male students, remained unchanged for Hispanic and White students, and declined for Asian, African American, and female students.

### Gap Analysis

The gaps in the ACT scores of the African American and Hispanic students are presented in **Table 11**.

- The gaps between White students and both their African American and Hispanic counterparts decreased in English, mathematics, and reading but increased in science.
- The gaps in 2013 ranged from 5.5 points in mathematics between White and Hispanic students to 8.8 points in English between White and African American students.
- The gaps in the composite scores remained unchanged between White and Hispanic students but increased between White and the African American students.
- Large gaps persist in all subtests and the composite scores for both comparison groups in 2013.

### HISD, Texas and Nation

**Table 12a** shows the comparison of the ACT scores of HISD students to those of their counterparts in Texas and in the nation for the class of 2012 and 2013.

**Table 12a** indicates the following for the graduating class of 2013:

- Mean ACT scores of students in HISD increased in reading and science but declined in English while the mathematics and the composite scores remained unchanged.
- Mean ACT scores of students in Texas increased in English, mathematics, and science but declined in reading, and the composite score increased.
- Mean ACT scores of students in the nation declined in all subjects together with a decline in the composite score.

**Table 12b** shows the gaps between HISD and Texas, and between HISD and the nation for the class of 2012 and 2013.

**Table 12b** indicates the following for the class of 2012 and 2013:

- The gaps between HISD and the state in 2013 increased in English and mathematics, decreased in reading, and remained unchanged in science compared to 2012 while the gap in the composite score increased.
- The gaps between HISD and the nation decreased in all subjects, as well in the composite scores in 2013 compared to 2012.

### College Readiness Benchmarks

ACT has created College Readiness Benchmarks that are the minimum scores needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50% chance of obtaining a B or higher or about a 75% chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college courses, which include English Composition (ACT English), Algebra (ACT mathematics), Social Science (ACT reading), and Biology (ACT science). These scores were empirically derived based on the actual performance of students in college.

In 2013, the standards for college readiness benchmarks were updated. The ACT college readiness benchmark for each test is shown in **Table 13** from 2009-10 to 2012-13. Also shown is the percent of the graduating class in HISD that met all benchmarks during this period.

**Table 13** indicates the following:

- The benchmarks remained unchanged in English and mathematics for the class of 2010 to 2013. The benchmark was increased in reading from 21 in 2012 to 22 in 2013 while the benchmark in science was reduced from 24 in 2012 to 23 in 2013.
- The percent of the HISD class that met all ACT benchmarks increased from 16 in 2010, and from 25 in 2012 to 26 in 2013. Caution is advised in interpreting these results due to the relatively low participation rates of HISD students in the ACT exams.

## Advanced Placement

### Introduction

#### Purpose

The Advanced Placement (AP) Program was established in 1955 as a cooperative educational endeavor between secondary schools and colleges and universities. Since its inception in 1955, the program has provided high school students with the opportunity to take college-level courses and earn college credit. The courses are equivalent to a first-year college course and are taught by highly qualified teachers. Most American colleges and universities accept AP courses with qualifying exam grades towards college credit, advanced placement, or both. In addition, nearly 300 universities outside the United States use AP courses and exam grades in the admissions process (The College Board, 2003).

#### Description

There are a total of 34 AP examinations in Arts, English, History and Social Science, Math and Computer Science, Sciences, and World Languages and Cultures. AP exams are created by a committee of experienced AP secondary school teachers and university professors who specialize in each of the subjects for which an exam is offered. The format of AP exams includes a multiple-choice section and a free-response (essay or problem-solving) section. The exceptions to this format are the AP exams for Studio Art, which is a portfolio assessment, Music Theory, which includes a sight-singing task, and the modern language exam, which includes a speaking component.

#### Administration

The Educational Testing Services (ETS) mails out the AP exams along with other exam-related materials to participating schools in April or early May. The AP exams are administered each year in May over a two-week period. Once testing is completed, all AP exams are returned to ETS.

#### Scoring

The AP grade scale ranges from 1 to 5. A score of 1 indicates “no recommendation,” a score of 2 “possibly qualified,” a score of 3 “qualified,” a score of 4 “well qualified,” and a score of 5 indicates “extremely well qualified.” The multiple-choice section of the exam is scored by computer. The free-response section is scored by trained readers during a week-long scoring session held in June. These readers who are made up of AP teachers and university professors follow detailed scoring guidelines. Each AP exam has a formula for combining the scores of the multiple-choice and free-response sections of the exam into a composite score. A score of 3 qualifies a student to earn advanced placement or college credit.

