Directions: On your poster, answer the questions on this sheet about the book you chose to read for the summer. You can hand write your answers to the questions directly onto the poster, or you can type your answers, print, and glue them onto your poster. Either way, please make sure your poster is neat and easy to read.

## BASIC THINGS TO INCLUDE ON THE POSTER:

- The title and author of the book
- At least one picture (either of the book or of a picture that connects somehow to the book)
- Your name

## QUESTIONS TO ANSWER ON THE POSTER:

- Who are the protagonists and antagonists in the book?
- When does the story take place? What effect does the setting (specifically date and location) have on the story?
- What would you say is the climax in the plot? How does it function as a turning point?
- Re-examine the title of your novel. What is the depth and relevance of the title?
- Does the book contain any controversial material or themes? If so, do you feel it added or subtracted to the book?
- What was your favorite passage from the book? Why?
- Were there any parts in particular that you didn't like? If so, why?
- Identify 2-3 themes of the story and explain how they are present throughout. How do they aid in understanding or appreciating the story?
- What point of view is the story told from? How would the story differ if told from a different perspective?
- Who would you recommend this book to? Name someone specifically if you can. Why would they enjoy it?
