SUBJECT: ACT TEST RESULTS: CLASS OF 2014

The results for the class of 2014 on the ACT test have been released. Colleges use the data to help them plan their curricula and place students in the appropriate courses of study. The ACT is a national college-admission exam and assesses both the general educational level of high school students and their readiness for college-level work.

The ACT exam consists of four subject areas and a composite score. Those four subjects include: English, mathematics, reading, and science. In addition to subject scores, ACT has created College Readiness Benchmarks that are the minimum scores needed on an ACT subject-area test to indicate a 50 percent chance of obtaining a B or higher or about a 75 percent chance of obtaining a C or higher in the corresponding credit-bearing college courses, which include English Composition, Algebra, Social Science and Biology. These scores were empirically derived based on the actual performance of students in college. Scores on the test range from 1 to 36 and the College Readiness Benchmark Scores for the classes of 2013 and 2014 are:

- English 18
- Mathematics 22
- Reading 22
- Science 23

The results of the ACT test are provided below for the class of 2014.

Findings:

- ACT participation in 2014 <u>decreased</u> by 31 (1.5 percent) for all students, <u>increased</u> by 39 (4.6 percent) for Hispanic students but <u>declined</u> by 97 (16.1 percent) for African American students while the White students showed a <u>decline</u> of 14 (4.2 percent) compared to 2013.
- The composite score was <u>unchanged</u> for White students but <u>declined</u> for all students, African American, Asian, and Hispanic students in 2014 compared to 2013.
- ACT participation in HISD for graduating seniors continued to <u>decline</u> from 27 percent (2011) to 20 percent (2013) and 19 percent (2014) while participation in the state <u>increased</u> from 36 percent (2011) to 40 percent (2014). In the nation, ACT participation <u>increased</u> from 49 percent (2011) to a new record of 57 percent (2014) which <u>exceeded</u> the participation in SAT for the first time, thereby marking an historic event.
- Twenty-five percent of the HISD students in the class of 2014 <u>met</u> the college readiness benchmark compared to 26 percent in 2013.
- The ACT composite scores of the ethnic groups in HISD <u>exceeded</u> the scores of their peer groups in the nation ranging from 0.1 to 3.5 points in 2014. Caution is advised, however, in interpreting the results due to the significantly lower participation in HISD relative to the nation.
- The ACT composite scores at the campus level ranged from 13.8 (Kashmere HS and Wheatley HS) to 28.5 (Carnegie HS) and the median of 36 schools stood at 17.7 in 2014.


• The ACT composite scores in 2014 <u>improved</u> at 18 campuses while 13 campuses showed a <u>decline</u> compared to 2013.

Table 1 provides a two-year comparison of the number of students tested and average ACT composite results for all HISD students and each student group for the graduating class of 2014 compared to 2013.




Figure 1 indicates the following for the ACT composite scores from 2012 to 2014:

Figure 1 shows the three-year comparison of ACT composite results by student group and for all students for the classes of 2012, 2013, and 2014.

- The Asian students improved by 0.1 points.
- The score for White students remained unchanged.
- The scores <u>declined</u> by 0.1 points for the all-student group, by 0.3 points for Hispanic students, and 0.6 points for the African American students.




Figure 2: ACT Participation Rate of Graduates (2008-2014): HISD, Texas, and Nation

Figure 2 shows the trends in the ACT participation rates for the HISD, Texas, and the Nation for the graduating classes of 2008-2014.

Figure 2 indicates the following:

• The participation in HISD <u>declined</u> from 20 percent (2013) to 19 percent (2014) compared to an <u>increase</u> of 1 percentage point at the state level and a 3 percentage-point <u>increase</u> at the national level.




Figure 3: ACT Composite Scores of Graduates HISD, Texas, and Nation: 2008-2014

Figure 3 shows the trends of ACT composite results for HISD, Texas, and the Nation for the graduating classes of 2008 through 2014.

Figure 3 indicates the following:

• The ACT composite score in HISD <u>declined</u> by 0.1 points for the class of 2014 compared to 2013 while the state remained <u>unchanged</u> and the nation showed an <u>increase</u> of 0.1 points.

Figure 4 shows the campus results ranked by the average ACT composite scores for the class of 2014.

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Figure 4 indicates the following:

 Eighteen campuses showed a <u>gain</u> in the ACT composite score ranging from 0.1 points (Chavez HS) to 2.7 points (Milby HS) while 13 campuses showed a <u>decline</u> ranging from 0.1 points (Bellaire HS and Worthing HS) to 1.7 points (Reagan HS) for the class of 2014 compared to the class of 2013.

Appendix A provides Tables 2-7 with detailed results for the district, state and nation.

Tables 2 through **5** provide the average scores, which range from 1 to 36, by subject for the district, the state, and the nation over the past four years. They also show the percent of students meeting the College Readiness Benchmarks for all four subjects.

Tables 6 and **7** provide the 2014 average ACT scores by ethnicity for the graduating classes of 2013 and 2014 for HISD, Texas, and the Nation, along with the percent meeting all four subjects of the College Readiness Benchmark. The differences between HISD and Texas and between HISD and the Nation are also shown for all students and the various subgroups.