#### Participants

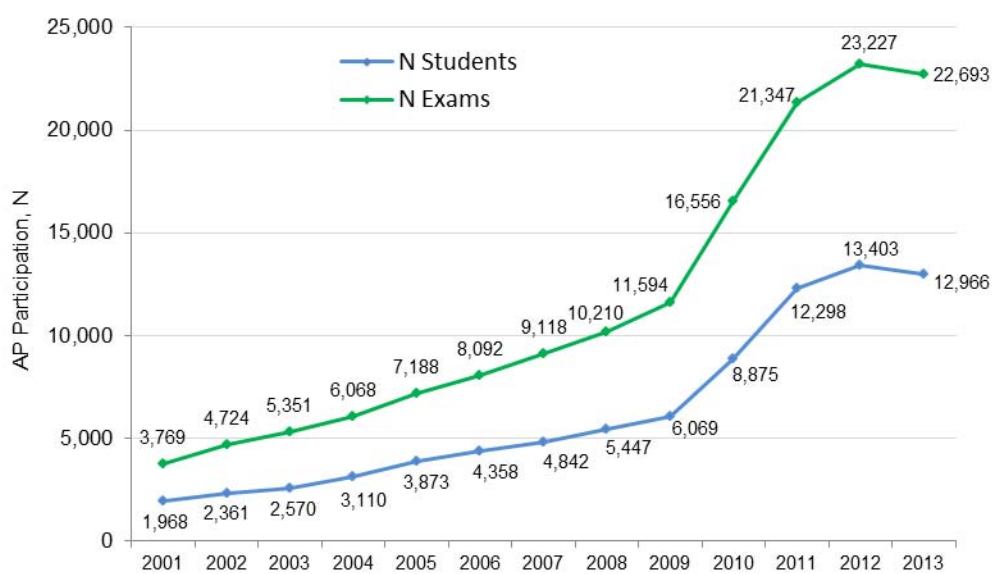
District data for 2012 and 2013 were drawn from the August electronic files provided by the College Board, which represent the most current data available at the time and only included exams taken by HISD high school students.

## Results

### Districtwide Participation and Performance

**Figure 5a** shows the number of AP exams taken by HISD students and the number of students taking at least one AP exam during the period 2001 to 2013.

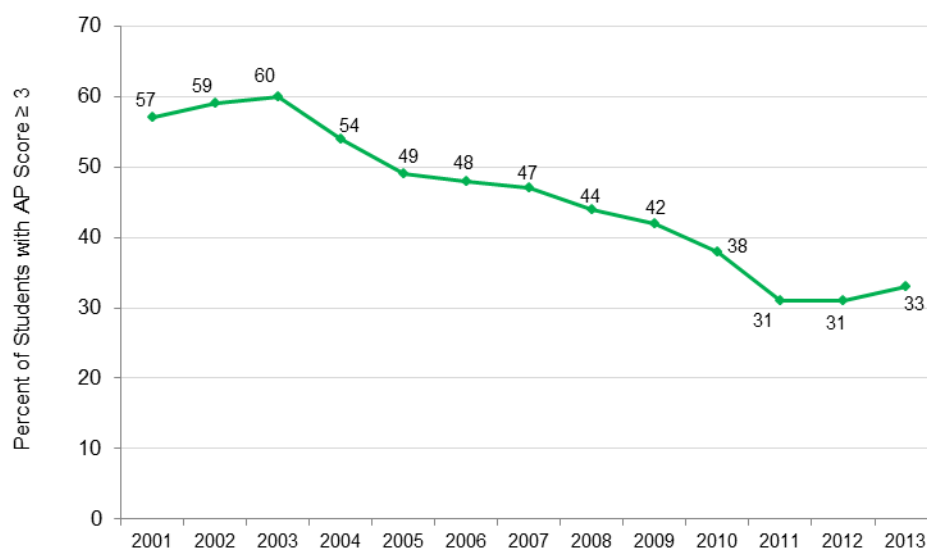
**Figure 5a. The Number of HISD Students Taking AP Exams and the Number of AP Exams Taken: 2001-2013**



