## **PURPOSE**

This directive aims to establish HISD Police Department policies for Incident Command Systems. This directive applies to all Houston Independent School District Police Personnel.

### POLICY

The Houston Independent School District and its communities periodically experience natural and manufactured disasters that require close cooperation of public safety, public utility, and state and federal agencies.

The HISD Police Department, in conjunction with HISD Emergency Management, shall participate, as necessary in major incidents or disasters, as a component of the ICS when authorized by the Superintendent of Schools or designee.

While involved in multi-agency situations, the HISD Police Department employs ICS policies and procedures consistent with the standard national model taught by the Federal Emergency Management Administration. Agency personnel shall receive formal training in the ICS structure.

HISD-affected agency personnel shall receive annual training on the agency All Hazard Plan and HISD Emergency Procedures. All supervisors must complete all components of the

The HISD Police Department shall participate in annual training exercises to include but not be limited to tabletop exercises for area resources when requested. Following activations or exercises, an after-action

report shall be generated and forwarded to the Chief of Police.

### NATIONAL INCIDENT MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

The National Incident Management System (NIMS) guides all government, nongovernmental organizations, and the private sector to work together to prevent, protect against, mitigate, respond to and recover from incidents.

NIMS provides stakeholders across the community with the shared vocabulary, systems, and processes to deliver the capabilities described in the National Preparedness System successfully. NIMS defines operational systems that guide how personnel works together during incidents.

All classified supervisors and civilian managers will receive NIMS training commensurate with their position.

# **INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEM (ICS)**

Most incidents in HISD will require the components of ICS. ICS is a standardized on-scene emergency management concept designed to allow its user(s) to adopt an integrated organizational structure equal to the complexity and demands of single or multiple incidents without being hindered by jurisdictional boundaries. Use of the ICS is not required for minor incidents handled solely by the HISD Police Department.
