	<p>Indicators of Success (Measurable results that describe success)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Out of 24 spot observations of classrooms in October by the building leadership team, 80% of teachers will average proficient or higher on the use of multiple response strategies. This percentage increases to 90% by February 2024. ● Decrease off-task /negative behavior occurrences with all student learners engaged in the lesson which will be verified by tracking PEIMS data every 3 weeks with progress report and or report card data resulting in a 5% decrease from 2022-2023 data by June 2024.