**Figure 5a** indicates the following:

- The number of HISD students taking at least one AP exam in 2013 has increased by 559 percent since 2001, although there was a decrease of 3.3 percent compared to 2012.
- The number of AP exams taken by HISD students in 2013 increased by 502 percent since 2001, although there was a decrease of 2.3 percent compared to 2012.
- The mean number of AP exams taken by each participating HISD student has varied from 1.73 (2012) to 2.08 (2003), and was 1.75 in 2013. For the same number of students who participated in 2013, a potential of approximately 4,300 additional AP exams (19 percent) exists based on the maximum rate of 2.08 achieved in 2003.

**Figure 5b** shows the percent of AP exams taken by HISD students with a score of 3 or higher on one or more AP exams.

**Figure 5b** indicates the following:

- The percent of participating students with a score of 3 or higher on at least one AP exam ranged from 31 percent (2011 and 2012) to 60 percent (2003) and was 33 percent in 2013, an increase of 2 percentage points compared to 2012.
- The percent of students with an AP score of 3 or higher declined from 60 percent in 2003 to 31 percent in 2012, but a reversal of this eight-year declining trend occurred in 2013.

### Race/Ethnicity and Gender

**Table 14** shows the AP participation and scores of HISD students disaggregated by ethnicity and gender.

**Table 14** indicates the following:

- The number of HISD students who participated in AP exams decreased by 437 in 2013 compared to 2012.
- Participating student in 2013 took 534 fewer AP exams in 2013 compared to 2012. This was largely due to the decrease in the number of AP exams taken by African American students.
- The White students showed the highest improvement in 2013 (7 percentage points) in the percent of AP scores at or above 3 compared to improvement of 2 percentage points by the Asian students, and 1 percentage point each for the Hispanic and African American students.

### Gap Analysis

The gaps in the AP participation and scores of the African American and Hispanic students in HISD are presented in **Table 15**.

**Table 15** indicates the following:

- The gaps between the number of White and African American participants as a percent of the total number tested increased in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The gaps between the number of AP exams taken by White and African American participants as a percent of the total number of AP exams taken increased in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The gaps in the percent of AP exams with scores of 3 or higher taken by White and African American participants increased in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The gaps between the number of White and Hispanic participants as a percent of the total number tested decreased in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The gaps between the number of AP exams taken by White and Hispanic participants as a percent of the total number of AP exams taken decreased in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The gaps in the percent of AP exams with scores of 3 or higher taken by Hispanic and White participants increased in 2013 compared to 2012.

### HISD, Texas, and Nation

A comparison of HISD students on AP exams to their counterparts in Texas and the nation for students tested in 2012 and 2013 is presented in **Table 16a**.

**Table 16a** indicates the following:

- The number of students taking AP exams in HISD decreased in 2013 compared to 2012 (3.3 percent) while there were increases in the state (0.7 percent) and the nation (5.6 percent).
- The number of AP exams taken in HISD decreased in 2013 compared to 2012 (2.3 percent) while there were increases in the state (6.0 percent) and the nation (7.0 percent).
- The percent of AP exams with scores of 3 or higher increased by 2 percentage points in HISD while there was no change in the state and in the nation in 2013 compared to 2012.

**Table 16b** shows the gaps between HISD and the state, and HISD and the nation in the participation and AP scores in 2012 and 2013. The gaps are expressed as percent in the nation.

**Table 16b** indicates the following:

- The gap in the participation between HISD and the state decreased in 2013 compared to 2012 (0.4 percentage points) while it increased between HISD and the nation (0.1 percentage points).
- The gaps in both categories in the percent of students with AP scores of 3 or higher decreased in 2013 compared to 2012 (2 percentage points each).

## International Baccalaureate

### Introduction

#### Purpose

The International Baccalaureate Organization is a nonprofit international educational organization established in 1968. This organization offers the International Baccalaureate (IB) Diploma Programme for students aged 16-19. The IB Diploma Programme is a two-year course of study that prepares students for college. The IB Diploma Programme is recognized and accepted by universities around the world. Similar to the AP program, students with high scores on IB exams can earn college credit or advanced placement at a college or university.

