

School-Wide Dismissal

A transportation roster will be given to classroom teachers and bus captains by 2:00 pm for the first two weeks of school.

<u>SEND ALL STUDENTS TO THE RESTROOM BEFORE THEY LEAVE FOR DISMISSAL</u>. Be sure that **ALL** students have their backpacks and all other belongings prior to leaving the classroom. Students will not be allowed to return to the classroom once escorted to their dismissal location.

In the afternoon, all students will enter through into the cafeteria. No student will be allowed to be picked up after 2:00 p.m.

Morning Routines & Procedures: Breakfast

Breakfast will be picked up near the circle drive and eaten in the classroom.

- Cart 1: Near First Grade Wing (1st, 2nd, and 5th)
- Cart 2: Pavilion (SLL, PK, K, and 3rd)
- Cart 3: 4th Grade Steps (PALS, K, 3rd and 4th Grade) Moved to front of main office doors after 7:45 AM.
- All scholars arriving prior to 8:00 AM will eat breakfast in the classroom.
- All scholars arriving after 8:00 AM will eat breakfast in the cafeteria.
- Breakfast will not be distributed after 8:30 AM. Scholars arriving in need, after 8:30 AM, will receive a snack from the main office.
- All educators must teach scholars sanitary breakfast eating routines for their classrooms. Routines must be evident when entering the room.

Morning Routines & Procedures: Threshold

Educators will open their door at 7:25 AM to begin receiving scholars. Educators will stand at the door and create a Threshold to scan scholars: educators should greet scholars (method), check for scholar feelings and dress code. Educators will also remind scholars of morning routines before they enter the classroom.

Departmentalized and Team Educators

The first educator who sees the scholars will be responsible for:

- Create a threshold
 - o Educator stands at door
 - o Welcomes scholars as they come in the room
 - o Check for dress code violations
 - o Check scholar's feelings
 - o Give morning instructions
 - o Scholars begin Do Now/Warm Up

All following educators who see the scholars will be responsible for:

- Create a threshold
 - o Educator stands at door
 - o Welcomes scholars as they come in the room
 - o Check scholar's feelings
 - o Give instructions for what scholars need to do when they enter your classroom
 - o Scholars begin Do Now/Warm Up

Scholars must have clear directions and feel welcomed every time they enter the room.

Instructional Staff Daily Routines: Scholar Attendance

Scholars' attendance is critical for their success. It is imperative for educators to build strong positive relationships with scholars and parents to ensure scholars are in school every day. When scholars are not in school, they are not learning.

- Educators will reach out to parents each morning at 8:00 AM if a scholar is not present, and document this contact on the parent log in Office 365 Excel. The parent contact log will be available for viewing by the administration and the attendance team. The attendance team will begin reaching out to scholars to get them into school. Home visits will be conducted to get scholars back in the building.
- Home Room and Self-Contained Educators will submit scholar attendance at 9:30 AM each day in PowerSchool.
- Home Room Educators must ensure they know who is present prior to inputting into PowerSchool.
- SIRS will run the ADA attendance report and email to general clerks (Toliver and Hall) to begin calling parents. Clerks will document information from parents in the 2022-2023 Scholar Attendance Parent

^{*}Every time scholars' transition as a group and return to the room, every educator will conduct a Threshold before letting scholars into the room.

- Contact Log Information Office 365 Excel Spreadsheet.
- Attendance team will huddle at 10:30 AM to discuss absent scholars and next steps Truancy Process.

Instructional Staff Daily Routines: Grades (PowerSchool)

Grades are used to exhibit the learning of scholars. It is Imperative that parents are able to see updated grades each week, in order to assist us in intervening when scholars are not performing at Masters and Meets level. All grades placed in PowerSchool must have evidence to support the grade (i.e. Microsoft Forms, Formative Assessments, Exit Tickets, etc.) Please remember, it is against Blackshear and HISD Board Policy for any educator to falsify grades. **All grades must have evidence.**

Parent Communication: Grades (PowerSchool)

