Principal's Corner



There are so many things going on this time of year at Lamar. I want to clue you in on a few things you may want to know about.

- I updated our SDMC this week on the preliminary budget for Lamar for the 2022-2023 school year. We are in good shape and will move forward with all programs and supports we have this school year. We will be able to continue the Writing Center with ESSER funds for two years.
- I am excited to confirm that ESSER dollars will be used to fund 16 Neighborhood Libraries and 3 classroom libraries for our special education classrooms. We will be expanding our book collection from approximately 2000 books to 28,000 books. This will bring us up to *Developing* under the State of Texas Library Standards for collection size for a school of 3000. We are focusing mostly on building the fiction collection, but are also including non-fiction narrative, biography, poetry and memoir for the print collection. We will continue to help students get connected to the various digital non-fiction resources such as those available online through Houston Public Library.
- I need to make a correction to information I provided to you recently. I was expecting the Lamar Pet Grooming and Wellness Clinic construction bid to be voted on at the March Board meeting but found out this week that did not happen. I am not sure of the reason why this project was not submitting by the construction department, but nevertheless, it is set for a vote at the Board meeting next Thursday. I was asked last night at the Agenda Review meeting to clarify the intent of the program expansion. There was some discussion around equity of the distribution of CTE dollars and programs. I did not hear any objections to the concept or to the usefulness of the site. I am hopeful the Board will vote to approve the construction bid to benefit the students in our vet med tech program. Having this facility on campus will help make the vet med tech industry certification accessible to more students by providing the experience with handling small animals that veterinary clinics want before students move into the internships at their clinics.

HOUSTON STUDENT NAMED 2022 BEZOS SCHOLAR MAY 5, 2022, HOUSTON — Today, the Bezos Scholars Program (BSP) is proud to announce Lamar High School student **Franklin Wu** and educator Sally Woolweaver as part of the 2022 Scholars cohort. The Bezos Scholars Program inspires and challenges young people to address issues they are passionate about in their communities.

Franklin is passionate about addressing inequalities in his community. He said, "I'm excited to work more within my own community and collaborate with the other scholars to learn about their stories."

Franklin attends an International Baccalaureate school and enjoys living in one of the most diverse cities in the country, happily exploring different cuisines and cultures. He is passionate about motivating youth to be civically engaged and wants to use policy as a mechanism for change on key issues impacting his community including climate change and gun violence. Franklin is a National Youth Action Team Coordinator for Citizens' Climate Lobby. He served as state policy coordinator for March for Our Lives; Business Insider featured him as a Gen Z climate activist in 2021.

The applicant pool is competitive; students selected are one of twelve Scholars representing nine states this year. Scholars are selected based on commitment to their education, demonstrated leadership abilities, willingness to embrace challenges, and the desire to create positive change in their communities.

Franklin will be supported by his educator scholar Sally Woolweaver, an educator at Lamar High School.

Sally is passionate about teaching the next generation of thought leaders how to solve problems and investigate technology applications. She teaches in one of the most diverse high schools in the country. Over the past four years, Sally has taught nine different courses ranging from Computer Science to Economics to World History. She is currently teaching AP Computer Science Principles and specializes in college-level computer science courses. She loves project-based learning and is always excited to see new projects and ideas that her students come up with!

Sally said the following about the opportunity to support these young leaders, "I'm excited to meet other dedicated educators from all over the world!"

The Bezos Family Foundation launched the Scholars program in 2005 to provide young people a platform to design solutions to some of the most pressing issues facing their communities. The program begins with an all-expenses paid trip to the Aspen Ideas Festival. The week is filled with leadership training, panel discussions, and exclusive conversations with many of the world's most acclaimed scientists, journalists, artists, and global thought leaders. This experience sets the stage for the challenge ahead: launching sustainable projects, known as Local Ideas Festivals (LIFs), to transform their communities.

The topics and themes of LIFs are as diverse as the Scholars themselves and are designed to align Scholars' passions with an existing community need. Many address inequities in education, advocating for the rights of minorities and underrepresented communities, and the need to create space for civil discourse. Since the program's inception, more than 50,000 attendees have participated in these change projects.

Advanced Placement (AP) Exams

All students taking an AP class during the fall semester have been registered to take the AP exam on the date listed below. Students enrolled in AP classes are required to take the corresponding AP exam as part of the course requirements. Houston ISD has paid the registration fee for our students to take these exams. As a result, any student not taking the required AP exam will be charged a \$40 non-use fee by the College Board. IB Fees are Past Due

IB Fees are past due. All students who are currently taking an IB course (SL2 or HL2) have been registered for testing. Current seniors must pay the fee to complete senior check out.

The actual cost of registering students for courses is \$119 per subject. HISD and Lamar HS take on the majority of costs associated with the registration and administration of exams. Students are asked to cover part of the fee. Whether you are taking one exam or are testing in five subjects, we ask that each student pay \$90 for the School year. Students who complete the SocioEconomic form and qualify for additional benefits are asked to pay a reduced fee of \$30 for the school year. To avoid convenience fees, payments may be made in the business office by cash, money order or cashier's check. IB Fees are non-refundable.

Laptop Collection

Laptop collection will start **May 16th**. All students are expected to be ready to return their laptops on **May 16th** at their scheduled time. Students should return their laptops, charger, and case. If you are missing your charger or case you can purchase a replacement on [school pay](#). If you had to buy a replacement item please have a copy of the receipt either printed or digital with your ID number showing when you come to turn in your laptop. All laptops need to be returned in the same condition as they were handed out to you. Please remove any stickers off the device before May 16. If a student has any damage on their laptop please come by the IT office, N215, before the week of laptop collection to get that resolved. Please backup any items you will need from the laptop to Google Drive, a flash drive or to your email; you will not receive the same laptop back in the Fall and all items not saved will be lost.

Spring Final Exam Exemptions

Seniors: Final Examination Exemptions

To be exempted from final examinations in second (spring) semester, senior students must have:

- Senior (12th grade) classification;
- 85 semester average or better in course;
- S or E conduct average; and
- No more than three (3) total unexcused absences*
- No in school or out of school suspensions

Grade 9, 10 & 11 Final Exam Exemptions

To incentivize the daily attendance rate, eligible grade 9 students may be allowed one spring final exam exemption; two spring final exam exemptions may be allowed for eligible 10th and 11th graders.

To be eligible for final exam exemption the student must have:

- no more than three (3) unexcused absences* in any one course for the duration of the semester;
- an 85 or higher semester average in the specific course(s) where the final exam exemption is applied; and
- S or E conduct average
- No in school or out of school suspensions

Seniors – Eligible to be exempt from all final exams

Juniors and Sophomores – Eligible to be exempt from up to two final exams

Freshman – Eligible to be exempt for one class final exam

11th and 12th grade students in IB courses must submit all IB assessments, sit for IB exams in May, and participate in all oral assessments. To be exempt from finals in 11th and 12th grade IB courses, students must also have all IB assessments complete.