#### Description

Students participating in the IB Diploma Programme are required to take six exams which are in the following subject groups: literature, language, social science, experimental science, mathematics, and art. The students may choose to replace the art exam by a second social science, experimental science, or a third language. Students test in three of their subjects at the higher level and three of their subjects at the subsidiary level. IB exams are developed by an international board of chief examiners, with input from IB teachers from around the world (IBO, 2004). Students may also choose to take individual IB courses and the exams.

In addition, students must fulfill three additional requirements. They must take a critical thinking class known as “Theory of Knowledge,” complete an original 4,000 word research project known as “Extended Essay,” and participate in a minimum of 150 hours of community service, artistic, and physical activities known as “Creativity, Action, and Service.”

#### Administration

IB exams are administered to students at their high school in two sessions. The first session takes place in November, and the second session takes place in May. IB exams are administered over a period of two weeks.

#### Scoring

An international body of 3,500 trained IB examiners composed of university professors and master secondary school teachers score the IB exams. An examining board oversees the scoring of the examiners to ensure that scoring is consistent across subjects and across the world. Final scores are given in each subject at the IB Curriculum and Assessment Center in Wales. Each exam is graded on a scale of 1 to 7. Students who earn a score of 4 or higher on an IB exam will be awarded an IB certificate in that subject area. Students must complete the requirements stated previously and achieve a cumulative score of 24 to be awarded the IB Diploma. Results are released each year in July.

#### Participants

Two HISD high schools participated in the IB program in 2012 and 2013. These schools are Bellaire and Lamar high schools. The total number of students who participated in the IB exams increased from 499 students in 2012 to 610 in 2013. Of the two participating schools, Lamar High School had more students who took an IB exam.

## Results

### Districtwide Performance

**Table 17** shows the number of IB exams taken, and the percent scoring 4 or above for the participating schools, Bellaire HS and Lamar HS, for 2012 and 2013.

**Table 17** indicates the following:

- The number of exams taken at Bellaire High School decreased from 137 in 2012 to 106 exams in 2013. Exams scored at 4 or above increased by 3.6 percentage points in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The number of exams taken at Lamar High School increased from 1,266 in 2012 to 1,299 in 2013. Exams scored at 4 or above increased by 0.7 percentage points in 2013 compared to 2012.
- The total number of IB exams taken in HISD in 2013 increased by 2 compared to 2012, and the participating students scoring 4 or higher increased by 0.4 percentage points.

### HISD, Nation, and World Wide

A comparison of the participation and performance of HISD students on IB exams and their counterparts in the nation and worldwide for 2012 and 2013 is presented in **Table 18**.