- A communication binder with conduct charts will be sent home daily with every scholar.
- All forms of parent communication must be sent out each Thursday in scholar's communications binders – flyers, monthly school newsletter, monthly grade level newsletters, and upcoming events.
- Grade level leaders must submit their monthly newsletter
- When we contact parents weekly or bi-weekly we can:
 - o Build stronger parent relationships and check on families
 - o Show that you care.
 - Support scholar success.
 - o Get scholars who are not participating to participate more or come to school.
 - o Update parents on their child's glows and grows.
 - o Discuss assignments and answer any questions or concerns.
- Educators first method of contact should be by phone, so that you are able to talk to a parent. If unable to reach the parent by phone, educators can use the HUB and Class Dojo to contact parents. Please make sure you get a response using these alternative methods of contact.
- If you are unable to contact a parent, or get a response, please complete a SAF so that Ms. St. Julien can work on contacting the parent. Also, please email Dr. Thomas and Ms. Rodriguez with the scholar's names and contact information you have.
- Educators will create a log with notes in PowerSchool as evidence of their parent contact. Please remember that these logs cannot be deleted.
- Each Grade level will send out a monthly newsletter to parents using the weekly Communication Binder and Class Dojo.
- Grade level leaders must submit their monthly newsletter to Dr. Thomas on the last Thursday of each month. A calendar invite with the deadlines will be sent to all educators by **August 18**, **2022**.
- Please remember that we have an opportunity to create lasting relationships with our parents that will
 ultimately lead to the success of all of our scholars.
- All scholars and parents must be connected to Class Dojo. If you need assistance with this, please reach out to your content specialist or administrator.

GRADES

Grades must be updated weekly with a <u>minimum</u> number of grades per content area <u>each</u> <u>week.</u> Grades can include weekly assessments, independent practices, campus common assessments, or exit tickets.

Principal and Specialists will check PowerSchool on Tuesday morning of each week to check for the
previous week's grades. If grades are not in PowerSchool each week, the accountability process will
be followed.

WEIGHT OF GRADES

- Classwork: Friday Weekly Exit Ticket Averages = 25%
- Quizzes: Weekly Assessments = 25%
- Tests: Bi-Weekly Campus Wide Assessments (Big 6 Test) and Projects = 50%

RETEACH GRADE

- o All scholars who earn a grade below 70 must have a re-teaching opportunity. The recorded grade will be the average of the original grade and the re-teaching grade.
- o If 60% of the class failed an assignment or assessment, then the grade <u>cannot</u> be recorded for that assignment or assessment. The class must have a re-teaching opportunity to ensure mastery of the objective(s) and grades are <u>not averaged together</u> since the original grade should not have been recorded.

MAKE-UP ASSIGNMENTS

- o An "I" will be recorded for incomplete assignments.
- o Scholars have up to 3 days to complete an assignment without point deduction.
- o After 3 days, scholars have up to 2 weeks to complete an assignment with a 20-point deduction.
- o After 2 weeks, incomplete assignment will have a failing grade as determined by the educator.

PROJECTS

- o All projects must have a rubric with weighted points for each criterion adding up to 100 points.
- o Make sure to have the rubric signed by a parent.
- o For examples of rubrics, go to <u>www.rubystar.com</u>.
- Late projects will have a 5-point deduction for every day that the project is late.

LEVELS OF INTERVENTION

- o Any scholar who is struggling must be referred to the Intervention Assistance Team.
- o Tier I = classroom intervention. Provide flexible small group intervention in the classroom. For example:
 - o Group 1 (larger group) = 20 minutes block, 3 times per week.
 - o Group 2 = 30 minutes block, 3 times per week.
 - o Group 3 (smaller group) = 30 minutes block, 5 times per week.
 - o Tier II = intervention specialist and outside resources such as Zearn.
 - Tier III = intervention specialists (Teacher Specialists)

RETENTION OF SCHOLARS

o ALC, GPC and SSI procedures as required by the district and state will be used.

HOMEWORK

- o Scholars in K 2nd will have 25 minutes of homework Monday Thursday.
- o Scholars in 3rd 5th will have 35 minutes of homework Monday Thursday.
- o Friday Homework is an option to educators as they see needed but within time limits above.

ANCILLARY GRADES

- o E = Excellent (Above average effort and participation).
- S = Satisfactory
- P = Poor (frequent misconduct or lack of participation)
- U = Unsatisfactory (repeated misconduct or lack of participation. Evidence of warning the parent must be present).

PROGRESS REPORTS AND REPORT CARDS

Progress Reports must be sent home at the midpoint between the beginning of the six-weeks grading period and the end. All grade level leaders are responsible for ensuring progress reports are printed, reviewed and sent home. All appraisers will review progress reports for the educators they appraise. Please review and adhere to the dates below.

Report Cards must be ready based on the dates below. Please keep your grades in PowerSchool up to date at all times. All appraisers will review report cards for educators they appraise. Please review and adhere to the dates below.