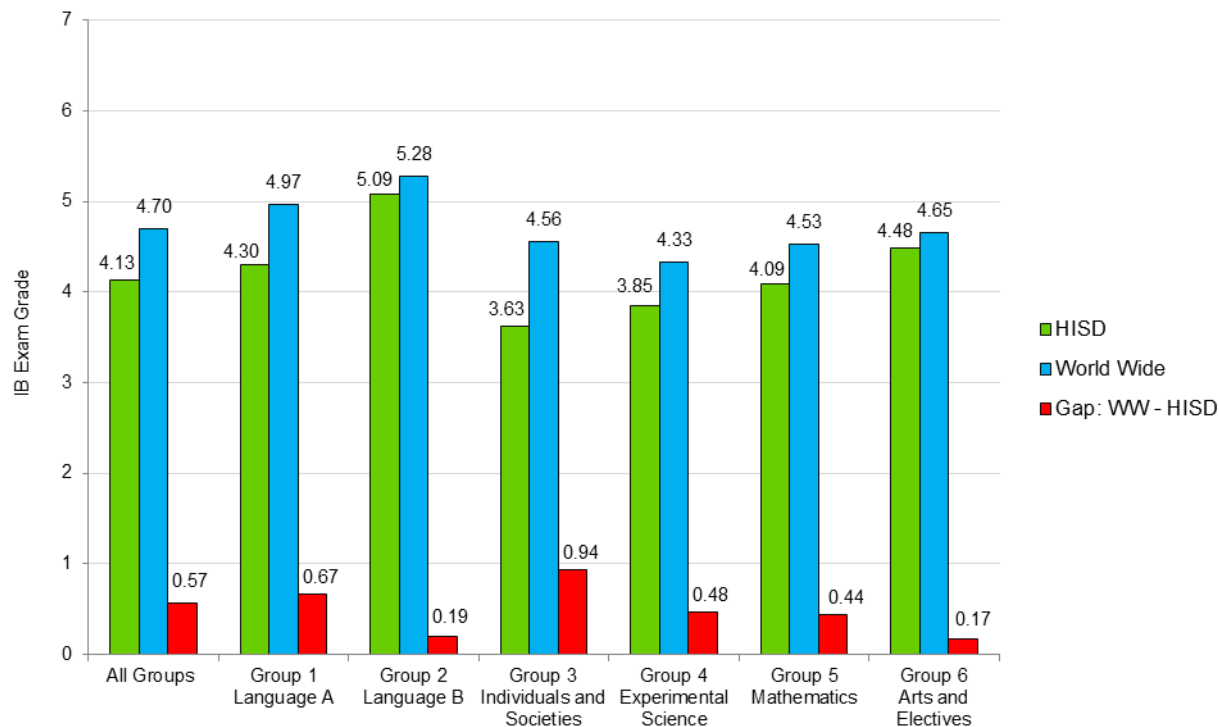

**Table 18** indicates the following changes in performance from 2012 to 2013:

- IB exams taken by HISD students with a score of 4 or higher increased by 0.4 percentage points compared to increases of 1.4 percentage points in the nation, and 0.3 percentage points worldwide.

**Figure 6** shows a comparison of the mean grades in the IB exams by subject groups in 2013 for students in HISD and World Wide.

**Figure 6** indicates the following:

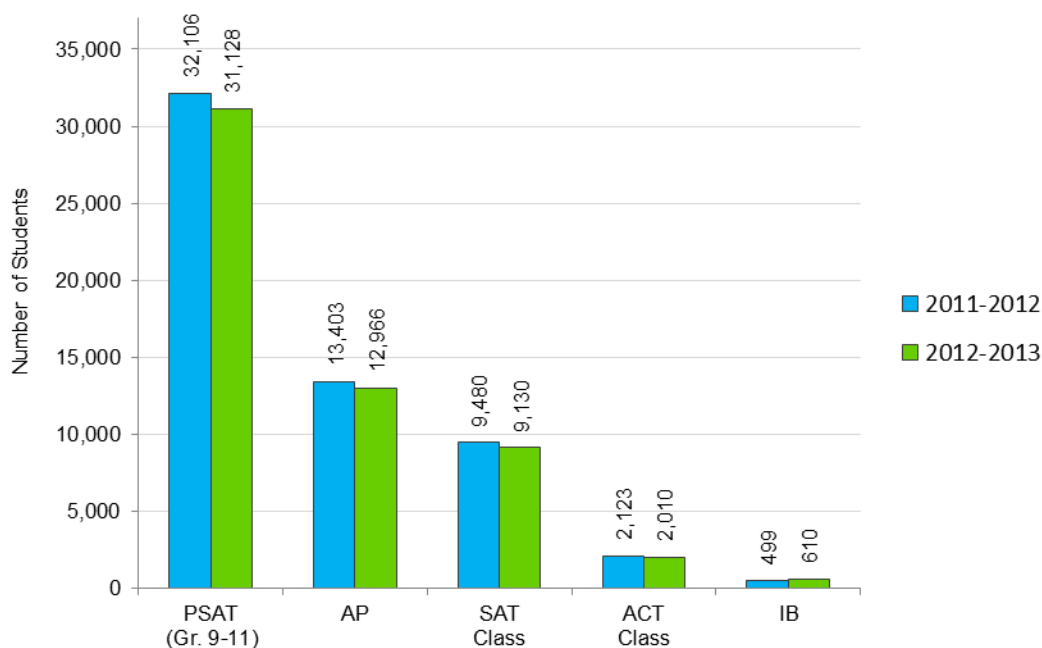
- The World Wide-HISD gaps in the mean grades across the six groups range from 0.17 points in Arts and Electives (Group 6) to 0.94 points in Individuals and Societies (group 3).
- The gaps in Language A (Group 1) at 0.67 points, and in Individuals and Societies (Group 3) at 0.94 points exceed the gap for All Groups at 0.57 points.

## Conclusion

### Participation of HISD Students in PSAT, SAT, ACT, AP, and IB

**Figure 7** shows the relative participation of high school students in the various college readiness assessments in 2012 and 2013.

**Figure 7. Participation of HISD Students in College Readiness Assessments: 2011-2012 and 2012-2013**



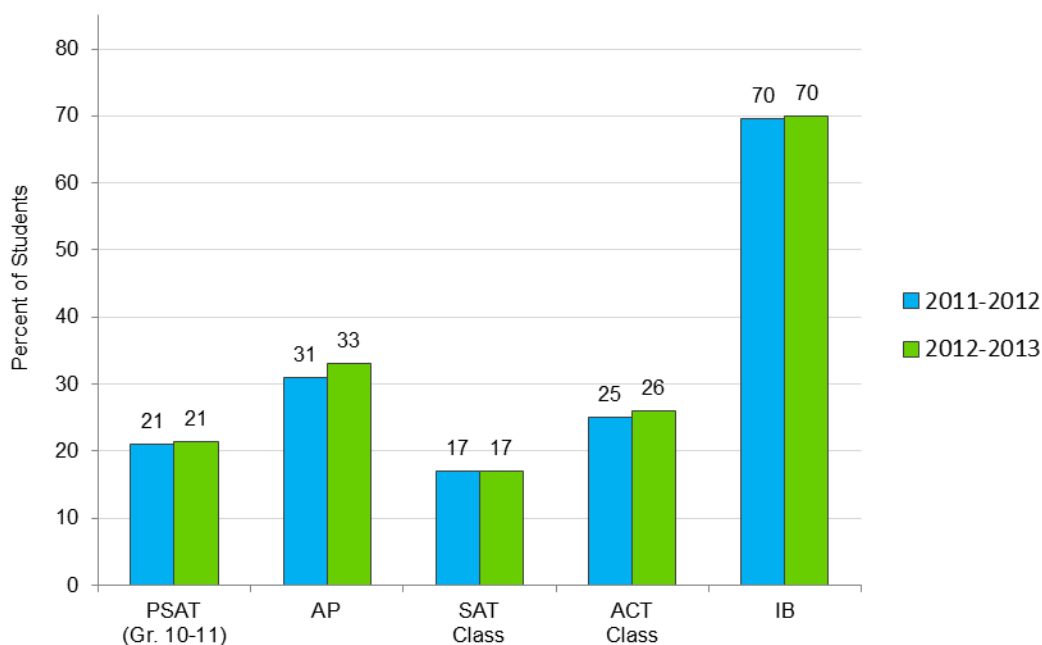
**Figure 7** indicates the following:

- The participation of HISD students in the college readiness exams ranges from approximately 600 students in the narrowly focused IB assessments to the approximately 31,000 students in the broad-based PSAT exams.
- Participation decreased on all assessments from 2012 to 2013 except in the IB exams.

### College Readiness of HISD Students

**Figure 8** contrasts the percent of high school students who met the PSAT, SAT, ACT college readiness benchmarks, the AP benchmark of a score of 3 or higher, and the IB benchmark of a score of 4 or higher.

**Figure 8** indicates the following:

- The percent of high school students in HISD in 2012-2013 who met the benchmarks in the various college readiness assessments ranges from 17 percent in the SAT exams to 70 percent in the IB exams.
- An examination of the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) data for the HISD class of 2005, 2006, and 2007 indicates that each of these classes earned approximately 2,100 college degrees in 6 years or less after graduation from high school. The projected number of college degrees that will be earned based on approximately 9,700 high school graduates in 2012 and the PSAT college readiness rate of 21 percent is 2,037 which is in close agreement to the observed number. It would therefore appear that the PSAT is the best predictor of college readiness when compared to the college readiness rates observed from the other assessments.
- The SAT benchmark for the composite at 1550 may be set too high; consequently, the SAT college readiness at 17 percent appears to be underestimated based on the NSC data.
- The participation rates in the ACT and IB assessments in HISD are relatively low; consequently, these assessments are not likely to produce an accurate indication of college readiness for the district as a whole.
- The participation in AP exams in HISD has increased dramatically since 2009; however, 48 percent of the exams were taken in the social sciences; participation in English at 21 percent, and in mathematics at 9 percent is under-weighted in the AP exams compared to PSAT, SAT, and ACT. As a result, the AP results may over-estimate the college readiness of HISD students.
